We would like to object to the extension of the opening times at this pub for the following reasons:

1. It is situated in a quiet, rural residential area unsuited to extended hours.
2. We experience noise from the patrons leaving the pub at closing time (also from the car park at the back). This also continues beyond closing time with patrons at the seating outside the front and back. We accept this at present however with our own jobs to do (and some of us with young families) this will be unacceptable at 1200 and 0100.
3. We have tolerated occasions where the Friday music and revelry outside the pub have gone beyond closing time and are concerned that extended hours will also be flouted.
4. Poor advertising of the plan. We believe many of the 10 houses within the 50m radius would object, but are not aware of the plan. We do not use the pub and therefore would not see a notice by the back door. There is no notice at the front of the pub at present. We ourselves were only made aware of this on 8.6.05.

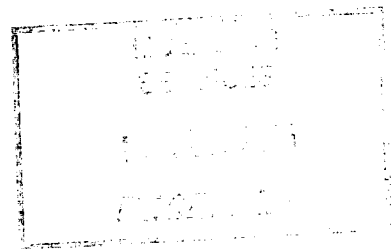

Request for Extension of Licensing hours-Game Keeper Public House, Woodlands

It should be noted that the Game Keepers Pub, Woodlands is located in a rural residential area and any development of usage would be out of keeping with its location. The Game Keeper is located within the New Forest National Park boundaries and as such should reflect the objectives of a National Park, maintaining the tranquillity of the location and reflecting its rural culture. Extending licensing hours would go against these objectives. We wish to register further our objection to this request for any extension of licensing hours on the following grounds.

Prevention of crime and disorder:

- a) Extension in hours would create a 'honey pot' situation with the potential to draw people from other nearby public houses which close at 11pm. Inner city pubs see much crime and disorder as a consequence of pub closure and the actions of people suffering from excessive alcohol.

Public Safety:

- a) Increased car movements and parking outside the public house and along the winding country road provide potential for accidents.

Prevention of public nuisance:

- a) Extension of hours would create considerable public nuisance. Noise would be created by continued car movements and the movement of people talking and shouting. The live and recorded music causes a noise nuisance and it can be heard on occasions with doors and windows shut. Neighbours with young children are particularly affected when young children are generally in bed at least two hours before the live music ceases. The current situation although only one night a week, is inappropriate for this location.
- b) Light would increase and create a public nuisance with light from the public house and from cars disturbing the tranquillity and increasing light pollution in the area. In a country location this adversely affects wildlife as well as rural night life.

Dear Sirs

The police yesterday evening advised us that our local public house, the Gamekeeper in Woodlands Road, has applied for extended licensing hours.

As local residents (we live within 50 yards) we have an interest in whether the pub's application is accepted, and therefore wish to put on record our objection to it. As we are sure you are aware, Woodlands Road is a reasonably quiet rural community, and we cannot see how such an extension to the opening hours can be justified.

We are certainly not being 'NIMBYs' and suggesting that we do not want a local pub at all, as the Gamekeeper was here when we moved in 11 years ago. It was our choice to buy the house and there are clearly both benefits and disadvantages to living so close to licensed premises. However, the current level of disruption is acceptable, but if the hours are extended we have real concerns this will cease to be the case.

At present the landlord seems to manage the establishment quite well, and the only real problem for us is occasional late night noise on Friday and Saturday evenings (usually in the summer), which can keep our children awake until well past midnight. Although the Gamekeeper will close at the allotted time, the pub's customers can end up sitting at the tables outside the front of the establishment, shouting, arguing and laughing well into the small hours. Our concern is that if the hours are extended, this situation can only get worse.

We understood that one of the main aims of the new licensing laws was to help reduce the problems associated with 'binge drinking' by allowing city centre pubs to spread alcohol consumption over a longer period. However, from what we know, binge drinking has not so far been a major problem at the Gamekeeper, and therefore cannot see the merit, other than the obvious commercial advantage for the brewery, of the extended hours.

We also have a real concern that if other pubs in the area do not apply for similar licences, the Gamekeeper will become the area's late drinking venue. This is not to say that we object to people drinking late into the evening, but the Gamekeeper is after all a small country pub surrounded by residential dwellings largely occupied by young families. Surely not the sort of establishment the Government had in mind when it drew up this legislation.

/.....

We would also like to put on record our dissatisfaction over the apparent lack of consultation that takes place with local residents when a pub applies to extend it's hours. If the police had not bothered to call at our house yesterday evening (only some 36 hours before the deadline for recording objections), we would have known nothing about this application. In fact my wife has spoken to a number of other local residents who also know nothing of it and they were horrified of the possibility of the license being extended. They all intended to voice their concerns, hopefully time is not against them.

Admittedly the pub has put up a notice, but this is apparently on the side of the building, and we wonder how you are supposed to see this unless you are visiting the establishment.


