PLANNING AND COMPULSORY PURCHASE ACT 2004 – DELEGATIONS

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 has introduced a wide range of measures relating to the planning function. Some of these changes need to be reflected in the scheme of delegation of powers to officers. The activities involved are divided between those that are delegated directly from Council, those under the Economy and Planning Portfolio and Cabinet and those delegated by the Planning Development Control Committee.
- # 1.2 Attached as appendices to this report are the proposed changes. In each case, proposed deletions are shown as type that has been struck through (proposed deletions). Proposed additions are shown in bold italics (proposed additions).
 - 1.3 In addition to the changes proposed as a result of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act, it is also being suggested that the way in which officers are authorised to enter premises and to act under the Planning Development Control Committee is amended. Historically, each individual officer has been authorised by name. This means that there is a constant need to update the delegations, as officers join the Council and also leave. Elsewhere within the scheme of delegations, such authorisations are made by post. This is more efficient, and does not leave any gaps in time between an officer joining and the necessary authorisations being put in place.

2.1 None arising directly from this report, although an up to date scheme of delegations of powers does help the Council to operate in the most effective way.
