We are a national retailer that sells alcohol as part of a broad offering of goods and services. We have held off-licenses in our stores for many years and are an approved British Institute of Ink-keeping examination centre. We have written training policies and formal training programmes are in place, which ensure our people are equipped to meet all licensing objectives. All training and revision/refresher materials are reviewed regularly and are currently being rewritten to reflect the requirements of the new Act. We have introduced our 'Think 21' policy to all of our stores in July 2004, this policy is brought to customers' attention through point of sale material at the checkout and wherever alcohol is displayed for sale. We take legal compliance very seriously and in addition to local training we employ a central alcohol licensing compliance manager and have a compliance committee. All the measures that we currently have in place during licensed hours would continue to be in place during any addition hours that alcohol would be sold in the store.



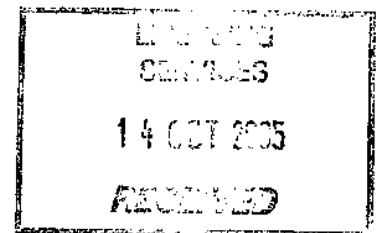


Application for New Premises Licence – Tesco, 61 Old Milton Road, New Milton

We, as residents in the immediate vicinity of the Tesco Express shop in Old Milton Road, wish to object to the granting of the above licence for the extended period daily on the ground that it will be reverting to a former situation when the sale of alcohol at the One Stop shop resulted in our road and gardens being constantly littered with discarded empty cans and bottles.

Since the opening of the present store with a shorter licence coinciding with the shop being open we have noted with satisfaction that the litter has been minimal, and the noise level late at night almost negligible.

We would have thought that 7am. to 10pm. would have been sufficient time for customers to purchase their drinks needs, and the extension would only open the way to drinking in the streets and roads around here – particularly amongst the under-aged resulting inevitably in the call for police patrolling in the area, as has been the case in the past.

I was very disturbed to learn that Tesco Express have applied for an extension of their licencing hours in their shop in Old Milton Road.

As a long term resident in the area I have seen and experienced the results of the sale of alcohol from the shop in the past, when sales of drinks were possible 24 hours. Littering of cans and bottles in the road and in my garden was commonplace, and damage was caused by crab apples from the tree in the road smashing panes in my greenhouse.

Since the arrival of Tesco and controlled sale of alcohol to opening hours things have been quieter, but I can only wonder what the effects will be if sales of drinks continue until midnight, The younger element will have unhindered access to drinks which could result in binge drinking in this area where the presence of the police is a rare sight.

I hope you will bear in mind the concerns of the elderly population in this area when the application is considered.

Ref. Application for License for Sale of Alcohol at 61 Old Milton Road, New Milton, Hants.

Having seen a public notice of the above application we object to any sales taking place after 10 p.m. and before 7 a.m. at 61 Old Milton Road and to the granting of any license to sell alcohol at these premises after 10 p.m. and before 7 a.m. on the following grounds:-

1. Prevention of crime & disorder.

(i) Previous opening after 10 p.m. resulted in aggravated noise and much anti-social behaviour outside the shop, which the police found it difficult to control.

(ii) During the time the shop was open after 10 p.m. fires occurred at night outside properties in the vicinity. As there have been no outside fires in the vicinity for the last two years or more it would seem that the 10 p.m. closing time has discouraged potential criminals from loitering in the vicinity of the shop.

We have no wish to experience such criminal and disorderly situations again.

2. Prevention of public nuisance.

(i) A significant number of the shop's existing customers arrive and depart by car. During the day, the noise of slammed vehicle doors, car radios and accelerating engines is absorbed in the general traffic noise. This is not the case at night and such noises will interrupt the sleep of occupants of properties in Old Milton Road and the adjacent feeder roads of Crossmead Avenue, Gore Road and Wessex Avenue.

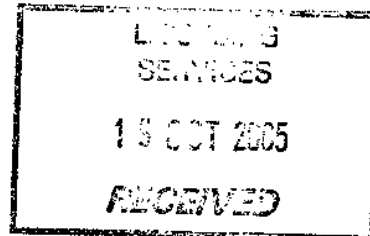

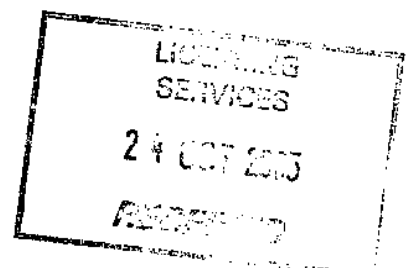
This is an area with mainly old people - many of which will be frightened and upset when these youngsters get out of hand.

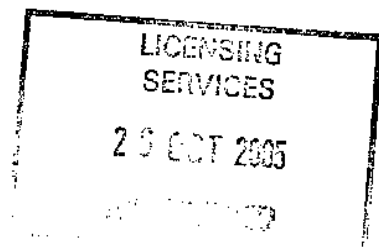
I wish to make the stongest objection to Tesco Express's application to extend the hours of the sale for alcohol under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