I am writing to register my strong objection to the application for extending the opening hours for the Game Keeper Public house.

Gamekeeper Public House – Application for extension of Licensing Hours

We wish to object to the application for extension of licensing hours at The Gamekeeper public house on the following grounds:-

Public Nuisance

At closing time we frequently witness noisy, loutish and generally anti-social behaviour. Language is almost invariably foul, beer cans etc are discarded and verges planted by residents are decimated.

Public Safety

Frequently after closing time noisy, tyre-screeching vehicles can be heard exiting the car park. After one extension about three years ago a vehicle coming from the pub at 0030 hours demolished the partition fence between our neighbour's and our driveway, before embedding itself into the brick wall of our front garden. We strongly suspect that the driver had been drinking.

We believe that any extension of hours would only exacerbate the situation, by encouraging customers from further afield and by pushing the time of the occurrences further into the night.

I was informed this morning by Ms Sarah Wilson of your office that the applicant in this matter should have displayed the statutory notice on the front of the building. When I looked for the notice at The Gamekeeper at 1000 hrs this morning the notice was displayed only at the side of the building where it could not be seen from the road. Later in the day it had been moved to a window in the front.

We are writing to object to the application for the above-named for extended opening hours. We wish to make the following points to support the objection:

- this application has not been widely publicised and there is little evidence of notice being given to the local community of the application. In fact it is my belief that few local residents are aware of this application.
- there would be a significant increase in late night traffic along a rural road that would lead to increased noise and safety issues.
- there is likely to be an increase in noise and anti-social behaviour from patrons leaving and arriving at the pub after 11pm. There is an increasing likelihood that these will be under the influence of alcohol and will generate the problems associated with drunken behaviour – shouting, swearing, fighting, criminal damage, litter. Such a development would be unacceptable.
- The Gamekeeper often has loud music playing at weekends up until closing time. While this is not ideal it is tolerated by local residents. For such noise to continue after 11pm is unacceptable.
- Rumour has it that The Gamekeeper is the only pub in the area that has applied for such a licence. As such this would make it the late night pub of choice for those wishing to drink late into the night.

The pub is situated in a rural setting on rural roads. There are a number of young families in the local community. Crime is low and there is little evidence of anti-social behaviour. A successful application would seriously endanger this situation in the Woodlands area. We oppose this application.

