Before the pub was refurbished approx eight years ago, we endured the misery of loud music performed in a hall at the rear of the premises.

We and several neighbours had to call the police on numerous occasions as due to the close proximity of the Coach and Horses, the music could be heard in our homes. The police eventually advised us to contact the noise abatement officer.

Decibel readings were taken on three separate occasions by two officials in the living room and bedroom with a third person taking readings from the Coach and Horses all were way too high.....and that was from inside a hall behind the pub!

Warnings were given to the then landlord Mr. John symes, the warnings were ignored and he was threatened with legal proceedings, we and two neighbours were asked if we would attend court as witnesses if there was a court case.

Mr. Symes then agreed not to hold anymore functions with music and shortly afterwards took early retirement and gave up the licence of the pub. Whitbreads then closed the pub and sold it.

We would like the Licensing Authority to take into account the following matters when considering an Application to vary the licence in respect of the above premises.

- l. Although it may appear we are some distance from the Coach and Horses, we are already affected by the sound of loud music, and the noise of car doors banging and engines revving, and frequent shouting and screaming coming from the Coach and Horses invariably late at night.
- 2. Southampton Road has, over the past few years, seen a substantial increase in the volume of traffic, and, being a relatively straight road, seem s to encourage excessive speeds. There have already been a number of serious accidents on this road including fatalities and the possibility of an increasing number of vehicles turning in and out onto this road at night when the drivers, or a good many of them, are likely to have consumed alcohol does not bear thinking about.
- 3.It is not "NIMBY ism" when we say that given the number of licensed outlets in Cadnam area, there are other premises where such objections would not stand up.
- 4. Given the number of licensed premises and having regard to the "drinking age" population of Cadnam, this application must be to attract people from outside the Cadnam area people who may well have no thought, concern or responsibility for the wellbeing of the local community or indeed their safety.
- 5. We can understand the commercial basis and thinking behind this application but believe it is the wrong premises in the wrong location making the wrong application.

SUBJECT: PROPOSED EXTENSION TO OPENING HOURS AT THE COACH AND HORSES PUBLIC HOUSE, SOUTHAMPTON ROAD CADNAM.

Dear Sir.

I feel I must write to object in the strongest possible terms to the extending of opening hours to the above public house.

As residents of Southampton road my family and I already have to suffer the noise and general rowdiness of the customers leaving the establishment at closing time every evening. The worst examples of this can be heard on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. To try to gain sleep at this time is impossible. The public nuisance caused by people leaving this place is already apparent. Often cars will leave very fast, as though on a racetrack. By the time they get to our house they are travelling well in excess of the 40 mph speed limit.

This raises concerns about public safety. Next door to my house is a row of terraced houses called Wellington Place. The only off road parking for these residents is on the grass verge opposite. As you may be aware, there is no street lighting outside these houses so the risk of a driver not being able to see pedestrians crossing is greatly increased. As things are, we tolerate the nuisance of this establishment. Even though we are sometimes tempted to complain to the licensee, we have refrained from doing so, as peace and tranquillity usually return about an hour after closing.

It is our understanding that the application is also to include the playing of music inside and outsides the premises.

We feel this would make life intolerable for ourselves and other residents of Southampton Road.

To summarise; if the proposed alterations to the existing licence were allowed to go ahead, the residents of Southampton Road would have to endure an unnecessary amount of inconvenience, particularly through noise being played to the early hours, but also through the added increase of danger to pedestrians crossing an unlit road in front of fatigued drivers having consumed an unknown amount of alcohol.

We trust our objections will be duly noted, and that we will be informed of any decision before the proposed licence is granted, to give us adequate time to take any further action necessary to prevent this proposal going ahead.
