Compasses Inn Damerham: Licensing Act 2003 premises licensing variation application

I am concerned that the requested variations to the existing license have the potential to cause increased public nuisance. Our property is next door to the Compasses, our house is some 40m away from the actual building and their car park adjoins our drive, about 8m from our house. Damerham is a small quiet village, so to have people shouting goodnight to each other and slamming car doors at 00.30 every night of the week, rather than 11.30 as it is now, will be an increased nuisance. In the past, there have also been loud arguments and the odd scuffle in the car park, although such occurrences have been infrequent.

My objections are obviously hypothetical at this stage as I have no knowledge as to whether the pub will actually open for the regular extended hours for which they have applied, although I must assume that they intend so to do otherwise there would have been no point in them applying for the variation. Of greater concern to me than the general extension of 1 hour is the application for extended hours until 01.00 on 24 times per annum, meaning that there could, in theory, be some sort of function or extending drinking hours once every fortnight, with people leaving at 01.30. This frequency strikes me as excessive: there has not been anything like this number of functions held in the pub during the past ten years or so. In addition to any potential noise problems, the inevitable issue of parking arises — the pub car park only has spaces for 24 vehicles; even on a normal day visitors to the pub frequently park in the road. A special function of some sort at the pub would presumably attract more people than usual, so inevitably they will be forced to park on the road. Access to my drive is already restricted on occasions by thoughtless parking; increased numbers at the pub will inevitably exacerbate the existing problem and increase the noise disturbance outside my property.

The application for dances implies to me that there would have to be some sort of temporary marquee in the pub garden as there is, as far as I am aware, no suitable space inside the building. This has happened in the past and the music has been quite loud inside our house throughout the entire evening.

I do not know whether it is relevant to this application, but the pub and the village hall are in close proximity in the centre of the village. There is already considerable noise disturbance and parking on the road whenever there is a function at the village hall: to approve a further source of potential disruption to the quiet of a rural village would have a inevitable detrimental impact on a tranquil environment.

I would be grateful if you consider my concerns when deciding whether to grant, amend or refuse the application.
