3. The names and addresses of any persons proposed for election as members of the said club shall be prominently displayed in the club premises for not less than two days before election.
4. No persons shall be deemed to be bona fide members of the club or be supplied with any intoxicating liquor until duly elected after the said period of two days
5. This licence shall not entitle the licence holder to apply for or obtain an Occasional Licence
6. Any alteration to the rules of the club affecting admission of members and guests shall be reported to the superintendent of Police and the Clerk to the Justices' within 48 hours
7. The holder of the licence shall be relieved from compliance with the enactment which require notices to be displayed in or on licensed premises.

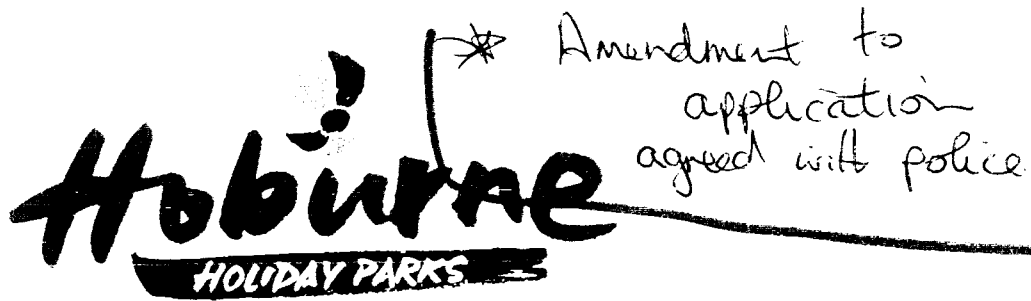

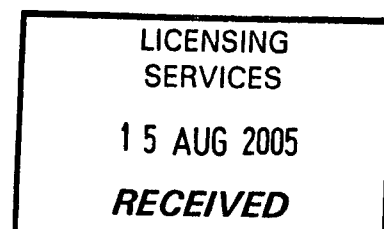
We wish to register our objection to the above application for the following reasons.

1. Children living on the Camp, especially during the holiday period, would have their sleep severely disturbed by the noise and sometimes, rowdy behaviour, created by those leaving over a longer period than at present.
2. With reference specifically to Boldre Close, we often have our rest disturbed, particularly at weekends, by people walking down the Close, to use the footpaths out onto either Vectis. Road or Ellingham Road. This has in the past meant a trail of beer cans and crisp packets littering the gardens and verges. There has also been an instance of eggs being thrown at our property. A neighbour has had 'pooh bags' which have been taken from the bin, filled with a stone and thrown onto her roof. Not very nice for an eighty year old.
3. We are very concerned that any extension to the existing hours when the camp can sell intoxicants can only exacerbate the existing situation and is totally unnecessary.
4. Although not strictly relevant to the application, we think it worth mentioning our disquiet over the times when the card operated barrier is broken and therefore allowing anyone to enter and leave the camp. The last time, about eight weeks ago, the barrier was down for six weeks before being replaced. The barrier is not always broken for this length of time. Obviously, this means that there is no control over who is entering the camp. This happens several times a year and surely must be in contravention of the relevant planning application.
More particularly and relevant to the application, it means there is no control over any possible undesirables entering the camp.
We therefore consider that any extension to the licensing hours currently granted to Hobourne Naish, can only exacerbate the disturbances currently experienced.

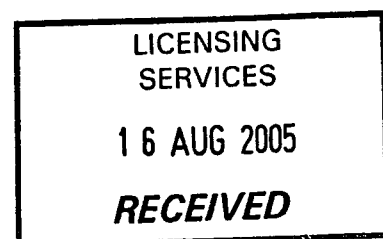
