The premises supports the Portman Group Code of Practice on Naming, Packaging and Promotion of Alcoholic Drinks.

The club is a founder member of the Pubwatch scheme and plans to continue with this as long as it is in existence or notice is given to the Licensing Auhority.

The premises operate under a member's charter and rules. A copy of these rules can be supplied upon request.

Staff employed at the premises will be trained as appropriate to their duties to ensure that they appreciate the influence that they can have on the licensing objectives. This training will be refreshed as and when we feel is necessary, depending on the individual and the circumstances.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises operates a zero tolerance to drugs and notices will be maintained on display at appropriate locations throughout.

An access control system operates on the door, with a secure lobby between the upstairs and downstairs. This area is viewed by CCTV so that a decision can be made on admission.

No further steps are considered necessary at this point in time because of the variation, but we will undertake to implement any additional measures that are agreed in writing from time to time between the Police and ourselves and subsequently notified to the licensing authority.

c) Public safety

In relation to any licensed activity;

Fire and other risk assessments will be carried out in accordance with statutory provisions.

Copies of risk assessments will be requested from any sub-contractors.

Electrical systems will be designed and maintained in accordance with the Electricity at Work Regulations 1989 and regard will be had to the current codes of practice on electrical installations.

Adequate lighting will be maintained at all times to a level that will facilitate emergency egress from any licensed area.

An evacuation plan will be maintained, which will be advised to all relevant members of staff.

The property has comprehensive fire detection and warning systems, with detectors fitted in all rooms. Fire precautions measures, as indicated on the attached plan, will be kept in place unless otherwise agreed with the Fire Authority. Advice on occupancy figures will be sought from the Fire Authority as appropriate or retained at the existing capacity of 100

Fire detection and warning systems will be tested at regular intervals and a record of the test maintained in a log book. Firefighting equipment will be checked and serviced in accordance with manufacturers recommendations.

First aid provision will be made in accordance with statutory requirements.

When holding licensable activities, a sufficient number of staff will be engaged to assist in safe access and egress from the property. The number of staff required will be determined on a case-by-case basis in accordance with our risk assessment and the above guidance, depending on the nature and size of the event.

Sufficient quantities of water will be supplied free of charge whilst any regulated entertainment is provided. Soft drinks will always be available on sale whenever alcohol is also sold.

Where seating in rows is provided at any event, we will ensure that the recommendations of the "Yellow Guide" are followed, unless there is a reasonable reason for not doing so.

No further steps are considered necessary at this point in time because of the variation, but we will undertake to implement any additional measures that are agreed in writing from time to time between the Fire Service or Health & Safety Officer and ourselves and subsequently notified to the licensing authority.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

There is not believed to be any current problem in relation to public nuisance.

The existing dispersal policy will be maintained and a wind-down period of at least 30 minutes will be used to assist dispersion before the premises close.

The contact details of local public transport providers will be available at the premises.

Signage will be provided and management measures taken as appropriate to the circumstances

to encourage patrons to leave in a responsible manner.

Patrons will be discouraged from taking bottles and other glassware from the premises.

No rubbish, including bottles, will be moved or placed in outside areas between 23:00 and 07:00.

The hours of operation will be clearly indicated at the entrance to the premises.

No other steps are considered necessary at this time because of the variation applied for and because of the precautions that have already been taken, we are not aware of any existing problem. However, we will undertake to implement any further measures that are agreed in writing from time to time between the Environmental Health Officer and ourselves and subsequently notified to the licensing authority.

e) The protection of children from harm

If we believe that there is an activity which poses a particular and unacceptable risk to children, such as the showing of films rated above 12A, no admittance will be permitted for children to the area of that risk unless the risk can be reduced to a level that is reasonable. Access to such areas will be controlled by staff who will require identification from any person who appears to be a child, as per the sale of alcohol below.

