Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Where licence authorises supply of alcohol:

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Q) Proposals by the applicant in order to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

The application included an extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises to give the option to allow for a more gradual dispersal of customers. The style and operation of the pub will not differ significantly during the extended hours. Where this is appropriate, non-alcoholic refreshment will be available in the extended period.

The premises will respect Spirit Group's Approach to Responsible Drinking. The Spirit Group's policies change at regular intervals to reflect current trends and it would be inappropriate to standardise them on a permanent basis.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The Spirit Group are introducing Security Industry Authority (SIA) approved door supervisors across their estate, in line with the Government approved implementation plan.

A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will be enforced at all times.

If a disc jockey is used on any night then he/she will ask customers to leave quietly.

If a CCTV system is installed at this site, it will continue to operate during the additional hours of trading and notices will be displayed.

All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the police and will be kept in an incident log book.

c) Public Safety

Public safety is integral to the way that the Spirit Group runs its business and is reviewed regularly through their health and safety policy. This policy is fully briefed and trained to all management and staff and the Spirit Group will continue to train their staff to the standards required by relevant legislation.

Free drinking water will be available at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Additional patrols will take place by members of staff, internally and externally, to limit any noise pollution when entertainment is being offered within the premises.

If appropriate, notices will be displayed asking customers to respect neighbours when leaving the premises.

Where already used text/radio pagers will continue to be used for the additional hours of trading and will be monitored by a responsible member of staff.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic refreshment will be available if it is decided to use the option to stay open for an extended period between the cessation of the supply of alcohol and the closure of the premises (see above under General).

e) The protection of children from harm

When children are allowed upon the premises, any entertainment offered within the premises will be suitable for young persons.

Children will be required to be supervised by the accompanying adult at all times.

A no smoking area will be provided.

Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks will be available.

A recognised Proof of Age Policy will be enforced.

The licensee may also provide and permit:

Permitted Hours

Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, consumed in or taken from the premises except during permitted hours. In this condition permitted hours means those as shown in Part 1 of this Licence:

- a) On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10am to 11pm
- b) On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30pm
- c) On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30pm
- d) On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3pm and 7pm to 10.30pm
- e) On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 10am to 11pm
- f) On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30pm
- g) On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

Restrictions

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- d) Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises:
- The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- f) The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- g) The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- j) The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of alcohol so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.





Alleged Noise Nuisance from the Function Room at the Vine Inn, Romsey Road, Ower.

Further to our discussions before Christmas, we are continuing to receive noise complaints with regards functions being held in the function room. The complaints relate to noise from amplified music and amplified voices. The latest disturbance was from the function held on the evening of the 4th February (between 8pm and Midnight).

Should a statutory nuisance be witnessed then a further notice will be served under the Environmental Protection Act. I would urge you to take steps to reduce the noise levels from activities in the function room to a level that do not cause a nuisance to your neighbours. In addition, I would strongly advise you to revisit the conditions of your licence to ensure that you are complying with the conditions relating to noise.

The Vine Inn, Ower, Hampshire

During the run up to the Christmas period noise complaints were received from people living in the vicinity of the premises. These were investigated by officers from the Council Noise Pollution Service and a Noise Abatement Notice issued. Complaints of excessive noise from the premises continue to be made, the latest disturbances following a function held on 4 February 2006, between 8 pm and midnight.

The Senior Environmental Health Officer has written to your local manager, who, incidentally, is the nominated Designated Premises Supervisor, urging him to take appropriate steps to reduce the noise levels to a level which do not cause a nuisance to the neighbours. He has also been informed of the action which will be taken under the Environmental Protection Act should a statutory nuisance be witnessed.

I would also draw to your attention that there are conditions attached to the Premises Licence which specifically prohibit the premises causing a noise nuisance and that any noise emanating from the premises after 23.00 hrs shall be inaudible at the boundary of noise sensitive premises, as described on the noise map attached to the licence.

In view of the foregoing I would strongly suggest that as a matter of urgency you conduct a full review of the management of the licensable activities carried out at the and take such steps as you consider will ensure that local people are not unduly disturbed by those activities and that the licence conditions are adhered to at all times.

There have been many other functions that have been subject of complaint to both Environmental Health and the Police.

Both The Vine and The Sprit Group are well aware of the problems the functions cause.

