

I am writing to raise some concerns I have about the above application.

I believe that the selling of alcohol late into the evening, every day of the week, would be a wholly inappropriate and unwelcome development in this relatively quiet residential area.

I am concerned that the shop could become known to young people from outside the area as a source of alcohol on the way down to the beach. We do have gatherings of young people at times on summer nights already, the beach being the main attraction. At present bottles and cans have to be carried some distance but the shop is just a short hop from the cliff top.

We also have quite a number of visiting foreign students in the wider area and they too sometimes walk down Sea Road to the sea for their evening get -togethers on summer nights. Passing an off-licence, open until 11 pm, might also start to influence adversely their behaviour.

I would also feel very sorry for residents in the immediate vicinity of the shop who, in quiet Barton, would have an off-licence potentially attracting in customers from outside the area until very late- Sundays included.

I have no objection to the shop. I've always supported it.

I would respectfully ask you to consider allowing the alcohol to be sold for shorter periods only during the day, for example up to 8pm.and not on Sundays.



Thankyou for your recent, undated circular letter on this subject which my wife and I read with considerable surprise and amazement which, I might add, was shared by many neighbours and friends in the area who had received the same communication.

As national crime statistics clearly show the inescapable relationship between alcohol abuse and anti-social behaviour and as the Sea Road area of Barton-on-Sea is mainly populated by retired people, it therefore appears likely that they would be the first to suffer if an off-licence type shop was established at 'Wilson's Stores'in the manner proposed by the applicant. In fact, in view of the average age and general disposition of the area's senior residents, it is likely that most would not have any necessity (or perhaps interest) in buying alcohol from a shop in Westcliffe Buildings, irrespective of who the proprietor was -- particularly after normal trading hours.

Consequently, and in the supposed absence of many local customers, it is likely that Mr Gilgil's shop's most obvious source of regular alcohol sales would be the juvenile population living further afield (as soon as word had got around the district) – most probably accompanied by the social evils touched upon in your letter under reference!

Therefore and in order to avoid this seemingly 'no-win' situation for the Sea Road area's residents (and neighbouring shop-keepers in the same block whose adjacent premises would present an easy target for any misbehaving revellers nearby), my wife and I have reached the inevitable conclusion that we must oppose Mr Gilgil's application in the strongest possible terms.



The opportunity to buy small quantities of alcohol for consumption at home, within normal opening hours (as opposed to late night), also meets the needs of local residents.

I do not believe local people need an extension to normal operating hours to meet their requirements. Who needs and what demand is there for an extension to the hours of selling alcohol? I would suggest none.

However, the opportunity to purchase alcohol late at night seems to be a requirement of some teenagers, who will visit the area to make their purchases. Late night traffic noise and mischief-making groups of youngsters, affected by alcohol as they 'have a good time' are said by locals to have resulted in damage to their properties.

Potential damage to premises and late-night disturbances at the expense of the local residents of this quiet and responsible area are not wanted. The possible call on Police time should also be considered, as presently I would not expect there to be much of a need for a Police presence in the area.

Please restrict the licensing hours more in line with normal shop hours, which I would expect to mean stopping the sale of alcohol at 6 pm.
