Hours premises to be open to the public

Monday 10.00 to 00.30 Tuesday 10.00 to 00.30 Wednesday 10.00 to 00.30 Thursday 10.00 to 00.30 Friday 10.00 to 00.30 Saturday 10.00 to 00.30

On the following days the premises are permitted to be open as follows: New Year's Eve up to 00.30 on 2 January 14 February, 1 March, 17 March, 23 April, 25 July, nearest Friday to 31 October, 30 November, 24 December and 25 December up to 01.30 the following day

Mandatory conditions:

As provided in the Licensing Act 2003

Other conditions:

- 1. The manager or the manager's nominated deputy shall monitor external noise levels when either live or amplified music is being played.
- 2. All external doors and windows shall be kept closed, other than for access and egress, in all rooms after 23.30 hours.
- 3. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions within and outside the premises requiring patrons to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 4. Patrons shall not be permitted on the premises outside the building itself after 23.00, other than for the purpose of access and egress.
- 5. Details of local licensed taxi companies shall be displayed in the premises.

REASONS FOR THE DECISION

The Sub-Committee carefully considered the evidence, both written and oral, supplied by the parties.

In respect of the standard finish time for the various licensable activities, the Sub-Committee had particular regard to representations concerning noise nuisance. They accepted that at present there are occasions where noise occurs at "turn out" time. However they noted that no objection to the application for increased opening hours had been made by the Environmental Health Department or the police.

They consider that permitting a longer period for licensable activities would enable customers to emerge from the premises at a more gradual rate. It is considered this would reduce the concentrated effect of noise likely to arise when numbers of people leave the premises at the same time, which would promote the licensing objective relating to the prevention of public nuisance.

The Sub-Committee noted that some representations were to the effect that patrons sitting at outside tables caused noise. They considered that a condition could be imposed on the licence to prevent this after 23.00 hours. The Sub-Committee also noted that objectors had made the point that the premises are the only licensed premises in the vicinity that has to date applied to sell alcohol after 11.00 p.m., and had the potential to draw people from other public houses that close at 11.00 p.m. However in the absence of any evidence that this would be the case the Sub-Committee do not feel they can restrict opening hours on the basis of speculation. It also noted points made about access being by a narrow rural road, parking in the country roads, and pedestrian traffic, providing potential for accidents. While this may be the case, the Sub-Committee did not accept that the degree of hazard was dependent on the timing of the premises' closure.

In light of the above, the Sub-Committee considered that it would be consistent with the licensing objectives if the application were largely granted. Should a statutory nuisance in the future be established, action may be taken under the Environmental Protection Act.

Regarding supply of late night refreshment, the Sub-Committee considered that if this were permitted right up to closing time, it would not help encourage the timely and gradual dispersal of patrons. Those who had been supplied with food or drink shortly before closing time would be likely to remain longer than they otherwise would in order to consume it. They therefore considered that the supply of late night refreshment should cease half an hour before closing.

There were no relevant representations made in respect of the application to remove restrictions placed on the licence by virtue of the "embedded conditions" under the 2003 Act. This part of the application is therefore granted.
