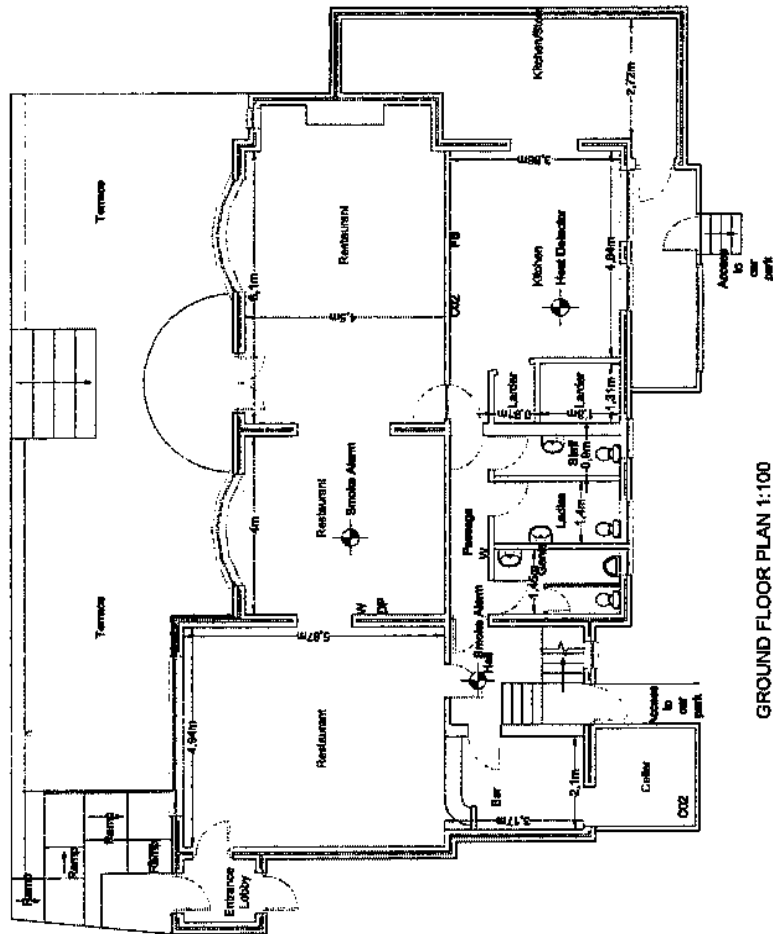

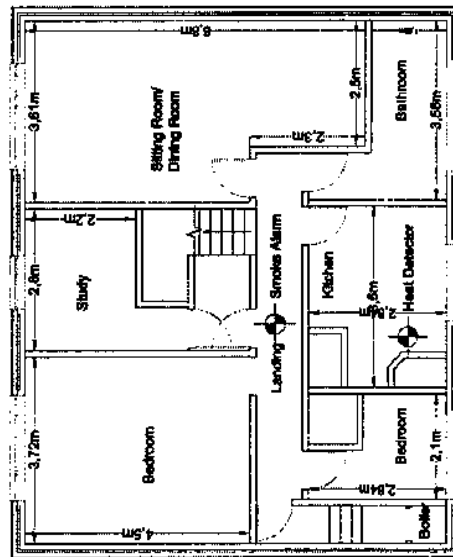

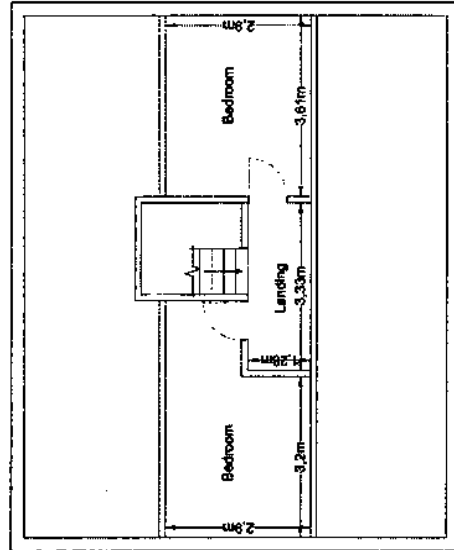

Hampshire Constabulary have no objections to the granting of a premises licence at Britannia Thai Indian Cuisine, 1 High St, Milford on Sea. An agreement has been made that the following conditions will be added to the new premises licence;

① Any CCTV should be installed and maintained at the premises to the satisfaction of the Police. As a minimum it shall enable surveillance of both internal and external areas of the premises including all entrances and exits. 

