

## STATEMENT RELATING TO LICENSING OBJECTIVES

Sir Walter Tyrrell Brook Canterton Lyndhurst

This STATEMENT has regard to

- The Licensing Act 2003
- Home Office Guidance
- The licensing objectives
- The Council's Statement of Policy

This statement sets out the issues that the applicant has considered having regard to the above. The applicant offers the specific Proposed Conditions attached, which are based on the Model Pool in Government Guidance, for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The applicant has considered the nature of the premises and facilities offered, and the surrounding area. The premises are operated as a traditional country inn with facilities for refreshments, entertainment and functions. Functions and events are held both inside the premises and in the grounds. There are also limited camping facilities available in the grounds.

The premises are set in the heart of the New Forest, in a hamlet. It has been operating in this way for many years.

### Prevention of Crime and Disorder

As a responsible operator, the applicant is aware that there are issues which need to be addressed in an operation of this nature.

The following matters are considered

#### General criminal activity

- The employment of trained staff. Their duties will include checks on customers behaviour.
- Close liaison with the Police when appropriate.

#### Excess Consumption of alcohol

- Ensuring that bar staff are aware of legal requirements, which will include a prohibition of selling to or for a person who is drunk.

- Not offering irresponsible promotions on drinks (such as “drink all you want for £10” )

#### Drugs

There have been no issues with this site. If necessary, the site will enforce a Zero Tolerance approach.

#### Capacity

The applicant accepts that it may be necessary to accept a maximum capacity in respect of persons that can safely be accommodated in the premises, and that number should not be exceeded.

#### Bottle ban

There have been no issues and in a premises of this nature such a ban is not necessary or appropriate. This will be periodically reviewed and reconsidered if necessary.

#### Plastic Containers and Toughened Glasses

When there is a busy event, including televised sports events, or when drinks are taken or supplied outside, toughened pint and half pint glasses will be used. Best endeavours will be used to prevent bottles and glasses from leaving the area controlled by the premises.

#### Crime Prevention notices

There have been no issues which make such notices necessary. This will be periodically reviewed and reconsidered if necessary.

#### CCTV

The current CCTV installation will be maintained and recordings made available to Police on request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998). Recordings will be retained for 14 days.

#### Personal Licence Holder

It is proposed that (subject to practicalities) a Personal Licence holder will be at the premises when they are open for licensable activities. In the event that this is not the designated premises supervisor, a notice will give their details.

#### Restrictions on Drinking Areas

Consumption of alcohol has been permitted in external areas for many years. This rarely causes a problem, having regard to the nature of the operation. The situation will be periodically reviewed and restrictions considered if necessary.

#### Electronic Communication Devices

Having regard to the size and nature of the premises, and its user, the use of such devices is neither necessary nor appropriate. The management will ensure adequate controls are maintained.

### **Promotion of Public Safety**

The applicant is aware of the need to ensure that those using the club premises including staff using the premises are not put at risk. Wherever practicable, disabled persons will not be treated in a less advantageous way than able-bodied people.

The following have been considered

#### Fire precautions

The applicant is aware of the existing requirement for a Fire Risk Assessment and of the need to comply with it. The assessment addresses the issues raised at paragraph 5.12 of the Statement of Policy, where appropriate. The date of the most recent assessment is \*\*\*\*\*

#### General Health and Safety

The applicant is aware of the existing requirements for Risk Assessments and of the need to comply with them. The assessment addresses the issues raised at paragraph 5.12 of the Statement of Policy, where appropriate. The date of the most recent assessment is \*\*\*\*\*

#### Capacity

The applicant will accept the maximum capacity figure agreed by Police and Council under the current PEL. That is **300**. Steps will be taken to ensure that this figure is not exceeded.

#### Electrical installations

The applicants are aware of the requirements to maintain and will periodically inspect. Electrical Contractors will be employed as necessary.

#### Special Effects

None proposed, but in the event of any future requirement the condition in the attached Appendix is offered.

## **Protection of those in the area from nuisance**

As a responsible operator, the applicant is aware of the need to take all necessary steps to prevent those living or working in the area from being caused a nuisance by the activities at the premises.

The following issues have been considered

### Noise nuisance (including vibration)

There have been issues regarding noise complaints in the past. The PEL is subject to a condition which is repeated in the Schedule. It is understood that there are no current issues. There is no proposal to significantly increase the intensity, nor to alter the style, of use to date. The applicants are aware of the need to continue to be good neighbours, and to take all necessary steps to ensure that there will be no disturbance from the activities at the premises.

### External areas

The external areas are currently used, and have been for many years in line with many other country inns of this nature. They will continue to be used. There are few issues with that use.

### Fumes

There are no current issues with fumes from this site.

### Light

There are no light sources in existence or proposed which will be intrusive to residents.

### Car Parking

There is adequate car parking for patrons who have travelled to the premises. There is no intention of significantly intensifying or altering the style of use, and this is not anticipated to be an issue in the future.

