## ALLOCATION OF DEVELOPERS CONTRIBUTIONS FOR OPEN SPACE: MEMORIAL RECREATION GROUND, NEW MILTON

## ITEM FOR DECISION

A request has been made by New Milton Town Council for the allocation of $£ 15,000$ for project development and community engagement work for the provision of a performance pavilion at the New Milton Memorial Recreation Ground (see Appendix 1 for details). An allocation of $£ 5,000$ for initial feasibility work was made in 2011 and a Vision Plan and framework for further development of the potential of the recreation ground has been produced, and has been adopted by the town council.

## POLICY FRAMEWORK

The proposals will benefit to the whole community and respond positively to the following Core Strategy policies:

CS2 - design quality (high quality design that respects the local context)
CS3 - protecting and enhancing our special environment (enhancing local distinctiveness)
CS5 - safe and healthy communities (safe and well-structured public space)
CS7 - open spaces, sport and recreation (creating high quality of public space)
CS19-tourism (improved visitor experience)
CS20 - town, district and village and local centres (more attractive and accessible town centre)

## BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

The sum requested is $£ 15,000$. The balance of unallocated developers' contributions for open space in New Milton is currently just over $£ 400,000$.

## CONSULTATION INPUT

The project is being developed through a project steering group consisting of members and officers of the district and town council, and a representative of the New Milton town partnership. Additional representatives of other community groups including New Milton Music Festival/ ASBOcafe/ youth groups are brought in as required at key stages.

Extensive community engagement is an integral part of the project planning.

## PROPOSED DECISION

Text used for display board \#1 of public consultation in February 2012:

## WHY LOOK AT MAKING CHANGES TO THE RECREATION GROUND?

You may be wondering why the Town Council decided to look at the design of the Recreation Ground and what it currently offers to the people of the Town. The impetus came from two directions:

- Firstly, the response from people attending events held on the Rec, such as the Community Picnic and May Day Festivities, who said how much they enjoyed these events and wished there were more.
- Secondly, the strong response from people participating in the community consultation for the Town Plan Update carried out by New Milton Town Partnership. Many commented on the uninspiring aspects of the Recreation Ground and said that, whilst New Milton is very lucky to have this green space in the heart of the Town, it has the potential to be so much better than it is.

What has been lacking in the past is a cohesive layout plan resulting in a hotchpotch of ageing equipment which means that the Recreation Ground is not used nearly as much as it could be. The whole area has been looked at and some ideas for improvements have been put forward here for you to look at and comment upon. Any improvements will be implemented in phases and each phase will be fully consulted upon.

The first phase is for a Performance Pavilion where music and drama can be performed in the open air. It must blend in with and enhance the surroundings but still allow good viewing.

Who will pay and how much will it cost? Following this consultation, when you've given us your views, the project steering group will meet to agree a design brief and a budget for the performance pavilion. Later on, provided there is sufficient support for the project to go ahead, funding will be drawn down from developers' contributions funds which have been previously collected through the planning process and are held specifically to support public open space projects within New Milton (and cannot be used for any other purpose).

Please take this opportunity to look at the ideas presented here and let us have your thoughts on them. We also very much welcome your ideas. If there is sufficient support for Phase 1, your ideas will go forward to help design a pavilion that is unique to New Milton and its people and which will help make New Milton a more interesting and vibrant place to live in, and will attract more visitors to our town to enjoy what it offers.
