### a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 15)

We have applied for an extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises to give us the option to allow for a more gradual dispersal of customers. The style and operation of the pub will not differ significantly during the extended hours. Where this is appropriate, nonalcoholic refreshment will be available in the extended period.

The premises will respect Spirit Group's Approach to Responsible Drinking (a copy of which is enclosed in support of this application). Our policies change at regular intervals to reflect current trends and it would be inappropriate to standardise them on a permanent basis. The enclosed policy is included for information only and not as suggested conditions or to form part of any other Operating Schedule.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We are introducing Security Industry Authority (SIA) approved door supervisors across our estate, in line with the Government approved implementation plan.

A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times.

If a disc jockey is used on any night then he/she will ask customers to leave quietly.

If a CCTV system is installed at this site, it will continue to operate during the additional hours of trading and notices will be displayed.

All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the police and will be kept in an incident log book.

#### c) Public safety

Public safety is integral to the way that the Spirit Group runs its business and is reviewed regularly through our health and safety policy. This policy is fully briefed and trained to all management and staff and we will continue to train our staff to the standards required by relevant legislation. Free drinking water will be available at all times.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

Additional patrols will take place by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when entertainment is being offered within the premises.

If appropriate, notices will be displayed asking our customers to respect our neighbours when leaving the premises.

Where already used text/radio pagers will continue to be used for the additional hours of trading and will be monitored by a responsible member of staff.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic refreshment will be available if we decide to use the option to stay open for an extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises (see above under General).

#### e) The protection of children from harm

When children are allowed upon the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises will be suitable for young persons.





# Licensing Application The Bold Forester

As the owner of the fields directly opposite the Bold Forester I am writing to confirm my strong objection to the application of extended opening hours and late night refreshments.

Prevention of Public Nuisance and Safety

This is a rural area and the proposals (including music) will in effect make it more like an urban nightclub.

As this is a rural and residential area the current noise level at 'turn out' time is put up with, as is the litter and septic tank smells and overflow problems which have dominated the area in the past. Increased opening hours will surely exacerbate this, as presumably it is an endeavour to increase trade and therefore increase traffic and non local trade.

My concern is that as it is adjacent to the New Forest it will become the nightclub out of town and also for the holiday makers staying in local campsites i.e. A herst and Denny and then increase the likelihood of accidents involving livestock on the forest on their return.

Policing will obviously have to be increased in a rural area which is already stretched. Surely police time would be better spent in dealing with crime and not public nuisance cause by pubs staying open so late and associated increase in traffic. The potential for increase in crime is there as the pub is

Twiggs Lane is a road which is sided by houses and livestock fields.

Our fields are used by us, as Commoners, for grazing for our mares. This year the fields were used by foaling mares. Mares generally foal in the early hours of the

orning. Noise and disturbance at this time can be disastrous. I understand that certain closing times may be as late as 2am with a late night liquor licence allowing food to be served one hour later. This disturbance to our animals by people leaving the pub will cause additional concern and worry at this time

Ours are not the only animals in this area which will be affected.

People who live in rural areas are very aware of noise at night and it will cause disturbance to sleep as well as worries over livestock safety.

Another concern is the traffic amount and speed at the time of night. How many cars in ditches and hedges along this road have there been in the last few months? Increasing the traffic is one issue but the time of night can only heighten safety worries. The roads are rural and winding.

Rubbish from the pub is an annoyance at present which we just deal with. We collect the beer cans, bottles, empty cigarette packets, menus etc from the field with our ponies in it and say nothing. We appreciate that the pub is there and is providing a service. What provisions have been made in the application for safe disposal of rubbish generated. Will the septic tank cope with the proposals or will we be back to 'overflow' and stench status again. This is a hazard to both people and livestock.

Finally, we cannot see any justification for granting this urban proposal in a rural and residential area. It will be detrimental to both peoples lifestyle in terms of noise and rubbish pollution, potential increased crime and safety of both residents and road users. The effect on the many livestock in the area must also be taken into account especially those due to give birth and young stock.

We would hope that the council would look closely at our objections and reject the application.



I am writing in reference to the Bold Forester Public House at Beaulieu Road, Marchwood. As I am aware they are requesting extended opening hours and a licence for live and recorded music. I therefore would like to place an objection against this.

I have lived in Twiggs Lane End my entire life and have a small holding there where I practise my commoning rights. Some of my land runs along side of the Bold Forester.

To extend to longer opening hours would be incompatible with the areas quiet rural surroundings. The New Forest is recognised internationally for its wildlife importance. If any extension of opening hours went ahead, this would have a harsh impact on vulnerable and sensitive wildlife in the area. Also it would have an effect on my mares, foals, cows and calves, which graze and "give birth" in the adjacent field. I know the Bold Forester offers a service and has to make ends meet, but we are in the countryside now and not an urban part of town.