Where videographic recordings are to be shown, children will only be admitted in accordance with the British Board of Film Classification rating or, in the case of recordings not rated by BBFC, where the recording has been made or previously broadcast with a view to being suitable for presentation to children (for example, a television programme that has previously been broadcast during the day before 21:00 or a sporting event).

Where it suspected that any person attempting to purchase alcohol is under 18, proof of age will normally be required. Acceptable identification will be by means of a passport, driving licence or other identification that is listed as acceptable in the Council's statement of Licensing Policy. Such a request will be in addition to any request for identification that is needed for entry.

No further steps are considered necessary at this point in time because of the variation, but we will undertake to implement any additional measures that are agreed in writing from time to time between the body responsible for advising on child protection and ourselves and subsequently notified to the ficensing authority.

Following consultation with the solicitor for the applicant, the following agreements have been made (see attached e-mails):

- Noise and vibration will not be allowed to emanate from the premises as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 2. There will be no situation where the premises will be open for a full 24hrs, but will open for specific sporting events and a short period of time before and after the event (unless overlapping with normal opening times permitted for the premises).

Despite these agreements, I do not believe the premises can operate in such a way that would not cause a public nuisance, bearing in mind the types and times of regulated entertainment requested and the close proximity of noise sensitive premises. As a result I am objecting to this application.

I still intend to work with the premises supervisor and solicitor for the applicant to reach an agreement. If a suitable agreement is reached this objection can be removed.

I write to you concerning the current licensing renewals required by the new Government legislation, in particular the application that will be submitted by the Snooker club situated in Station Road, New Milton, above Corals and the Card shop.

As a shop proprietor in Station Road I have personally suffered vandalism to my premises at night from the alcohol-fueled antics of the club members, as have many others over recent years. For your information most shop windows cost from £300 to £1500 to replace not to mention the increase in subsequent insurance premiums thereafter.

It is apparently not a high Police priority to maintain a presence in the area of the club at night, consequently very few if any of the perpetrators of the broken windows, damaged shop fronts, noise and fights, vomit, urine, beer cans and bottles are ever apprehended.

The solution perhaps is too refuse an alcohol license for these premises, or if this is impossible restrict the new license to include no increase in hours and/or cctv cameras to the immediate exterior of the entrance of the club, with video recording.

This is common practice in Bournemouth clubs I believe.

The cctv may at least provide some chance for these vandals to be caught.

I am writing to voice my objections to the application of the above to vary the terms of the Premises Licence.

There has been trouble recently in the Town i.e. smashed windows, a break in at Boots the Chemist, incidents of building materials put in the road, (causing danger to traffic etc.). Of course, I do not say that all the trouble stems from the snooker hall but I believe it is true to say that some of the trouble has indeed come from the premises (from what I gather from others) I believe, in particular smashed windows.. Certainly, there has been a great deal of trouble in the past i.e. fighting in the street when the snooker hall turns out, a drug raid and certainly very loutish behaviour. At closing time I often and on many, many occasions witness people crawling in the road and urinating and vomiting. I do not know if there is a connection to the Club but on Monday 10.8.05 there was an ambulance and police car outside the Club.

Because of this situation, it is impossible to sleep in the summer with my window open which makes it unbearably hot and even then does not block out the noise. I have to be up to work early in the mornings as I have a business to run. If the Snooker Club is granted this Licence i.e. extra drinking time, and live music I really cannot see that I will be in any fit state to run a business at all for lack of sleep.

I am also concerned about the incidences of drug taking which I believe a neighbour has witnessed at the alley to the side of the Club, which incidentally is even at present full of smashed glass and vomit. As this is the only real entrance into my premises, I now feel it is unsafe to come home in the evenings even as it is. Again, I must make it clear that I do not state categorically that these troubles come from the Club.

I would like to point out that my mother has had to have medical treatment for depression and anxiety as a direct result of the problem and I do not think that even the worry of this is doing her much good at the moment.