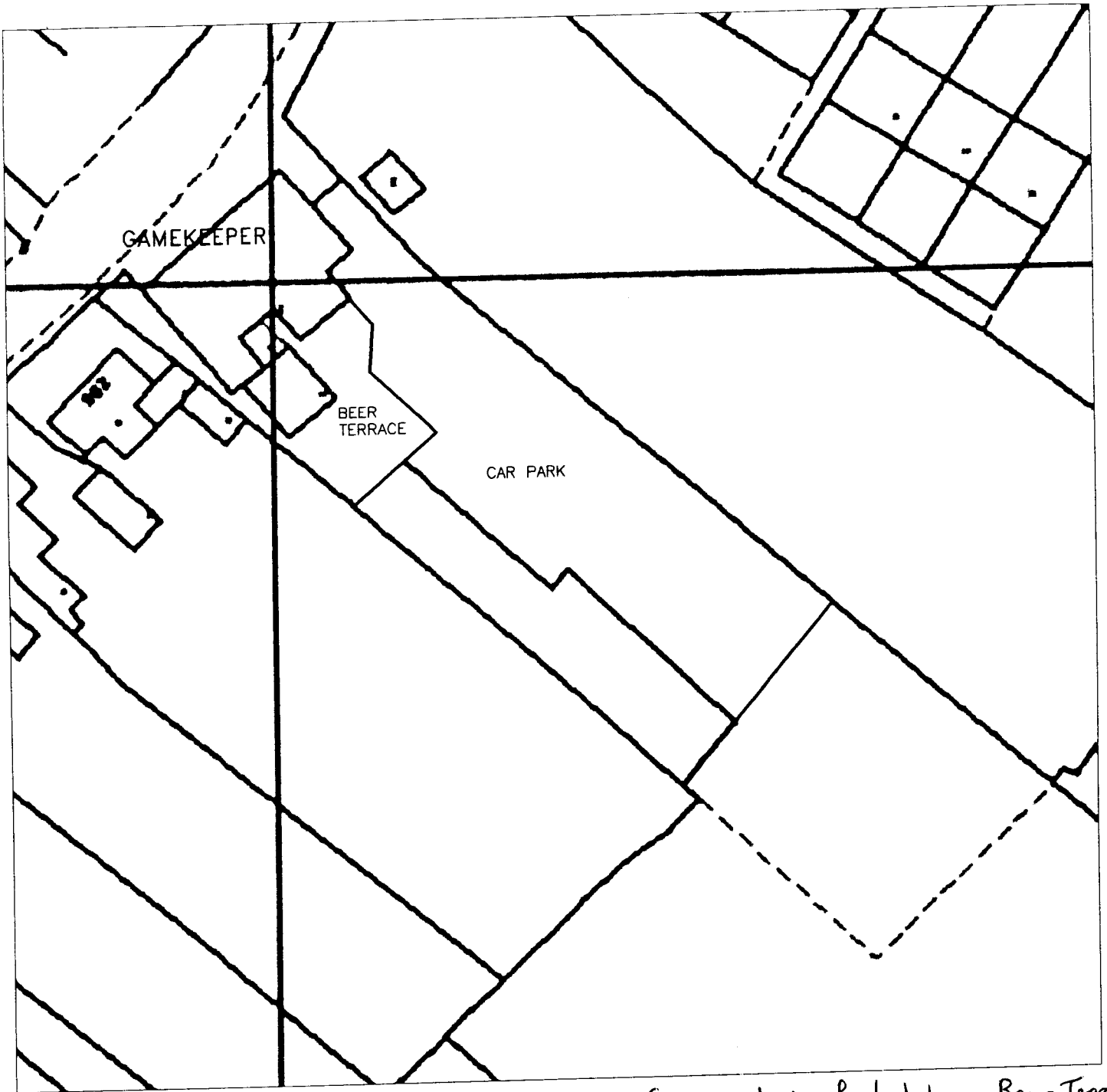

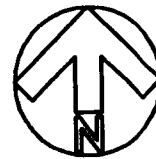

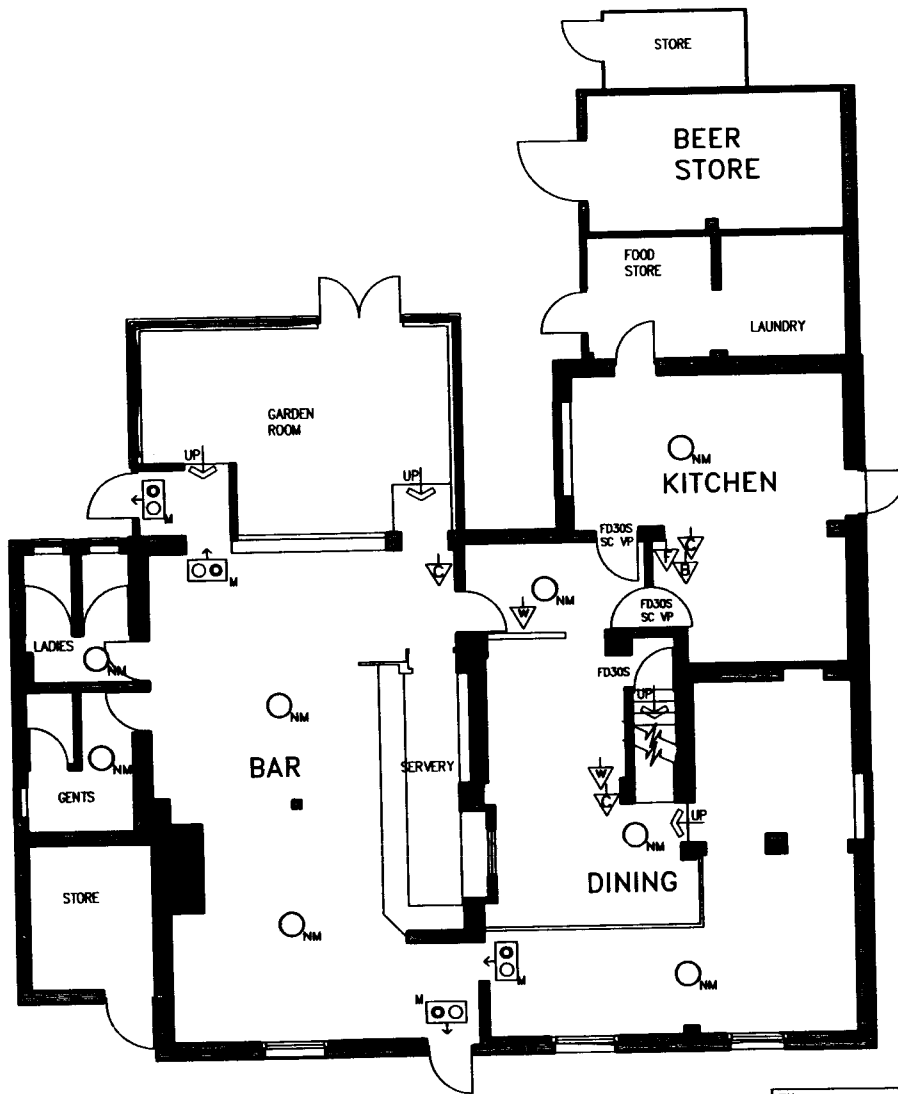
