

Hampshire Police object to the application for a premises licence in its current form in relation to all 4 licensing objectives.

The grounds for objection are in respect of the proposed terminal hour for licensable activities and operating schedule.

The current proposal is to end licensable activities at 01.00am, this would make the premises the latest opening licensed premises in the immediate area and our experience elsewhere is that revellers will always migrate to the latest opening premise often having already consumed significant quantities of alcohol. This leads to difficulties for the management and control of such people and a significantly higher risk of alcohol fuelled crime and disorder. If the applicant were allowed to remain open until 01.00am the local police would have to find resources to cover at closing time and if local beat teams are required to work later into the early hours each day then it would inevitably mean they will not be available at other times when demand is often higher.

Although the premises is situated in the High Street there are residential properties nearby and it is highly probable that customers leaving will cause a disturbance to residents both in the vicinity and in adjacent streets as they make their way home. We believe that it is unacceptable that they should be disturbed at such an antisocial hour particularly during the week when children will be at school during the day.

The applicant has not, in our view, adequately demonstrated satisfactory steps to promote the 4 licensing objectives, for example staff training, refusals logs and Challenge 21 type schemes.

The hours open to the public (Section O) has been crossed out so we are not aware of what the proposed hours are and consequently cannot take a view on the likely impact on crime and disorder etc. in the area

It is an offence, under section 158 of the licensing act 2003 to make a false statement in or in connection with this representation

Police recommendations (including any conditions)

We believe the following issues should be included in the operating schedule/conditions in order that the licensing objectives can be properly promoted.

A) General

The licence holders will have strong management control. All staff will be conversant with the licensing objectives, premises licence conditions and operating schedule. They will be fully trained to ensure that no underage drinking, drunkenness, use of drugs or anti-social behaviour takes place on the premises. Individual training records will be kept for all members of staff.

B) The prevention of crime and disorder

(We do not believe that the premises currently benefits from a CCTV system but if one is installed in the future then it is important that it is fit for purpose and the licence holder can fulfil the following condition)

Any CCTV should be installed and maintained at the premises to the satisfaction of the Police. As a minimum it shall enable surveillance of both internal and external areas of the premises including all entrances and exits.

New grant or variation of premises licence Or club premises certificate Form for representations from Hampshire Constabulary

Recordings from the system shall be to a standard acceptable as evidence in a court of law and shall be securely retained for a minimum of 30 days after the recording and shall be surrendered to Hampshire Constabulary immediately on request.

Drinks Promotion

The premises will not hold any irresponsible drinks promotions.

Drugs

A 'zero' tolerance to drugs will be taken; any person(s) found using or in possession of suspected illegal drugs or substances must, be reported to the police. Any drugs found on the premises will be confiscated and kept in a safe until such time it can be taken to the police station, or collected by an officer. An effective system must be in place to record and document any seizures. Appropriate measures should be implemented to prevent drug use within the premises.

C) Public safety

Adequate risk assessments will be conducted and documented.

The maximum number of persons permitted on the premises will not exceed the capacity (including staff) based on the provisions of the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 or less if dictated by the Fire Authority.

The terrace and smoking area will be adequately illuminated for patrons using these facilities during the hours of darkness.

Licence holders to ensure that all fire safety, lighting and other health and safety equipment is properly maintained.

Adequate staff training and records are kept.

D) The prevention of public nuisance

Deliveries and service providers are at such an hour not to cause nuisance to neighbours. Prominent signs are displayed at all exits asking persons to leave quietly. After 23:00 hours, music and noise shall be inaudible at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises and prior to 23:00 hours, music and noise emanating from the premises whilst audible is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any base beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.

Use of outside areas

No licensable activities or consumption of alcohol will take place externally after 22:00h

E) The protection of children from harm

Challenge 21 Scheme

The premises will operate the 'Challenge 21' Scheme, posters will be displayed to this effect in prominent positions at the premises. All staff will be trained to challenge any young person(s) attempting to purchase alcohol. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person

"The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce means of identification of a category to type previously agreed by acceptable to the Licensing Authority providing that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person"

I can confirm that as a result of a meeting with Mr Worsley I have withdrawn all requests for late licences.

We only require to operate until 11 pm

Operating schedule will include a log of ALL refusals to sell; to include under-age, after hours, intoxication etc. No credit will be offered. We will not be stocking tobacco products or have a cigarette machine.

We will adopt a "Challenge 21"policy at all times.

There will be regular staff training for "Challenge 21" procedures and all new staff will be trained.ALL staff will be "refreshed" at least every six months on new policies(local and national).

A written record of such training and refresher training will be kept in the staff diary.

"Challenge 21" and other relevant signage will be clearly visible from both within and outside the premises.

As a wine Bar it is unlikely that we will stock "alcho-pops" WKDs or similar products though we shall stock spirits (For cocktails etc).

I am very conscious that "young persons" can be tempted to bring spirits onto the premises. This will be severely penalised (Banning on first offence) as it is illegal, can jeopardise my profits and most of all can jeopardise my personal licence).

Mr Halliwell appears to be undecided on what he wants with the business and his ideas conflict with the information on the licensing application.

The application requests provision for late night refreshment between 23:00 and 01:00 hours, however, when discussing this point that no information had been shown for odour control, Mr Halliwell advised he does not want to provide food after 23:00 hours, then he changed his mind and advised he does not wish to be open beyond 23:00 hours.

Mr Halliwell then advised that the back area as shown on the licensing plan attached as a café/bistro, might become a young persons café, which may create a noise problem with persons entering and leaving etc.

I advised Mr Halliwell that he should submit a revision to his application to the Licensing Authority if it does not reflect what he wants with the business.