As the direct neighbour to this proposed Indian Restaurant, and being a distance of some 5m from the property, and with three bedrooms directly facing this restaurant, I object strongly to the granting of the above for these reasons:

#### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

This village is renowned for its quiet character and Barnes Lane in particular is a quiet residential area. This restaurant being the first commercial property in the High Street is surrounded by residential properties. I have been a resident in Mirik for 18 years and have witnessed the restaurant closing at 10.30pm regularly as residents in Milford-on-Sea are quiet by nature and generally retire to bed by 10.30pm.

To allow this license to extend to 11.30pm will mean that this restaurant will effectively be open until the early hours of the morning. These licensing hours will only attract people who will want late night drink and an Indian meal, after leaving the pub. The unacceptable noise nuisance caused by people, who regard loud behaviour, general drunkenness, being out late at night and destroying property, is a fun night out for them. As we have no immediate police response as Winchester is now the emergency centre, I don't see how I can protect myself.

One High Street has been sold by Michelle's Letting Agents as a restaurant with customer parking at the rear. This is a blatant lie and has been decisive in selling this lease to the new leaseholder. Having spoken to the leaseholder myself on Sunday afternoon, 20<sup>th</sup> January, he is insistent that the rear of the property will be used for customer parking and take-away trade. #### **Public Safety**







- Food and Drink License until 23.30pm 7 days a week
- Music License until 23.30pm 7 days a week

As the direct neighbour to this proposed Indian\Thai Restaurant, and being a distance of some 5m from the property, and with three bedrooms directly facing this restaurant, I object strongly to the granting of the license above for these reasons:

#### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

This village is renowned for its quiet character and Barnes Lane in particular is a quiet residential area. This restaurant being the first commercial property in the High Street is surrounded by residential properties. I have been a resident in Mirik for 18 years and have witnessed the restaurant closing at 10.30pm regularly as residents in Milford-on-Sea are quiet by nature and generally retire to bed by 10.30pm.

To allow this license to extend to 11.30pm will mean that this restaurant will effectively be open until the early hours of the morning. These licensing hours will only attract people who will want late night drink and an Indian meal, after leaving the pub. The unacceptable noise nuisance caused by people, who regard loud behaviour, general drunkenness and being out late at night is totally unacceptable.

The shared private driveway that provides access to the rear of the restaurant is also shared by six adjoining properties. We all have right of way access. My house deeds refer to Milford Lodge as the freeholder of the driveway; therefore it cannot be used for a commercial business with regards customer parking or take-away trade.

#### **Public Safety**

Since this restaurant has been closed for three years, the parking spaces in the front of One High Street are now to full capacity. In front of my house, Mirik, there are double yellow lines. At night people regularly park in this restricted area and also on Park Lane by Danes stream hump back bridge. Customers stopping by for a take-away meal will cause more problems and possible traffic accidents.


#### **Environmental Issues**

The driveway is narrow, only 9 ft wide, therefore large waste disposal trucks cannot reverse up the road without destroying my trees, shrubs and land. Already building has started on the property without planning permission, and the verges of the drive damaged by developer's vehicles. This property lies within a conservation area and yet there appears to be no enforcement officer or NFDC building inspectors around to ensure that the environment and residential properties are protected.

I would like to draw your attention to the other Indian Restaurant (Zaika), which is situated at the other end of the village. Local residents have complained about, noise, late night opening (1.00am), over loaded waste bins, odour of curry smells and other fumes that permeate the area. Having seen the back of this restaurant myself, I notice a large unsightly extractor unit, air conditioning unit none of which appear to have planning permission as the planning application is still in the window which lists these items has not been granted.

Therefore as a council rate payer living in a residential area I will expect these issues to be addressed by your enforcement officer and police if necessary.

Thank you for the reminder.

I object on all counts as the hours are too generous, albeit they are those of the restaurant further on.

People who live in the area are complaining on all counts as there are already cooking and refuse smells, parking problems. Moreover, the late closure and the proposed take-away business is going to attract more parking problems, drunkenness, noise and disturbance. Children will be kept awake as a result and the extractor fans and air conditioning plant are not exactly quiet for anyone.

Milford Parish Council Planning has considered the licence application for this reactivated restaurant and found it difficult to ignore the precedent set by the Indian restaurant a few doors away whose ownership is also said to be in the same family.

So it is a difficult one. But there was a consensus to cutting the opening times back to 1100 pm. This would need to apply, presumably, to the existing Indian restaurant's
