The club has 3 Jackpot gaming machines, use of which is restricted to persons over 18 years old. Appropriate prohibition notices are posted adjacent to the machines located to the side of the main bar, surveillance of the machines is carried out by committee officers, committee persons, secretary, steward and bar staff.

No person under the age of 18 is allowed at the bar.

Proof of age and identifiction is requested by the Steward, Assistant Steward or the bar staff if age is in any doubt.

Children under the age of 16years old are not allowed in the snooker room, children of 16 and 17 are allowed in the snooker room if accompanied by an responsible adult. Prohibition notices to this effect are posted at the entrance of the snooker room.

O Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

CCTV surveillance with exterior lighting monitors arrivals and departures at the club main entrance and near car park area. Club management, steward, bar staff and secretary are informed of the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and statutory requirement to comply with all relevant provisions of the Act. Committee duty rota's are posted in the foyer, committee persons on duty are responsible and maintain order.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Club constitution includes rules governing the conduct of members and their guests within and adjacent to the club premises. Admission to the club is confined to members and bona fide guests and controlled through a computerised door entry system with the addition of a full time doorman at weekends. Guests arriving unaccompanied are scrutinised via CCTV before admission and signed in by a host member in the visitors book. Other CIU club membes are also scrutinised via CCTV before admission and sign in the CIU members book. The committee will consider disciplinary action under the clubs rules against members whom behave in a disorderly fashion. Delegated committee persons are on duty each weekend and are responsible for maintaining law and order. All committee officers/persons understand that they are also on duty whilst on club premises at any time.

c) Public safety

The club complies with Health and Safety and Fire Precautions regulations. Preventative control measures are in place to ensure the safety of membes, employees, guests, staff and entertainers whilst on club premises. The club complies with advised capacity limits (400 persons). Fire action notices and emergency routes are signposted. In the event of expected increase in numbers ie. Xmas and other populare times, additional door control measures are enforced by supervisory committee persons to assist the doorman. First aid supplies are regulary checked and updated. Fire alarm tests are regulary carried out and recorded. PAT testing certification of electrical items in force.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The duty committee officer/person and or Steward/Assistance Steward shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of any regulated entertainment.

All external doors and window shall be kept closed, other than for access and egress, when events involving live and/or amplified music/speech are taking place.

After 2300, music and noise emanating from the premises shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.

Prior to 2300, music and noise emanating from the premises whilst audible, is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any base beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.

Signage is displayed near exits requesting members and guests to respect the needs of local residents by quietly leaving the premises and car park.

e) The protection of children from harm

Persons under the age of 18 are only allowed in the club if accompanied by a responsible adult member. Door control ensure children seeking admisssion for any purpose are accompanied by an adult member. Young adults applying for membership must satisfy the committee that they are over 18. Committee members, club steward, secretary and other members of staff are instructed in the offence provisions of the licensing Act 2003 relating to alcohol and protection of children. Signage is posted at all bars prohibiting the direct or indirect supply of alcohol to children. Proof of age (i.e photo id) is requested by any bar staff if they are in any doubt of age. Adult supervision is required at all times for under 18's in all areas when on club premises.

To whom it may concern,

I am writing to oppose the application to increase licensing hours for the Testwood Workingman's Club in Salisbury Road Totton.

As the direct neighbour to the club for the last fourteen years, my wife and I feel there are some issues that need to be considered and bought to your attention prior to decision making on the above application.

The Club has applied to increase their licensing hours to 1 a.m. some fifteen times in the calendar year. This would calculate to more than once per month. Add twenty minutes 'drinking up' time to 1 a.m. and you would be looking more towards 1.30 a.m. before people start their way home. Even later, should there be people waiting for taxis.

The Club has a large car park where customers congregate after vacating the premises at the usual 23.30 hours. Groups of people can be heard shouting and laughing, car doors slamming and occasional fights have even broke out at this time. In the winter months customers of the club are outside some ten to twenty minutes after closing hours, revving their car engines and trying to defrost windscreens. This we have accepted as neighbours to the Club, however, we do feel this would be unacceptable at 01.30 in the morning on a regular basis.

Occasionally, fighting outside the Club after closing time has required visits from the police. Arguments and disagreements are certainly alcohol fuelled, and can take some time for the police to resume calm and order. Again we feel this is not acceptable in the early morning hours, in a residential area and would more than likely increase in regularity with longer drinking hours available to 1 a.m.

Finally, we are concerned that should we ever wish to sell our house, the increase in licensing hours would not be particularly attractive to prospective buyers. It could produce a damaging effect for selling potential, not only for us, but for other home owners also.
