Following our recent meeting I can confirm the following actions and plans are now in place,

Contact has been made with the new managers of Downton Park assuring them of our intention not to allow anything on our own premises to spoil the enjoyment of their guests. Subject to the agreement of the owner we will visit Downton and hopefully identify further measures to obviate any problems. We will be setting up a "hot line" with them so that they can contact us directly should there be a problem at any time of the day. They welcomed this initiative.

Please take the following measures as supplemental to our recent Licensing Act 2003 application. This replaces the emails to NFDC of 19 July 2005.

I can confirm that we agree that music and speech from the licensed premises shall be inaudible after 23.00 hours from the hashed line on the attached map and barely audible on the same line between the hours of 20.00 and 23.00. This may be subject to the following exception:

With regard to live and recorded music outside during daylight hours, we are happy to agree to a limit of 8 (Eight) occasions for outside events. We will adhere to current best practice including the Noise Councils Code of Practice on Environmental Noise Control at Concerts.

I can also confirm that should we plan these we would do so in accordance to EHO guidance at the time.

Noise sensitive premises include premises used for residential purposes, hospitals or other similar institutions, educational establishments (when in use), or places of worship (during recognised times and days of worship) or any other premises used for any other purpose likely to be effected by the music noise.

Use of the terrace will be banned after 9.30pm; notices to this effect are already in place. Duty Managers and outside Security will police this ban. The alarms to doors leading to the terrace will be located internally.

In order to render other noise inaudible or barely audible the car park at the front of the building, adjacent to Shorefield Rd. will not be open to the public.

It will be heavily stressed to our guests that they must leave quietly.

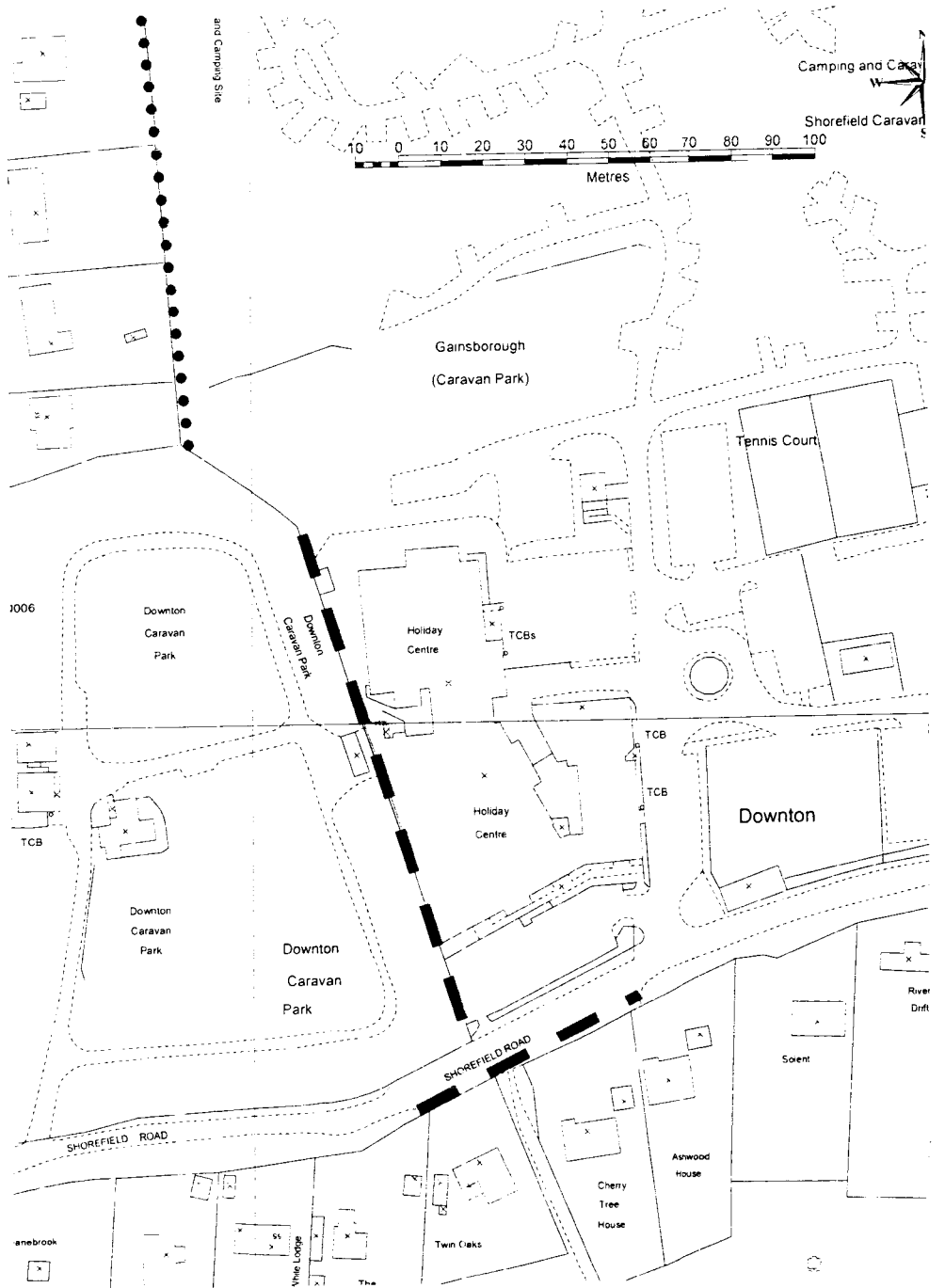

It is not my wont to keep repeating my views upon any subject, but in respect of the concentrated development of the extreme west end of the Shorefield complex, no alternative exists.

In addition to the aggravations that this produces vis-a-vis my home & these buildings, my wife has a mobile home on Downton Park, for the convenience of friends & relatives visiting us. The noise, particularly at night, emanating from Shorefield, plus the noise & danger of the traffic using Shorefield private road both by day and night, is such that we shall abandon this adjunct.

The whole of the proposal seems to be designed to overwhelm the Downton Park site and in essence, it makes worse a badly designed earlier effort.

To be constructive and bearing in mind the total number of visitors who could be within this concentration of buildings, a 3m (min) wide road should exist along the west boundary, as access for fire-fighting & ambulance vehicles.

The provision and maintenance of further screening between this road & the boundary wall, able to both visually & audibly isolate the Christians from the Lions, should be a mandatory provision prior to the granting of any further planning permission.

I have previously referred to this site as being within green or white belt land and this has never been refuted: this point should now be clarified to the local electors.

Each additional caravan which comes onto Shorefield and each additional entertainment facility, adds to the weight and volume of vehicular traffic using the only access road, none being driven within the signed speed limit. A proper study should be conducted prior to any further development: observations should cover the hours between 07.00 & 24.00, to include early deliveries by large & very large lorries, the import of further mobile homes, construction traffic of all types, together with the departure of large coaches removing revellers.


We would like to strongly object to this application.
