## General Description

General description of premises:-

Unit 3 is part of a two storey building situated on the industrial site of Berthon Boat Yard. It is one of four, ground floor, lock up units. The units run parallel to, but lie back from Bath Road. To the front of the unit is a paved area, which is suitable for a table and four chairs (but will not be used as such).

The rear of the unit is a paved area leading on to Berthon Boat Yard, which is gravel. This area is where cars will be parked, but trade is expected to come from the yachtsman, rather than the motorists.

The unit itself is contained.

There will be a front door and rear door for entering and exiting. On entering the front the kitchen, food preparation area, will be in the far right-hand corner. With a general "bar" and seating for people to be served at. The consumption of alcohol and hot and cold food will be within the unit and outside at the rear of the unit in the smoking area. Off sales will be sealed containers only. There will be Summer variations in that there will be approximately six private functions to be held at the back of the unit in the gravel area, with music that may be live, or recorded, and will be contained in a marquee. Alcohol will be purchased from the unit and consumed in outside smoking area and in marquee during these variations.

The unit's toilet and washing facilities are accessible from the outside of the unit.

The unit is presently undergoing total refurbishment and the Applicant invites the relevant authorities to make recommendations regarding the siting of smoke detectors, fire extinguishers and safety precautions.





I have taken a look at the premises licence for Fine Food and Wine 4 Sale, Unit 3 Anchor House, Bath Road, Lymington. Unfortunately I do not have a map of the premises so I am unable to see where the alcohol is to be stored. I recommed the following to be added to the premises licence;

Any CCTV should be installed and maintained at the premises to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and Police. As a minimum it shall enable surveillance of both internal and external areas of the premises including all entrances and exits. Recordings from the system shall be to a standard acceptable as evidence in a court of law and shall be securely retained for a minimum of 30 days. The recording shall be surrendered in a playable format to Hampshire Constabulary or the Licensing Authority immediately on request.

The premises will operate the 'Challenge 21' Scheme, posters will be displayed to this effect in prominent positions at the premises. All staff will be trained to challenge any young person(s) attempting to purchase alcohol. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person

The Internal door leading to storage area should be a solid core door, which should be fitted with a 5 lever mortice lock BS3621or better and hinge bolts. The framework of the door itself must be strengthened to avoid the door being forced from its frame. LPS1175 is the standard for security doors within licensed premises.


A Lockable cage should be installed to store all alcoholic beverages, the design of the cage should be a solid construction either fitted securely to the walls or floor of the building. The locking mechanism should be a close shackled padlock which will prevent bolt croppers being used.

The window located at the rear of the garage to be fitted with internal bars with a central cross bar, the frame must be grouted into the masonry and not flush with the internal wall of the garage

We have no objection to the sale of alcohol either alongside the purchase of food to be taken away or as part of a meal to be consumed on the premises .

However we would object to the long opening hours proposed and would suggest that 700pm would be a reasonable time to close. A late night bar in these premises would, in our opinion, be undesirable. There is, in fact, very little room outside the premises and this could well lead to people spilling on to the road to be a danger to themselves and others. The confined area would undoubtedly have the potential to be very noisy. There are already a number of places to drink within a short walk of the premises. Finally there is the Air Cadet Hall close by and a nearby "bar" could prove an unhealthy attraction for young people remembering the current drinking problems amongst the young.

I am writing regarding the license request by the café/bar in Anchor House. I am appalled by the idea of such a facility opening in this area.

We live directly opposite this building and are very strongly opposed to the idea.

The area is a quiet residential area on one side and the Berthon Boatyard on the other which closes at about 4.00 pm. We are already disturbed at night by the drinkers making their way back to their boats as the noise echoes round the narrow road. This only occurs at week ends but to have the noise right outside our windows all evening and into the night would be just too much to bear.

We live here as it is peaceful and we would not be able to move away should you grant this license as no one would want to buy the house, and we can not afford to move now let alone if the house was de valued by the opening of the bar. We are also not allowed to change the appearance of our house due to planning laws so could not even fit double glazing not that we want to seal ourselves in as we like the fresh air and need the ventilation in the summer. The road outside is single track and very narrow, the bar is close to us but by the time they put out tables and chairs they will be closer still and be looking straight in our window. We have no objection to the plans for the daytime but please please do not ruin our lives by granting this license, we surely have the right to some consideration in this matter.

My partner suffers from ill health (3 heart attacks + other problems) and therefore needs his rest. Other residents in this area are elderly and the noise would not only disturb them probably frighten those living on their own.

We wish to lodge our objection to the application for licence to serve alcohol on and off the premises at Fine Food and Wine 4 Sail, Unit 3 Anchor House, Bath Road, Lymington, SO41 3YL.

We live very close to the premises and we believe a licensed property is totally inappropriate to the neighbourhood, which is currently a quiet residential area. We believe that a licensed property would bring unacceptable noise levels during the evening and weekends, which are currently peaceful times when the boat yard in Bath Road is closed.

Bath Road is extremely narrow with a contra flow system at that point and there are houses immediately opposite that would be very badly affected by the noise. Those of us a little further away (but still within direct line of sight) would still be disturbed by the noise from smokers and other drinkers on the forecourt and from people arriving and departing.

We are also concerned about the impact on the neighbourhood of anti-social behaviour of inebriated patrons arriving and departing the establishment, past houses both opposite the property and in either direction along Bath Road.

We understand that the intention in the future is to have live and recorded music on the premises and a marquee that will extend the eating and drinking to outside late at night. The noise from this would reverberate off the high slab-sided shed to the north and carry across the adjacent water. We understand the only reason this has been dropped from the amended application is due to the requirement by the police for CCTV installation. We believe that the proprietors are unlikely to have changed their business plan and will apply to extend their licence once they have established themselves.

We are also concerned that the intention is to serve late night food with an extended licence, which would make this one of a very few establishments in Lymington open late at night. This would seem aimed at attracting larger numbers of customers (and their associated noise and behaviour) after the other pubs and bars have closed in Lymington.

In our opinion, Bath Road is unsuitable for increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic (that would be associated with any bar or club), particularly at night, due to its narrow width and lack of any pavement on either side of the road to the south (as of 29<sup>th</sup> April the only pavement has been permanently fenced off). Pedestrians would be especially at risk where

they must walk in the road – there is no other way to depart the premises to the south. There is also no real provision for parking on or off road at the premises so the increase in vehicles would be detrimental to the residents parking in adjacent roads.

We also understand that the premises hope to attract visiting yachtsmen from the marinas so we do not believe this facility is aimed at catering to the locals' needs. The temporary patrons would have less reason to give due regard for the neighbours peace and well-being.

Many of our neighbours are either elderly or families with children. They would be particularly vulnerable to the increased noise and rowdy, intimidating behaviour frequently associated with drinkers departing such premises. Young children are usually in bed by 8pm and any noise after this hour, especially in summer when houses will have their windows open, will be very disturbing.

In our opinion there are already sufficient licensed premises around the Town Quay and High Street area that are in close enough walking distance from the marinas to negate the need for this new establishment in a peaceful residential area. In the opposite direction there are sailing clubs, a bar and pub that also cater for visiting yachtsmen's needs. Adjacent to the premises in question is a café that already provides food during the day, so this requirement is also met.

We would also like you to note that we consider the sign in the premises window notifying 'SHOP OPENING SOON' misleading when a bar is actually being fitted inside. As far as we know the premises only has planning approval for Class A3 usage i.e. a coffee shop not a bar.

Please register our objection and advise us on how the application will be reviewed.



I wish to object to the granting of the license for the above premises on Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety.

#### The Prevention of Public Nuisance.

I believe granting a license to the above premises will have a significant potential to adversely impact on my two children, both at secondary school, and myself, who live at Pier View, opposite Unit 3, Anchor House. (See Map A). The issues interpreted as "public nuisance" are: noise, litter and anti-social behaviour.

#### 1. Noise

We have lived in Bath Road, a quiet residential street, for a period of five years. The area is quiet from evening until morning, as all adjacent businesses operate normal business hours.

I myself am employed as a Staff Nurse at Lymington Hospital, which is a tiring and demanding job. I work unsocial hours: early duties which commence at 07.30 and necessitate getting up at 06.00; late duties which finish at 21.00; weekends, Bank Holidays, Easter, Christmas and New Year.

Our home, where we enjoy peace and quiet, live and sleep, is located approximately 4-5 metres, across Bath Road, to Unit 3, Anchor House. See Map A

The hours, within the application, will result in disturbance, due to noise from a very close proximity: from human voices, due to customers entering and leaving the premises, or gathered outside on the patio area, in front of my home, drinking and smoking; or from vehicles, such as licensed taxis.

#### 2. Litter

At present, I already experience a low level of littering to the front of my home, especially bottles and cans.

The off-sales component of this license application has the potential to result in a steep increase in the accumulation of litter at my home, due to the very close proximity to Unit 3, Anchor House.

#### 3. Anti Social Behaviour

The western side of Bath Road is a residential area, outlined in green on Map B. Two local trouble spots exist at either end, where youths drink alcohol to excess, during the evenings and at night. (Marked X and Y on Map B).

At present, alcohol is sold at Tesco in the High St (see Map B). Tesco is open 6 days a week until 22.00 with a security man in operation. I have witnessed aggressive behaviour in youths, due to alcohol purchase being refused, in Tesco, in the evenings, leading to the police being called on several occasions.

The creation of a source of alcohol, in between these two trouble spots, has the potential to result in the area around my home becoming less safe.

### **Public Safety**

The stretch of Bath Road, between my home, Pier View, and Unit 3, Anchor House, is narrow and one way. See Map A.

My objective to granting of the license, on the terms applied, is that individuals or groups, leaving the premises in the evening, or at night, under the influence of alcohol, are at risk to injury from vehicles, especially 'joyriders' who drive at speed along Bath Road at these times.







I have recently come out of hospital after suffering my 3<sup>rd</sup> heart attack and have been told I need peace and quiet which I will be able to get as long as there is no licensed premises opposite. We live in this part of Lymington as it is peaceful and handy for my partners work. She can go to work and get back to me within a couple of minutes if needed. As happened when I had my second heart attack she was able to get to me and call an ambulance in time.

I am late in writing as my partner did not want to cause me un-due stress when I was ill in hospital and cause a relapse, but she was so worried she could not keep it from me any longer.

We are very concerned about the noise levels, the complete loss of privacy (seeing as the bar is just across a narrow single track road) especially with no smoking allowed inside people with hang around outside no doubt dropping cigarette ends and rubbish. Having just experienced a hot week end we have been reminded about how important it is to be able to open our windows as the house does become insufferably hot. We are limited for space inside as it is only a small cottage.

We already have the Café opposite which causes no problems but they do not sell alcohol and do not open in the evenings.

It is bad enough when the yachtsmen go down the street after they leave the pubs shouting and racing each other with trolleys from the boatyards luckily this does not happen too often.

We are also very concerned about it becoming a gathering place for groups of young people as there is an area where they can gather right outside the window. This is a very narrow street where noise echoes around. This will also be very frightening for some of residents many of whom are elderly.

We have no police in the area in the evenings and I know there is already trouble on the Town Quay and at the green near the Royal and this would be a mid way point where the youth could top up there alcohol levels.
