We write to advise you that we are instructed on behalf of Eldridge, Pope and Company Limited.

We enclose herewith a completed application for conversion and variation together with the following enclosures:

1. Our cheque in the sum of £1,000 made payable to your Council
2. Certified copy of the Justices' Licence and Public Entertainment Licence.
3. One copy of plan.
4. Proposed Premises' Supervisor Consent Form.
5. Consent form by the holders of the existing Licence.

We confirm that a copy of this letter and all enclosures (save the cheque) has been sent to all the Responsible Authorities set out at the foot of this letter by Guaranteed Next Day delivery.

The appropriate notice will be displayed on the premises for 28 days starting 22 July 2005.

The notice will appear in the Lymington Times on Saturday 23 July 2005.

Conversion

Regulated Entertainment

We fully appreciate that the benefit under Section 182 Licensing Act 1964 so far as live entertainment by up to two performers is not to be treated as an existing licensable activity but the playing of recorded music is an existing licensable activity for the purposes of conversion. We mention this by way of explanation as to why boxes f and i on page 4 of the conversion application have been ticked. Box i has only been ticked to reflect the fact that equipment has to be provided in order to play recorded music! If you consider that box i should not be ticked then you are authorised to delete this "tick". We say this as we know that some authorities take the view that only box f should be ticked in these circumstances.

Late Night Refreshment

As the premises hold a Justices' Licence they are exempt from the provisions of operating a late night refreshment house for the period ending 30 minutes after the end of permitted hours for the premises. It is for that reason that we have ticked the provision of late night refreshment box on the form as this exemption is to be carried forward under the provisions of para 6(5) of the Eighth Schedule to the Licensing Act 2003.

We mention this by way of explanation as to why the Late Night Refreshment box has been ticked.

Variation

The instructions as to Part B of the form requires completion of those parts of the operating schedule which would be subject to change if the application to vary were successful. The instructions go on to ask for details of any licensable activities in addition to those authorised by way of the conversion and any varied times for the conduct of licensable activities already authorised by the conversion application.


We have, up until now, been sticking to those instructions and, for example, stating in box M a start time of 2300 hours and a finish time of 2400 hours on the basis that we are currently authorised until 2300 hours and are seeking one hour's extension.

Whilst we remain of the view that this method of completing the forms is correct we have no wish to perpetuate confusion which appears to be caused by completing the applications in this way.

Accordingly, and without prejudice to grandfather rights in terms of activities and hours, we have decided to complete the form indicating the overall hours including both existing authorised hours by way of the conversion application and the additional hours sought by way of the variation application.

We should be grateful if you would kindly acknowledge safe receipt.

As residents of the High Street we are writing to express our deep concern regarding the Angel Inn and Blue Pig's application to extend their opening hours.

We, along with our two pre-school children, live directly opposite the Angel Inn and we believe that granting this application will amplify the level and duration of night time noise to an intolerable level and increase the anti-social behaviour.

We have three major concerns:

1. Next to our home is Navarino Court after closing time we are regularly disturbed by drinkers leaving the Angel using the side of our property as a urinal, directly under our bedroom. The language and shouting is often enough to wake the dead – opening our (and our children's) bedroom windows is not an option.
2. By extending the opening hours the potential for disorder is considerable. Drunken rowdy behaviour including breaking glass has been a problem after turning out time. The thought of it happening at an even later time is intolerable.
3. The probable "honey pot" effect of being the late night haven in Lymington is frightening. The Police and Local Authority have brought Lymington back into control following The Black Cat fiasco, do you really want that all over again?

We trust that you will find these comments helpful and we would welcome the opportunity to discuss the matter further if required.

We sincerely hope that the application is not granted and that we can continue to live happily in the High Street.
