
There has been much trouble in the past & the police have records of this in connection with the Club.

We beseech you to take this golden opportunity to improve the quality of life of many town centre residents by refusing their request to serve large quantities of drink to mainly very young customers.



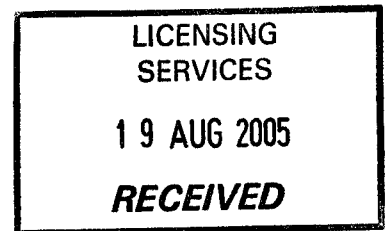

As residents of Station Road, we wish to object to the renewal of the drinks licence for the above premises.



People spitting out of the toilet windows.

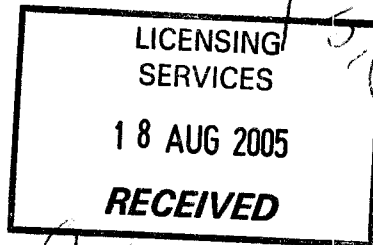
People hanging out of the toilet windows to talk/shout down their mobile phones.

My son's bike was stolen last wk, & was probably stolen by an opportunity drinker who saw it, & used it to fund his drug habit.

The music is so loud at times, that I can't hear my t.v. & my lounge is at the

back of my house away from
the club.

Since I've lived here, I've
noticed that the Club is
getting a lot noisier, attracting
all sorts of the wrong kind
of people I don't want near
my children.

My children can hear & see

a few of the incidents that

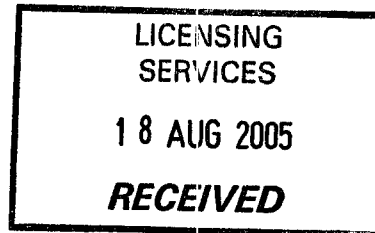

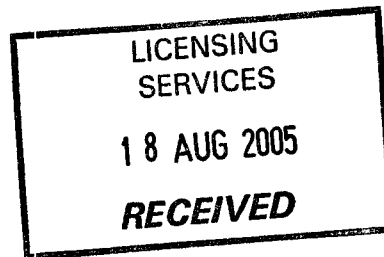


Having lived behind the club for numerous years, my daughter and I have had to endure the following:

- Cars parking in our car park spaces/in front of garages.

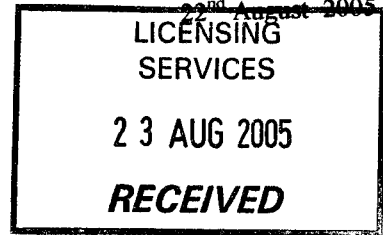
It is not an environment that I wish to put up with anymore for the sake of my child and the children around here and ask you to think very carefully when the licence comes up for renewal.

I write to you concerning the current licensing renewals required by the new Government legislation, in particular the application that will be submitted by the Snooker club situated in Station Road, New Milton, above Corals and the Card shop.

As a shop proprietor in Station Road I have personally suffered vandalism to my premises at night from the alcohol-fueled antics of the club members, as have many others over recent years. For your information most shop windows cost from £300 to £1500 to replace not to mention the increase in subsequent insurance premiums thereafter.

It is apparently not a high Police priority to maintain a presence in the area of the club at night, consequently very few if any of the perpetrators of the broken windows, damaged shop fronts, noise and fights, vomit, urine, beer cans and bottles are ever apprehended.

The solution perhaps is to refuse an alcohol license for these premises, or if this is impossible restrict the new license to include no increase in hours and/or CCTV cameras to the immediate exterior of the entrance of the club, with video recording.

This is common practice in Bournemouth clubs I believe.

The CCTV may at least provide some chance for these vandals to be caught.

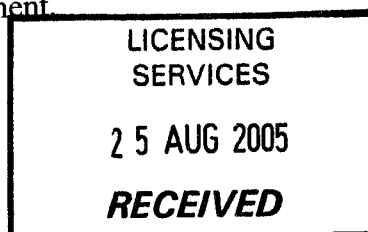
I am writing to voice my objections to the application of the above to vary the terms of the Premises Licence.

There has been trouble recently in the Town i.e. smashed windows, a break in at Boots the Chemist, incidents of building materials put in the road, (causing danger to traffic etc.). Of course, I do not say that all the trouble stems from the snooker hall but I believe it is true to say that some of the trouble has indeed come from the premises (from what I gather from others) I believe, in particular smashed windows.. Certainly, there has been a great deal of trouble in the past i.e. fighting in the street when the snooker hall turns out, a drug raid and certainly very loutish behaviour. At closing time I often and on many, many occasions witness people crawling in the road and urinating and vomiting. I do not know if there is a connection to the Club but on Monday 10.8.05 there was an ambulance and police car outside the Club.

Because of this situation, it is impossible to sleep in the summer with my window open which makes it unbearably hot and even then does not block out the noise. I have to be up to work early in the mornings as I have a business to run. If the Snooker Club is granted this Licence i.e. extra drinking time, and live music I really cannot see that I will be in any fit state to run a business at all for lack of sleep.

I am also concerned about the incidences of drug taking which I believe a neighbour has witnessed at the alley to the side of the Club, which incidentally is even at present full of smashed glass and vomit. As this is the only real entrance into my premises, I now feel it is unsafe to come home in the evenings even as it is. Again, I must make it clear that I do not state categorically that these troubles come from the Club.

I would like to point out that my mother has had to have medical treatment for depression and anxiety as a direct result of the problem and I do not think that even the worry of this is doing her much good at the moment.



In the light of my above comments, and the opposition voiced by other members of the surrounding area, I would respectfully ask that the request for the above variation to the terms of the Licence be turned down.

being on tenterhooks when the shouting starts. I am very concerned that the situation would worsen should the 24 hour financing come into force.

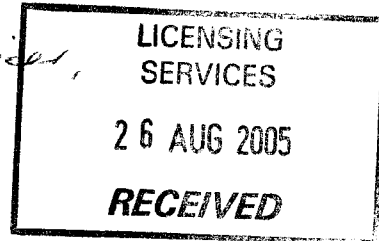

If the Rydal pub, and the Wellington in Osborne Road have also applied, this letter applies to them also.

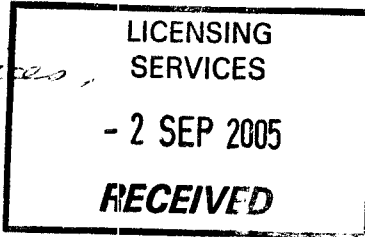
We need the people who sell alcohol to wake up to their responsibility, not make things worse.
