FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE PERIOD APRIL 2001 TO JULY 2001

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This report sets out the forecast budget variations of all Portfolios and Committees from the approved original estimates for 2001/02.
- 1.2 Appendix 1 shows the current forecast and actuals to date for the General Fund. Appendix 2 shows the Capital expenditure position.
- 1.3 No information has been provided for the Housing Revenue Account as the report required to summarise income and expenditure incurred to date is not yet available from the new financial information system. Budget responsible officers are however able to monitor their individual budgets and no significant budget variations have been reported, at this stage.

2 GENERAL FUND

- 2.1 Budget variations identified to date will result in a net budget overspend of £309,000.
- 2.2 The figures shown in Appendix 1 under the heading "previous variations" total £270,000 and relate to those items that have featured in individual reports since April but which have not yet been shown in a summary financial report. The main items are listed below but a full analysis is shown in Appendix 3.

2.4. In addition to the above variations, the asset rental charge to Leisure has increased by £256,000 following a revaluation of the recreation centres. There is however no effect on the overall General Fund as the increase is matched by an increase in the asset rental income figure.

3 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

3.1 Budget variations identified to date show a reduction in other services gross capital expenditure of £465,000.

3.2 The figures shown in Appendix 2 as "previous variations" relate to those items that have featured in individual reports since April but which have not yet been shown in a summary financial report. The £745,000 budget increase identified is comprised as follows:-

3.3 The figures shown as "new variations" total -£1,210,000 and are being reported for the first time. The reduction is summarised below but full details are shown in Appendix 5.

- 3.4 The effect of the various variations is to reduce the total unallocated capital resources by £99,000, being £167,000 for the Applemore Fitness Suite offset by a net reduction of £68,000 relating to the reduced CCTV scheme. These figures exclude the Developers' Contributions schemes, which are separately funded.
- 3.5 Housing Capital On 18 April 2001, Policy and Resources Committee increased the Environmental Enhancements budget by £250,000. This is to be funded by transferring resources from the revenue budget.
