

1. Apart from the 18 special functions per annum it should be noted that the proposed opening times are no different to those permitted at present. The premises have not given rise to problems of crime and disorder in the past whilst operated and controlled by the applicant and there have been no problems with children or harm suffered by children and this is not expected to change if the proposed variations are permitted.
2. There will be detailed staff training for all levels of staff on licensing and safety issues.
3. The existing CCTV system will be extended throughout the premises and all proposed improvements will be discussed with the Police.
4. Removal of glasses from the premises will be prohibited
5. Service of alcohol and the playing of music and the service of late night refreshment will cease half an hour before the premises finally close. This will give a drinking up and winding down period for customers which will generally ensure good order, freedom from noise and nuisance and contribute to public safety

**b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

1. The applicant will participate in any established Watch Scheme or other recognised scheme or body designed to secure effective liaison with the local police and/or local community.
2. The applicant will continue to operate a proof of age scheme which ensures that anyone seeking to purchase alcohol under age will be required to produce ID such as a passport or picture driving licence or other identification in accordance with the Portman Scheme.
3. The applicant will ensure that a personal licence holder is on duty at the premises during any extended hours granted as a result of the variation in opening hours applied for e.g. from midnight onwards.
4. No admissions will be allowed to the premises after 23.00 hours.
5. We will implement any measures agreed between ourselves and Responsible Authorities in writing, which will be notified to the Licensing Authority.

**c) Public safety**



1. In accordance with statutory requirements a risk assessment has been completed and this can be discussed with the Council before any varied activities applied for under the licence are undertaken. In particular the applicant will address any matters which are shown to need attention.
2. An evacuation plan will be developed and maintained which will be agreed with the Fire Officer and will be advised to all relevant members of staff.
3. Safe occupancy levels will be determined and suitable arrangements made to ensure that they are not exceeded.
4. There will be adequate safety for any indoor sports entertainment events that are conducted on the premises.
5. Adequate access will be maintained for emergency vehicles whilst the premises are open to the public.
6. We will implement any measures agreed between ourselves and Responsible Authorities in writing, which will be notified to the Licensing Authority.

**d) The prevention of public nuisance**

1. Prominent clear and legible notices will be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
2. Steps will be taken to ensure that the noise level from any provided entertainment shall not exceed an LAEQ of 40dB(A) as measured 1 metre from any residential building.
3. In order to ensure compliance with number 2 above the applicant will first agree with the Council the setting for noise limiters controlling the amplification equipment used on the premises. If that cannot by itself reduce noise levels externally to suitable levels then steps will be taken by way of sound insulation works.
4. A contact telephone number will be provided to adjoining noise sensitive premises so that if any complaints arise occupiers of such premises can be given the opportunity of speaking to management at the premises.
5. The applicant will arrange for licensed taxis or private hire vehicles to be available to take patrons from the premises whenever required.
6. The use of the external area for the sale and consumption of alcohol shall cease no later than 23.00 hours
7. We will implement any measures agreed between ourselves and Responsible Authorities in writing, which will be notified to the Licensing Authority.

**e) The protection of children from harm**

1. The general trend is for children to visit the property accompanied by a parent, guardian or responsible adult.
2. Children will be protected from harm by the measures already being carried out to ensure the service of alcohol does not take place to children under the age of 18.
3. The two all cash gaming machines on the premises are in the bar area which is closely supervised and no children are allowed to play on them.
4. No unaccompanied children under the age of 18 will be allowed to remain on the premises after 23.00 hours unless accompanied by a parent, guardian or responsible adult.
5. We will implement any measures agreed between ourselves and Responsible Authorities in writing, which will be notified to the Licensing Authority.


Please accept this letter as an objection to the licence extensions for the above premises under 'Prevention of Public Nuisance'.

My family and I live immediately next door to Chalkies. The reasons for my objections are as follows:

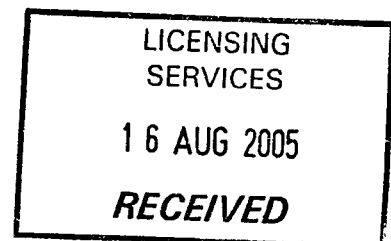
- The premises already hold weekly karaoke nights which result in a lot of noise as customers often leave well after midnight.

Later opening and music will encourage crime, there is a car showroom on the same plot and alarms are frequently going off, presumably customers messing around with the cars as they leave.

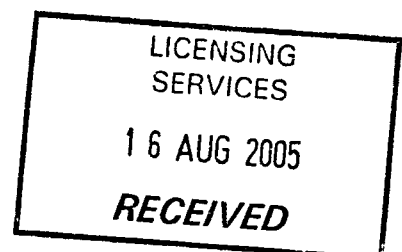
The access onto the A338 outside Chalkies is very dangerous, being on a corner, at the best of times, never mind in the early hours of the morning.

Chalkies is in the middle of a road of residential houses, all with families who want peace and quiet, especially at night.

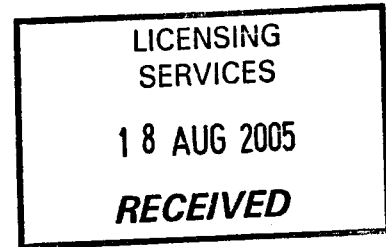

As a close neighbour of Chalkies Restaurant on the A338 at North Gorley, which is seeking conversion of its existing Licence under the Licensing Act 2003, I would like to register my objection to the application made by Mr White for additional permissions.

In 1989 I purchased my home with the understanding that the property, then called "The Open Country" was a restaurant/motel with opening hours that reflected that purpose and was willing to accept the level of activity that in day-to-day circumstances could be expected. I fear that a possible extension of activities into the early hours would result in unacceptable disruption.

I am greatly concerned about the noise and anti-social behaviour that the late departure of visitors to the property would create. Whilst we accept occasional rowdiness under the current system we definitely won't appreciate being woken in the middle of the night if 1.30 a.m. and 2 a.m. permissions are granted. Indeed any increase in the number of permitted late night events would without doubt add to the disruption of my family's rest. And, with the addition of the prolonged barking of the two dogs currently kept on Chalkies property you'll get some idea of why I have such worries about late departures.

**Therefore I would like to suggest the issue of a Successor Licence, wherein the current allowances are maintained and locked in for the future, would be more suitable.**

Furthermore, I would ask that the current status of the premises be confirmed. The signage outside of the property states that the business is now Chalkies "Pub" and "Cafe" and I assume that the status of Public House is not granted simply by calling it such. So, can you please confirm that New Forest District Council's perception of the property is still that of a restaurant/motel, and not a public house.

Many thanks for your help and I do appreciate that dealing with the current level of late applications is causing your department headaches, but I hope you can avoid similar symptoms here in North Gorley by making an appropriate decision.


**Amendment to Licensed Opening Hours - Chalkies Pub & Restaurant at Ringwood Road, North Gorley.**