We can hear clearly across our field and always know when it's closing time. We tolerate the noise levels from revving cars, rubbish thrown over the fence and groups of lads whom find Twiggs Lane End a good place to park at night, being a dead end lane. Between the hours of 8am-11pm there is always a light movement of traffic along Longdown to Beaulieu Road. Although late night opening would bring additional traffic and noise levels to the area. This would create more disturbance and a heavier flow of traffic across the open forest, where at present young foals are being born.

So I put it to you, please keep our picturesque part of the forest as it is, and let us continue commoning in our own quiet way. We do not want people coming from the town just because they know that they can continue to drink until 2 or 3am in the morning. I also wonder of those people leaving the pub at that time in the morning, how many will be under the drink drive limit? Thank you for your time and consideration.

The proposed application would not meet the objectives of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety or Prevent of Public Nuisance.

Increasing the hours to the Bold Forester will encourage more people to attend from around the surrounding areas if no other premises are staying open late. This will put more traffic on to a 'C' road increasing the risk of accidents happening. More traffic late at night will make the road noisy and unacceptable in what is currently a quiet rural area.

There is no public transport available, no street lighting or pavements putting people's lives at risk if they walk along the road late at night when returning home. The A326 would also need to be crossed which is a busy road and very unsafe late at night with no lights or pedestrian crossing. People are already often seen walking home from the premises now.

The noise of music will be disturbing to the local residents, some with young children, together with the noise of people leaving the premises.

It has already been known for signs and gates to be vandalised late at night and this would increase immensely especially if people decide to walk home rather than get taxis.

Marchwood is very close by and within walking distance. Hythe and Totton are both a short taxi journey away. This would make the premises a likely area for people to go if they want a late night drink.

The above local residents wish to make the following representations.

#### Prevention of Public Nuisance

#### **Hours and Noise**

- ❖ We feel that it is unreasonable for The Bold Forester to extend its hours. This would cause a great intrusion for this very small, quiet, rural community. It is likely that determined drinkers would migrate to The Bold Forester at 11pm every night because of the late opening hours, thus causing extensive traffic noise in this small country lane at a time of night that otherwise would be still and quiet.
- ❖ The Bold Forester is situated in a rural location within The National Park. The Landlord/Landlady cannot be made to take responsibility for disorderly behaviour on the roads outside this pub and in the locality. The consequences of these additional licensing hours could therefore necessitate police presence here, increasing police costs and creating circumstances that are not appropriate to this community.
- ❖ The Bold Forester is a single glazed building. Noise and vibration from live music/entertainment would undoubtedly emanate from the premises causing a nuisance to our small community.
- ❖ At weekends in the summer, during daylight hours, noise emanating from The Bold Forester beer garden/children's play area is already intrusive to local residents. Late at night, noise from this outside area would be an unwelcome invasion of the quietude normally experienced by this small rural community.
- Noise from vehicles/customers leaving the pub in the early hours of the morning, every morning, is bound to cause serious disturbance to residents.

#### Crime and Disorder

#### **Drinking and Driving**

❖ The Bold Forester is a rural pub within The National Park and is mainly accessed by car. Because of the limited taxi service available in this area, we fear that customers of the pub will be encouraged to drink and drive.

#### **Disorderly Behaviour**

❖ The behaviour of customers leaving at 1 or 2am is also bound to cause serious concerns and stress to residents, some of whom are elderly.

#### **Health and Safety**

#### Road safety

❖ The pub is situated very close to a dangerous corner (Twiggs Lane, Beaulieu Road, Arters Lawn junction) and again we are concerned that the increased traffic and possible drunk drivers leaving the pub will lead to serious accidents.

#### **Car Parking**

The car parking facilities at The Bold Forester may not be adequate for the large number of vehicles wishing to access the pub on entertainment nights. This could lead to vehicles parking in the lane, which is poorly lit. We fear that this will cause obstruction and hazardous road conditions.

#### Ponies, cattle and wildlife

❖ We live in The New Forest. Consideration should be given to the safety of our New Forest ponies, cattle and wildlife that roam freely on unlit roads. We are anxious that the increased traffic leaving The Bold Forester may cause more incidents of animal injury and deaths.

In conclusion, it is suggested that the application for the variation of a premises license in this case is <u>not</u> a fair balance between the need of those wanting refreshment and the need to prevent public nuisance and crime. We feel that it is important for the Licensing Authority to 'get it right' so as not to cause problems and stress to members of our small community.