### Sanitary Accommodation

There is sufficient on site. Anti-social behaviour is not an issue.

### Notices to departing patrons

Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting those departing to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises in the area quietly, should that prove necessary.

### Movement of Refuse

Refuse such as bottles will not be placed into external receptacles between the hours of 2300 and 0600 or such earlier hours as may be necessary to ensure that there is no disturbance to residents in the area.

### **Protection of Children**

The applicant is committed to protect children using these premises to the best of its ability.

The site is family friendly during the day, but in the unlikely event that it is appropriate those under 18 will be excluded from the premises from 9pm if the style of licensable activity following that time is not conducive for young persons.

#### Supply of alcohol

The applicant is aware of the statutory restrictions and the need to ensure that under 18's are not supplied with alcohol. It is aware of the risk that young persons may try to obtain alcohol on these premises.

The following steps are proposed

- (a) Persons who look under 18 will be asked for ID before they will be admitted to the premises at certain times or on certain occasions, or sold alcohol.
- (b) The staff are trained and their training includes this aspect and the need for vigilance.
- (c) No person involved in the sale of liquor will be under 18.
- (d) The ID that is accepted will be only that approved by PASS a driving licence or passport.

*Dear Sirs*

*As a close neighbour of the above Public House, we wish to place on record our objections to the substantial increase to the existing licensing hours and activities.*

*Our objections relate to the Public Nuisance and Public Safety to which we understand the Council must give regard when considering any Application.*

*1. Nuisance*

*There is no public transport serving the area close to the premises and only a handful of residences within walking distance. It therefore follows that the majority of customers arrive and depart by motor vehicle of some description. Any increases in hours or entertainment activities will inevitably cause an increase in the volume of traffic noise and nuisance late into the night (after 23.00 hours) than occurs at present.*

*We understand that a number of the Public Houses in the immediate area (within a 5 miles radius) have not applied for additional hours. This could lead to a rush of customers from the Pubs closing at 23.00 hours to the Sir Walter Tyrrell if the later hours are allowed. This would lead to more traffic arriving after 23.00 hours and eventually leaving. The majority of this traffic would use the lane between The Bell and The Sir Walter Tyrrell causing greater nuisance to the residents who live on that lane. This lane has a 6'6" restriction between the entrance by The Bell and the entrance to the Sir Walter Tyrrell as it is narrow and winding and unsuitable for heavy vehicles. Despite these notices both the Police and Hampshire Council Roads division at Jacobs Gutter Lane have been involved in stopping large delivery vehicles and coaches using this unsuitable road. We already regularly have cars leave the carriage-way in this lane and end up in the hedges and ditches and it is also a daily route for forest animals so a substantial increase in traffic would be a safety issue.*

## 2. Noise Levels

*Any increase in permitted hours and types of entertainment will lead to an increase in the level and times of noise emanating from the premises to the annoyance of the local neighbours. This is particularly important if the activities are allowed outside the main building. i.e. at tables outside or in a temporary marquee.*


*It should be noted that the whole area has a very low level of noise, particularly late at night.*

*By the nature of its geography, the Sir Walter Tyrrell is very much a tourist attraction and as such contributes to the local economy. However, we cannot see that the proposed extension to hours and activities are designed to attract tourists into the area but to attract custom from surrounding towns and villages*

## 3. Public Safety

*The lane in which The Sir Walter Tyrrell is situated is already extremely dangerous and access at either end is hazardous with the crossing of the A31 at one end and the dangerous junction opposite the Bell Hotel at the other end. Any increase in traffic, particularly late at night when drivers could well have alcohol in their blood (even up to the legal limit) would inevitably increase the traffic hazard. Also there are virtually no local taxi companies, and those in town are usually unwilling to come so far out of town particularly late at night and we believe inevitably there will be an increase in drivers who cannot obtain a taxi taking a chance and driving home when under the influence. With such a narrow windy road and animals loose at night it will only increase the public safety concerns.*

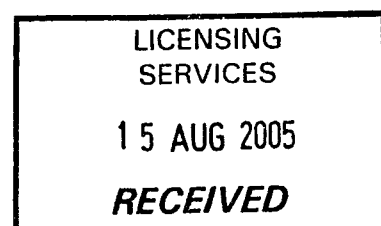

any increase in traffic would lead to problems  
such as parking.

Also traffic in the day would increase in the lane which is very narrow. Parking at present is not contained in the Gyrrell car park, which leads to heavy congestion outside the premises. On some occasions this has blocked a gateway to our property used for the emergency services.

At night the increase in traffic leaving would be hazardous as the lane is very narrow and there is no lighting and very few places where cars can safely pass each other. There are also the forest ponies to consider, because this is a favoured spot where many congregate along this very narrow lane day and night.

At present there is a NOISE CONTROL restriction in place:- Music noise, including vocals and amplified music emanating from the premises shall be inaudible at the boundaries marked in red on the attached plan. We would like this restriction to be upheld.
