FINANCIAL REPORT – OUTTURN PROJECTION BASED ON PERFORMANCE TO JULY 2009

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 This report considers financial performance for the first 4 months of 2009/10 and potential outturn implications on a Portfolio and Committee basis. It needs to be read in the context of the likely need to identify ongoing annual revenue savings of approximately £4 million per annum over the 3 year period to 2011/12, as set out in the Medium Term Financial Plan (MTFP) report considered by Cabinet on 6 July.

2 GENERAL FUND OUTTURN PROJECTION

- 2.1 A General Fund budget of £22.668 million for 2009/10 was agreed by Council in March and subsequently £218,000 have been added to this as a result of budgets carried forward from 2008/09, following the (MTFP) Report 2008 2012 to Cabinet of 6 July 2009.
- 2.2 Initially the 2009/10 budget was balanced by a contribution from reserves of £975,000. Portfolios have now identified total contributions of £978,000 towards this target. The surplus achievement of £3,000 together with the budgets carried forward from 2008/09 result in a revised General Fund Budget for 2009/10 of £22.883m.
- 2.3 In July Cabinet also noted the need to identify over £4 million of revenue savings and efficiencies by 2012. To support the ongoing Savings & Efficiency Plan approval was given for the provision of a reserve of £974,000, created initially by transferring resources from the Capital Programme reserve.
- 2.4 Indications are that the 2009/10 pay award will be settled within the budget provision level made.
- 2.5 The total of new commitments to be reported at this stage amounts to £132,000. This is offset by the following positive variations, totalling £517,000, leaving a net improvement in the forecast outturn of £385,000:
 - **Interest Earnings** are now expected to be £50,000 ahead of budgets, principally due to higher than expected General Fund balances.
 - Additional Benefit Admin Grant (to assist with increasing case loads) of £170,000 has been received of which £40,000 is committed to additional costs in this financial year.
 - Additional Local Authority Business Growth Incentive Scheme Grant for 2009/10 of £116,000 has been received, together with £23,000 in respect of Area Based Grant.

• Planning & Transportation / Planning Development Control:

Last year saw a significant reduction in income generated from land charges, planning fee and building control income as a direct result of the economic downturn. This year income for these areas is exceeding the reduced budgets set by a net £71,000. In addition £17,000 of habitat grant has been received of which to date only £7,000 has been allocated to cover increased costs.

• Leisure, Culture and Youth Matters:

Income at Health and Leisure Centres and at Dibden Golf Course is approximately £100,000 ahead of the reduced budget target set after the first 4 months of this year.

Variations are summarised in the table below and further detail is included in Appendix 1. The General Fund Outturn is now forecast at £22.498m.

3 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

3.1 The Capital Programme agreed by Council in March amounted to £11.568m. This has since been increased by 2008/09 capital programme slippage of £1.421m resulting in a total programme of £12.989m at the beginning of April 2009. Variations reported now result in a net increase in capital budgets of £397,000 resulting in a forecast capital outturn of £13.386m.

- 3.2 The most significant factors responsible for the increase are additional coastal protection schemes, fully funded by Government grants (£275,000) together with the allocation of a net £157,000 of developers contributions to a variety of schemes, fully detailed in Appendix 2. Net costs of the increase in capital budgets falling onto the Council amount to only £15,000, of which £14,000 are covered by capital receipts from the sale of equipment. Delays in the lottery submission process mean that the £50,000 budget for Ringwood Meeting House will not now be needed until 2010/11.
- 3.3 The following table provides an overview of the funding implications of the variations.

The Council has been successful in obtaining grant funding for the following coastal protection schemes:

- a) North Solent SMP Review
- b) Milford on Sea Emergency Works Phase 1
- c) Milford on Sea Emergency Works Phase 2

5. Finance & Efficiency

a) A number of small capital budgets totalling £11k can be deleted as they can be covered from within existing revenue budgets.

6. Leisure, Culture & Youth

- a) Coast (HoS M Devine) Relevant approval has been sought to replace 4 beach huts damaged as a result of the Milford Sea Wall collapse.
- b) **Dual Use / Joint Provision (HoS M Devine)** Due to delays in the lottery submission process this budget (Ringwood Meeting House) is now not expected to be needed until 2010/11.
- c) Totton Lighting / NM Bike Racking / Applemore Lift Scheme (HoS B Millard) – It is proposed to vire a total of £17k from the Totton Lighting / New Milton Bike Racking schemes in order to fund the costs of an enhanced lift replacement at Applemore, which will have the benefit of allowing safe evacuation of disabled persons in an emergency.
- d) New Milton/Lymington Health and Leisure Centres (HoS B Millard) – A capital receipt will be used to enable the efficient replacement of equipment at the same time rather than in steps.

 a) Developer Contributions (HoS M Devine) – A number of new schemes have recently been approved from Developers Contributions funds:
