The types of regulated entertainments proposed re-instate and then enhance the normal pub and family entertainments that were previously unregulated, with the benefit to enhance the local facilities for social entertainment and reduce the focus on alcohol.

The facilities for live and recorded music, dancing and voice are proposed in support of bookings, events and the core business of a family friendly public house.

No new steps have been identified by my risk assessment in relation to the four licensing objectives, except as below I have considered the terms of your local licensing policy in preparing this application.





I have just got a copy of your licence variation application for the White Hart in Pennington. I have been asked to comment on your application with regards public nuisance. The application is asking films, sporting events, live music. recorded music, dance, amplified voices and dancing inside to 1am and outside to 10pm.

I am concerned that there is potential for noise nuisance to be caused by the holding of such regulated entertainment unless suitable controls are in place at the venue. May I refer you to Section C, the prevention of public nuisance, of the Licensing Policy 2003. (7th January 2005). A copy of this document is available at www.nfdc.gov.uk.

The controls that I would like you to consider adding to your operating schedule are designed to minimise the impact of these activities on the local community. With regards to inside events I would like you to consider the following conditions:

- . The licence holder or nominated representative shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of the regulated entertainment.
- . All external doors and windows shall be kept closed, other than for access and egress, when events involving live and/or amplified music (including amplified speech) are taking place.
- . After 2300, music and noise emanating from the premises shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.
- . Prior to 2300, music and noise emanating from the premises whilst audible, is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any base beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.

(Noise sensitive premises includes premises use for residential purposes, hospitals or similar institutions, educational establishments (when in use), or places of worship (during recognised times and days of worship) or any premises used for any other purpose likely to be affected by the music noise.)

With regards to outside events the only real controls that you can have on the noise relate to the number and the duration of these events in addition to the conditions I have outlined. I would recommend that you set the number of events that you wish to hold outdoors per year to minimise the impact on your neighbours.

As the application stands at the moment I would be looking to put in a formal objection as the application does not comply with our licensing policy.

I strongly oppose this application on the following
grounds -

- a) Prevention of nuisance. Situated close to and nearby to
these premises are private dwellings - a nursing home, a
care home & old peoples flats and the noise from live entertain-
ment - exceptionally loud music - amplifiers, microphones,
makes it impossible for residents to relax in their gardens
& homes over the weekend. We have experienced this
situation from the previous landlord & found the noise at
such late hours made it impossible to sleep even with
double glazed windows tightly shut, due to the throb
throb of the music - Also the revving of car engines
& shouting in the car park at closing time - & this is only
to 11 pm at present, but to extend this to 1 a.m. is totally
unacceptable to residents nearby.
- b) Protection of children from harm. Residing not some 100yds
from the White Hart are young children who, because of the
noise (loud music), suffer from sleep deprivation on the

nights the music is blaring out. They cannot get off to sleep &/or are continually disturbed - as indeed are the adults - we have phoned the previous landlord requesting the volume be turned down but our requests are ignored. 0100 closing is socially & healthwise unacceptable.

c) Prevention of crime & disorder

I have often heard fighting at closing time on the pavement outside the White Hart & in the car park from customers who have been the worse for over indulging - also vomit on the pavement the following morning & broken glasses. Neighbours suffer from customers who go on the rampage at closing time, to - damage & theft to property in our gardens, road signs vandalised - the daffodils uprooted on Stamford Hill when in season. The police are frequently having to deal with drunk customers

d) Public safety Being close to Pennington roundabout makes it a highly dangerous spot as drivers having had too much to drink roar away from the car park - there have been numerous incidents, reported in the hymn times, of dangerous behaviour & driving by customers which has involved the police.

We have held a residents meeting & we all

feel that these extended opening hours applied for by Mr + Mrs Treacey are not acceptable in this quiet residential area. 11pm is bad enough when the music is blaring out across the area & then at closing time we've to put up with vandals —

We sincerely hope your department will listen to our objections — & act accordingly.

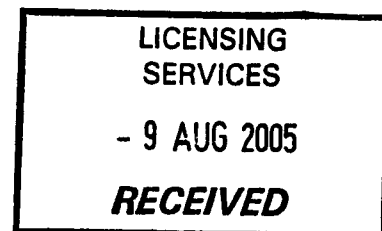

I most strongly object to the proposed opening hours for drinking & entertainment licence applied for on the following objections:

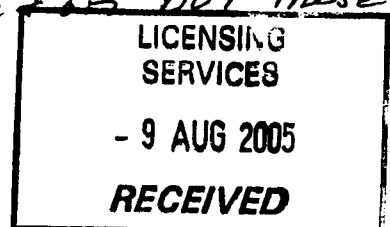
1. Though the White Hart is on Milford road it backs on to residential property within yards and would cause noise nuisance.

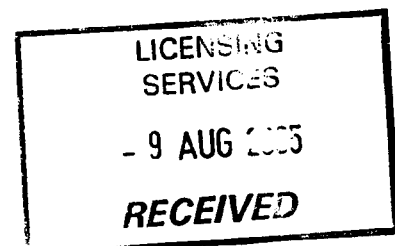

I would be grateful if you could inform me of the outcome of their application.

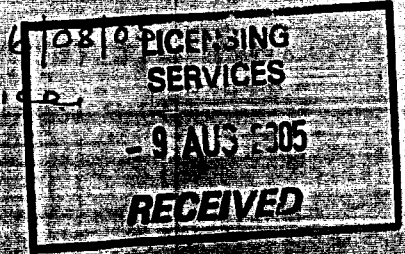

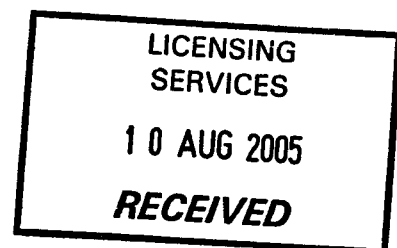



There is a new housing development directly behind and to the side, and as they are family homes (children and older folk) the noise level will be intolerable to them in the late/early hours.

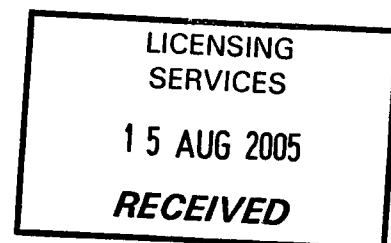
There is also building permission for 20 homes next to them, and they will also be affected, plus all the existing homes in the vicinity.