I am objecting to the application as I believe that a 01:00 hours opening will cause noise pollution and there is inadequate information on noise control.

There are several defects in the fabric of the building with a ventilation fan above the side/rear door which is likely to allow the escape of noise.

There is also a lack of information on odour control beyond 23:00 hours.


An effective odour management plan for the late night refreshment period should be submitted.

Objection to proposed Woods Wine bar 11 High Street Milford on Sea Application notice dated 3.12.2008

I wish to register my objection to the licence application based on the licensing objective to prevent public nuisance.

The location of these intended premises is in an area of the village surrounded by a large number of other properties occupied as residential dwellings. 11 High Street is on the northern side of the main through road (the B 3058) in an area where parking is prohibited. A small parking area to the west is already extensively used by nearby residential properties and visitors to the Bay Tree guest house. The Thai restaurant at 4 High Street has some parking at the rear of the premises. There is no provision for vehicular traffic behind the Wine Bar itself.

The application also indicates a late hours certificate until 1am which will itself generate undue noise in a hitherto quiet area. The requirement for smokers outside the front of the premises must generate additional nuisance. If chairs and tables are provided externally it can only compound the noise factor.

Although Milford has several public houses and restaurant facilities in the village, I anticipate that a wine bar as proposed would be attractive to New Milton residents who do not have a similar facility. This additional attraction would undoubtedly be an encouragement for more persons to utilise the premises. Indeed the Shorefield Park holiday visitors etc would supplement the attendant potential customers.

Having had experience over a long police career of the attendant disadvantages of late night drinking, I can foresee some deterioration in the existing situation in the village. There will undoubtedly be music noise

from the premises, the air extraction pollution, additional noise late evening from customers exiting/entering the licensed premises which are again not conducive to alleviating public nuisance.

I foresee despoiling of an otherwise peaceful area and having regard to all the local dwellings in the immediate area would regard this proposal as a serious potential public nuisance if approved.

I cannot understand why this application is not coterminous with an application to change the use of a hitherto shoe shop into a wine bar. Had there been a change of use planning application approved by the NFDC and Parish Council I would have been happier that this attracted public support.

Whilst unresolved change of use is itself not a ground for objection in a licensing application, it does beg the question that this does seem to be putting the cart before the horse.

I sincerely hope that in reviewing the potential public nuisance of this licensing application, the specific location of a wine bar in a peaceful coastal village, will be refused. Thank you for considering my objection as a village resident.

We wish to register our concerns regarding the above proposed wine bar. We could oppose this application on a number of points but are main concerns are:

- 1) The lack of parking which is already a problem in the village due to the fact that a number of village centre residences do not have off street parking and are therefore already reliant on the current limited car park space. The Brittania Thai restaurant has already brought an influx of evening traffic this year which on occasion has already caused problems with parking particularly during the summer months.
- 2) The late night license which would mean possible disturbances at a time when most residents, and this is predominantly a residential area, will be sleeping. From our own point of view being a bed and breakfast the majority of our guests, who bring income into the village, choose to come to Milford in the knowledge that it is a quiet and peaceful destination and this brings us a significant number of repeat bookings and obviously would have a hugely detrimental impact on our business should the peace and tranquility of the village in the evening be ruined.

3) Vandalism in the village has been on the increase of late. We have been victims i this ourselves with an expensive pot planter being overturned and smashed and we are sure that should a late night license be granted this would only increase with people hanging around waiting for transport as the last bus would have already left by this time of night and Taxis in the area are in short supply after midnight.

We already have three Public Houses, one of which has already been closed twice this year, and three restaurants, with another two on the way, so feel the village is more than adequately catered for in this respect.

Thank you for your acknowledgement and I now refer to a further letter received this morning dated 22
December 2008 under reference PW/SW/App 1671. This advises an amendment to the application ceasing all licensable activities at 2300 hours. I have carefully considered the amendment which does not mitigate the grounds of my original objection to any substantial degree. The public nuisance grounds expressed still hold good. There will still be all the difficulties identified, noise, smoking, traffic, air extraction pollution, the surrounding residential accommodation in close proximity. I would also point out that for anyone unaware of the housing locations. There are also dwellings immediately behind the Wine Bar and to the east and west. On a summer's evening I reside in Kivernell Road, I can hear the noise from the village green which is substantially east of the Wine Bar as proposed. I note the application is also for on and off sale of intoxicants apparently. If the wine bar per se is refused we already have other licensed premises in the village including Off licence sales at Threshers, The Coop and Holland's shops to name but three excluding other public houses etc. Frankly the location of this proposed wine bar could not be in a worst situated site as presently proposed. I wish my objection to be sustained and note a hearing enables an opportunity to voice concerns in public. Thank you. Yours faithfully R O West

We feel that despite the earlier closing time our objections in the letter of the 9th December 2008 still apply.



I am in receipt of your letter reference PW/SW/App 1671 dated 22nd December 2008 regarding Wood's Wine Bar.

I am prepared to accept that the amendement to limit all licensing activities to 23:00hrs is an improvement over the original application. I assume that any request for an extension to this arrangement will be subject to a separate application, and that all interested parties will be advised of any proposed change.

I am still unhappy with the likelihood of disturbances arising after 23:00hrs when the sale of alcohol has ceased. It is essential that noise is kept to the minimum, and that decibals from both live and recorded music are kept under control throughout opening hours. It is my opinion that all types of music should cease ar 23:00hrs.

I have noticed quantities of cigarette butts outside similar premises locally and should people be permitted to gather on the pavement this will add to both noise and pollution of the area.


