No new steps have been identified in relation to the four licensing objectives save as below.
Existing CCTV system will cover arrivals and departures at the club including key parts of main car park
Committee's duty rota will be available at the premises.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

1. Admission to the premises will be in accordance with the club constitution.
2. Admission to the premises will be restricted to members of the club, their bone fide guests and persons attending a pre booked conference event of occasion at the premises.
3. Bone fide guests will be signed in to an entry book
4. The premises shall maintain a door entry system which controls entry to the premises
5. The premises shall maintain its existing CCTV system in good operational condition
6. Members behaving in a disorderly fashion or contrary to the club rules may be excluded from the premises or subject to disciplinary action.
7. At least one Committee member shall be rostered on duty at weekends in addition to other members of staff

c) Public safety

1. The club operates risk assessments and preventative control measures for the safety and protection of persons on the premises
2. Management are aware of and will maintain advisory capacity limits.
3. Emergency escape routes and equipment will be maintained in good operating order
4. The club may employ stewards to carry out duties inside the premises relating to safety and good order.
5. First aid equipment is maintained in sufficient quantities and regular testing of safety equipment is carried out

d) The prevention of public nuisance

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. Earlier finishing times for the most noise intrusive activities will promote staggered leaving times from the premises to ensure minimum disturbance to neighbours
2. From 23:30 recorded music volumes and music styles shall be selected to minimise noise breakout and promote the quiet and orderly dispersal of patrons
3. Staff shall take steps to remind patrons to respect the interests of neighbours when leaving. Signage will be displayed as appropriate.
4. If a DJ is present they shall make regular announcements towards the end of the evening requesting patrons to minimise noise levels
5. Customers will be encouraged not to use external areas after 23:00 other than for the purpose of smoking, and then to minimise periods outside where possible.
6. Signage shall be displayed requesting customers not to take food or drink outside after 23:00.
7. Staff will patrol external areas after 23:00 as appropriate

e) The protection of children from harm

1. Persons under the age of 18 years shall only be admitted if accompanied by an adult
2. Applicants for membership will need to satisfy the club that they are aged 18 years or over before they shall be members
3. Suitable training and signage will be available informing staff and customers of the policies in place for preventing unauthorised sale/supply of alcohol
4. There will be a suitable proof of age scheme operating at the premises

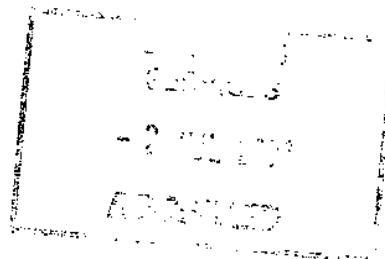

Dear Sirs,

As one of the closest Properties to the Testwood club I am very shocked by the clubs application for longer opening hours, from what I can see they would like to open till 11.30 in the week (+30 mins), till 11pm Sundays (+ 30 mins) and 12.30 on Fridays, Saturdays and the day prior to bank holidays (+ 1 hour) also till 1pm on agreed extensions (+1.5 hours).

I note you mention that the club closing time would be 30 mins after these times. Well to start with it would be nice if the club did close 30 mins after its current times, the average closing time would I suggest be nearer to an hour after last orders if not more. To allow the club to sell alcohol till 12. 30 and close 30 mins later which will be more like one hour later (1.30am) is ridiculous in a residential area and I strongly protest this application.

In the last couple of years the club has become more rowdy with fights attended by the police outside the clubhouse and my house, with the committee members also fighting among its self outside the club.

The club has also taken to arranging card games which are played for with chips but in reality this related to monetary gain, I did not think that the club was licensed for such gaming activities?

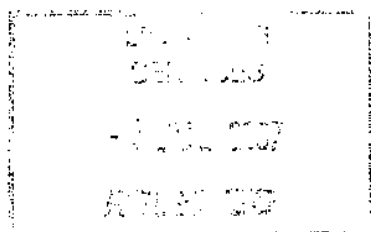
The recent new influx of members to the club is also causing parking problems in Testwood lane outside our house to the point we cannot get in and out of our drive in Testwood lane, due to the new members not using the car park at the club. This would also give the emergency services a problem to get through as the cars are parked on both sides of Testwood lane outside the club and our property.

Hope this letter highlights some of the problems that will increase if the Testwood club is granted longer opening hours.

.. Where the Club Premises Certificate Authorises the Supply of Alcohol for Consumption Off the Premises

- (a) A club premises certificate may not authorise the supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises unless it also authorises the supply of alcohol to a member of the club for consumption on those premises.
- (b) The supply must be made at a time when the premises are open for the purposes of supplying alcohol, in accordance with the club premises certificate, to members of the club for consumption on the premises.
- (c) Any alcohol supplied for consumption off the premises must be in a sealed container.
- (d) Any supply of alcohol for consumption off the premises must be made to a member of the club in person.

