The Chairman of the Council, Cllr Wyeth (in the Chair)

1. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

Cllr Hutchins moved that Cllr Rice be elected Chairman of the Council for the ensuing year.

The motion was seconded by Cllr Wilson and a number of members spoke in support.

RESOLVED:

That Cllr Rice be elected Chairman of the Council to continue in office until his successor becomes entitled to act as Chairman at the next Annual Meeting of the Council on 14 May 2001.

Cllr Rice took the Chair and made the declaration of acceptance of office, which was formally witnessed by the Chief Executive.

Cllr Wyeth invested the Chairman with the Chain and Badge of Office. Cllr Wyeth also invested the Chairman's Consort with her Badge of Office and presented her with a bouquet of flowers.

On behalf of the employees, the Chief Executive congratulated the Chairman on his election.

The Chairman thanked his fellow members for his election and pledged to uphold the respect and dignity due to the position.

2. VOTE OF THANKS TO COUNCILLOR WYETH.

It was moved by the Chairman of the Council, seconded and unanimously:-

RESOLVED:

That the Best Wishes of the Council be recorded to Cllr Wyeth for her tremendous service during her term of office as Chairman of the Council.

Members spoke of the way in which Councillor Wyeth had undertaken her duties on behalf of the District. She had carried out her duties with great dignity, good humour and a sense of purpose. She had earned the respect of every member and was an inspiration to the newer members of the Council.

On behalf of all the employees, the Chief Executive expressed his thanks and good wishes to Cllr Wyeth.

Cllr Wyeth thanked her fellow Councillors for allowing her the privilege of undertaking the role of Chairman for the year. 5. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS.

(a) Charity Tandem Ride

Cllr Wyeth thanked John Ward and Sheila Page who had just returned from riding a tandem from Lands End to Orkney. They had raised £230 for her two charities by challenging employees and members to pay £1 to guess how many miles they would cover.

With guesses ranging from 2.2 miles to 8,592 the final distance was 1,078 miles, 1,426 yards. The person with the closest guess was Louise Evans of the Environment Services Directorate. She won three months free entry to a Recreation Centre. Two runners up, who each won a bottle of champagne, were Elsie Tilburn and Kay Youngberg.

(b) Cllr Delia Wilson

Councillor Wyeth announced with great pleasure that Cllr Wilson was soon to be married. Cllr Wilson would step down from the Council in May 2001. All members of the Council joined Councillor Wyeth in congratulating Cllr Wilson on her forthcoming marriage.

(c) Questionnaire – New Political Structures

As part of the consultation progress for the adoption of new political structures, a questionnaire had been sent to every household and business in the District.

Respondents, excluding Councillors, employees and their families, who correctly answered a question about how much money the Council spent each year were entered into a prize draw.