Numerous attempts have been made by myself and other owners of neighbouring properties to The Vine and The Spirit Group in an attempt to resolve the problem. These attempts have been unsuccessful.

I have the full support of all the neighbouring properties that are affected. They are prepared to provide statements or attend the Board if necessary.

This review application was prepared and held as I was contacted by John Haswell from Spirit Group. He assured me that there were works that could be completed to rectify the situation.

I have been in regular contact with John Haswell as the noise nuisance still persisted.

Since the works there have been times when we are aware that there is a function as we can still hear it, but it has not been audible over our TV.

However on Friday 9th September the noise was heard in every room in our house. It continued until 1am.

It is clear that despite the works and assurances from The Vine and Spirit Group the situation will not resolve until the functions are stopped altogether.

The procedures allow for 'mediation' between parties – it would appear that the solicitors acting for the Vine Inn are looking to find common ground.

If you wish to meet with them to discuss an amicable solution then it is allowed in legislation which if successful can avoid the need for a review hearing. It would probably be advisable to discuss a solution – if you are not happy with what is offered the hearing can still go ahead. If you do not try mediation it could be alleged that no 'olive branch' was offered but not accepted.

The decision to meet with the solicitors is yours alone — if you do decide to meet we are quite happy to chair the meeting and act as mediator but it would need to be done sooner rather than later

REVIEW CONSULTATION

I should be pleased if you will assess the application and, if after due consideration, you wish to make representation you must advise the Council of the details of that representation by no later than 10/10/2006.

Response:

A noise abatement notice was served on the Vine Inn under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 on the 24th April 2006. The notice required them to abate the music noise coming from the function room. It should be noted that the level of music noise observed by us to serve an abatement notice was in excess of the music noise levels required to comply with the current license conditions. This abatement notice is still in force.

Following this notice, works have been undertaken by the Vine Inn to reduce the noise impact. This has included structural works as well as fitting a noise limiter.

The level of the new noise limiter has been set, in consultation with this authority. The noise level set is intended to minimise disturbance to residents up to 2300. After 2300 the premises have to manually reduce the noise levels to comply with their current license conditions.

Since the level of the noise limiter has been set, there have been two events. Following the first event we received a complaint about the music noise levels from the Vine Inn after 2300. We undertook monitoring from the second event on the 6th October. The noise at the second event, for the time that we monitored was acceptable prior to and after 2300. However, we did receive a complaint about the music noise level after 2315, which was after we had left the site.

In light of the continuing concerns with regards to the music noise levels after 2300 we would like the committee to consider the following two sets of conditions:

- 1. Prior to 2300, music noise emanating from the premises whilst audible, is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any base beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises*.
- 2. Any amplified, live or recorded music (other than that played as background music) and any facilities provided for making amplified music shall be controlled through tamper proof noise limiting equipment which must be approved by the Environmental Health Officer of New Forest District Council (EHO) and set at a level to be approved by the EHO and maintained at such a level.
- 3. No amplified music and speech shall be played at the premises at any higher level than that approved by the EHO.
- 4. That no regulated entertainment shall be permitted after 2300.

NB. The reason for these conditions is that we are satisfied that the premises can currently comply with this condition up to 2300 but still have concerns with the music noise levels after 2300.

<u>Or</u>

If regulated entertainment is to be permitted after 2300 then:

- At all times when regulated entertainment is permitted music noise emanating from the premises prior to 2300, whilst audible, is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any base beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises*.
- 2. After 2300 music noise shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises*.
- 3. That any amplified, live or recorded music (other than that played as background music) and any facilities provided for making amplified music shall be controlled through tamper proof noise limiting equipment which must be approved by the Environmental Health Officer of New Forest District Council (EHO) and set at a level to be approved by the EHO and maintained at such a level.
- 4. No amplified music and speech shall be played at the premises at any higher level than that approved by the EHO.
- 5. The (re)setting of the noise limiter, shall be undertaken **before** any regulated entertainment is permitted after 2300.

N.B The imposition of the latter set of conditions would mean that the Local Authority would set one level for the sound limiter to operate at before and after 2300. We would have to revisit the premises to reset this level, something that we are happy to do. In addition this level could be reset by us in the event that further insulation works etc. are completed.

*(Noise sensitive premises includes premises use for residential purposes, hospitals or similar institutions, educational establishments (when in use), or places of worship (during recognised times and days of worship) or any premises used for any other purpose likely to be affected by the music noise.)