2. Where the Club Premises Certificate Authorises the Exhibition of Films

- (a) Where the film classification body is specified in the certificate, unless subsection (b)(ii) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body
- (b) Where –
 - (i) the film classification body is not specified in the certificate, or
 - (ii) the relevant licensing authority has notified the club which holds the certificate that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

- (c) In this section –

“children” means persons aged under 18; and

“film classification body” means the person or persons designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification)

Where licence authorises door supervision:

- (1) Each individual at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires this condition to be imposed:
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

O) Proposals by the applicant in order to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

CCTV surveillance with exterior lighting monitors arrivals and departures at the club main entrance and near the car park area. Club management, steward, bar staff and secretary are informed of the Licensing Act 2003 objectives and statutory requirement to comply with all relevant provisions of the Act. Committee duty rota's are posted in the foyer, committee persons on duty are responsible and maintain order.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Club constitution includes rules governing the conduct of members and their guests within and adjacent to the club premises. Admission to the club is confined to members and bona fide guests and controlled through a computerised door entry system with the addition of a full-time doorman at weekends. Guests arriving unaccompanied are scrutinised via CCTV before admission and signed in by a host member in the visitors' book. Other CIU members are also scrutinised via CCTV before admission and sign in the CIU members book. The committee will consider disciplinary action under the clubs rules against members whom behave in a disorderly fashion. Delegated committee persons are on duty each weekend and are responsible for maintaining law and order. All committee officers/persons understand that they are also on duty whilst on club premises at any time.

Public Safety

The club complies with Health & Safety and Fire Precautions regulations. Preventative control measures are in place to ensure the safety of members, employees, guests, staff and entertainers whilst on club premises. The club complies with advised capacity limits. Fire action notices and emergency routes are signposted. In the event of expected increase in numbers, i.e. Christmas and other popular times, additional door control measures are enforced by supervisory committee persons to assist the doorman. First aid supplies are regularly checked and updated. Fire alarm tests are regularly carried out and recorded. PAT testing certification of electrical items is undertaken.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The duty committee officer/person and or steward/assistant steward receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of any regulated entertainment.

All external doors and window will be kept closed, other than for access and egress, when events involving live and/or amplified music/speech are taking place.

After 23:00 hours music and noise emanating from the premises shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.

Prior to 23:00 hours music and noise emanating from the premises whilst audible, is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any base beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.

Signage is displayed near exits requesting members and guests to respect the needs of local residents by quietly leaving the premises and car park.

e) The protection of children from harm

Persons under the age of 18 are only allowed in the club if accompanied by a responsible adult member. Door controls ensure children seeking admission for any purpose are accompanied by an adult member. Young adults applying for membership must satisfy the committee that they are over 18. Committee members, club steward, secretary and other members of staff are instructed in the offence provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to alcohol and protection of children. Signage is posted at all bars prohibiting the direct or indirect supply of alcohol to children. Proof of age (i.e. photo ID) is requested by any bar staff if they are in any doubt of age. Adult supervision is required at all times for under 18's in all areas when on club premises.

N) Adult Entertainment/Services

Adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainments or matters ancillary to the use of premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children are:

The club has 3 jackpot gaming machines, use of which is restricted to persons over 18 years old. Appropriate prohibition notices are posted adjacent to the machines located to the side of the main bar, surveillance of the machines is carried out by committee officers, committee persons, secretary, steward and bar staff.

No person under the age of 18 is allowed at the bar. Proof of age and identification is requested by the steward, assistant steward or the bar staff if age is in any doubt.

Children under the age of 16 years old are not allowed in the snooker room, children of 16 and 17 are allowed in the snooker room if accompanied by a responsible adult. Prohibition notices to this effect are posted at the entrance of the snooker room.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions within and outside the premises requiring patrons to leave quietly and respect local residents.
2. The duty Committee Officer/person and or Steward/Assistant Steward shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of any regulated entertainment.
3. All external doors and windows shall be kept closed, other than for the purposes of access and egress, when events involving live and or amplified music (including amplified speech) are taking place.
4. After 23:00 hours music and noise emanating from inside the premises shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.*
5. Prior to 23:00 hours, music and noise emanating from the premises (both outdoors and indoors) if audible, shall be at such a level that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any base beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.*

* For the purposes of conditions 4 and 5 above, noise sensitive premises shall include premises used for residential purposes, hospitals or similar institutions, educational establishments (when in use), places of worship (during recognised times and days of worship) and any other premises used for any other purpose likely to be affected by the music noise.
