

Many thanks for your e-mail upon which I have taken instructions.

Principally the closest residential accommodation is a flat above a hairdresser next door. Our clients will liaise with the occupier from time to time to ensure that there is no noise nuisance.

At 2300 the video juke box will be turned down and a check made outside that the music cannot be clearly heard. The machine will also be placed on free play. This additionally places the entertainment in the category of unregulated entertainment as opposed to regulated entertainment under the Licensing Act 2003. As unregulated entertainment officially, as I understand it, it is beyond the control of environmental health.

I wish to emphasise that my clients do not wish to create a noise nuisance and that the equipment will be turned down at the appropriate time.

I hope the above clarifies the position and addresses the concerns that your

department has.

I note that you are acting for the applicants, Mr and Mrs Butler and I would be grateful for your clarification on a particular point.

Section F (Recorded music) of the application refers to the fact that music from a juke box will be played up until midnight on Sunday to Monday and 01:00 on Thursday through to Saturday, including Bank Holidays and New Year's Eve. You will have seen from this Authority's Licensing policy that after 23:00 the criteria for any amplified music is that it should be inaudible inside any noise sensitive premises ie residential property.

I would therefore be grateful for your confirmation that the Operating Schedule will be amended to reflect that after 23:00 the music noise levels from the juke box will be strictly controlled to ensure that music and vocals are not heard inside any noise sensitive premises. It would also be helpful if you could indicate what controls will be put in place to achieve this.

If at all possible I would be grateful if you could respond by Friday 19th August as

We write in reference to an application made by John Charles Butler and Lynda Butler of Butler's Bar & Grill (Royal Arms Hotel) Shaftesbury Street, Fordingbridge. Hampshire; for a variation to the Premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

This application requests that the hours for the sale of alcohol to be extended to the following:

0800 - 0000 Sunday - Wednesday 0800 - 0100 Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays, Public and Statutory Holidays and New Year's Eve plus 30 minutes drink up time;

The application also requests that regulated entertainment comprising recorded music and films (video juke box) between 0800 - 0100 Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays Public and Statutory Holidays and New Year's Eve.

Our home is adjacent to this public house and we have lived there for the past six years. We are a young family (our daughter is four years old) and we are expecting a second Child in the New Year. We appreciate that living in such close proximity to a public house and the centre of Fordingbridge does mean that a certain level of noise and disruption will take place during the peak times of usage at the local pubs.

Our concerns are that should these extended hours be granted the current noise levels and anti social behaviour will not just increase but the time in which these incidents occur will be prolonged and have a detrimental effect on our family's quality of life.

The proposal to extend opening hours to 0000 Sunday to Wednesday with drinking up time added to these hours extend this to 0030 and then the noise and disruption of people leaving the premises will go on until at least 0100. This in our opinion is inconsiderate when we have to get up at 0600 every morning and then go to our respective jobs on what could only be described as minimal sleep. The same applies for the proposal to extend to 0100 Thursday – Saturday including Public and Statutory Holidays. Fordingbridge is a small town where after 2300 there are no taxis, no nightclubs, no restaurants and more importantly no police to deal with the many people who stream out of the local pubs. We already have a problem with anti-social behaviour, swearing and fighting after pub closing time with no police to deal with

the existing problem let alone when there are more people with more alcohol in the early hours of the morning coming out of the pub. People stand outside our homes shouting and swearing once they have the left the pub and this can often lead to fighting. Who is going to deal with these public order issues when there are no police resources to dispatch to Fordingbridge?

Butlers has a large garden which is used until closing time, there are large iron gates which access this garden from the road, and these are adjacent to our house. The constant opening and closing of these gates and the noise levels from the garden users in late evening is already something of a nuisance which will obviously continue into the small hours and exacerbate if permission is granted.

The same issues of noise pollution and our quality of life apply with regards to the extension of the hours permitting recorded music to be played. Our houses are in such close proximity to the pub that music being played into the small hours will be as if we are playing it in our own homes. We will have no control whatsoever regarding the level of noise pollution created during this time by both customers and music, this will make our lives a misery.

To conclude, we most strongly object to the applications to extend these hours on the grounds that the additional noise will be detrimental to the immediate neighbours of the pub and our quality of life will be detrimentally affected.

I am writing to register a formal objection to the proposed extension of licensing hours for Butlers bar and Grill, 1 Shaftesbury Street, Fordingbridge, Hants. I am one of the many residents that live in close proximity to this pub.

This particular pub is already a particularly noisy one. It has a metal gate at it's side entrance that is very loud when it is opened and closed, and this seems to be done up until 2am in the morning on some nights. The music it plays is often clearly audible in our living room, bedroom and rear garden. If the proposed extensions are granted this will only get worse.

After 12am in Fordingbridge, there is no taxi service. There is also no police presence in Fordingbridge in the evenings. Having moved a few years ago from a city centre dwelling, I know all too well the impact that late night drinking has on one's living environment. There will be people of an intoxicated nature spilling on to the quiet streets of Fordingbridge being particularly loud, and with no means of getting home.

What then happens if a fight breaks out? Who then is responsible for breaking this up? Our home, as with many local businesses, is on the main street as you come out the pub. I for one will be particularly concerned about my front window being damaged or defaced, and I know I am not alone with this concern.

Fordingbridge offers an excellent quality of life, with a strong bias towards families. Indeed, both our neighbours have young children, and my wife and myself have discussed starting a family. The impact of late night disruption to young families is severe, and I for one would not bring up a young child in an area with a rowdy pub on one's doorstep – indeed, no sensible parent would. In short, we would have to consider leaving an area that we immensely enjoy living in.

I sincerely hope that you do not allow this application to be processed. I would appreciate being kept informed on its progress, as well as any feedback on this letter that you may have for me.
