PDescribe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so they are aware of the licensing objectives and in particular ensure:- no underage drinking, drunkenness on the premises, drunkenness in public, use of drugs, violent and anti-social behaviour and to protect children from harm.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Large proportion of trade is local repeat trade, therefore depth of local knowledge and of community is an advantage when applied to reducing crime and disorder. Regular monitoring of all trade areas by trained staff. Proof of age scheme. Staff trained to refer to DPS in cases of doubt. Keep to agreed capacity limits. Will not run irresponsible drinks promotions. Site has well lit outside areas. Garden will only be able to be accessed from inside the pub. Is part of a local 'ring round' system developed to communicate potential problem customers to other Licensees via 'Pub Watch Scheme'. Actively involved with LVA and trade related meetings held in the locality. CCTV covering internal and external areas with full recordable facilities.

c) Public safety

Site has committed to ensuring that at least one member of staff/management holds a recognised 'first aid training' certificate by end of November 2005. Site has committed to having two Personal Licence Holders trained via Door Safety Scheme by end Nov 2005. Review DDA policy to ensure all reasonable steps have been taken to allow disabled customers to use premises in safety. Upkeep of emergency lighting and appropriate records kept. Upkeep of fire fighting equipment; adequate staff training and appropriate records kept. Trade within recognised capacity limits and ensure adequate levels of staff to meet expected levels of trade.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

No history of noisy mechanical equipment being sited so as to interfere with neighbours; house does some catering but ensures filters are regularly cleaned to reduce potential kitchen odours, no light pollution to neighbours. Has put fencing to side area to ensure customers entering garden can be vetted. Also prevents groups gathering in the garden after the pub has closed. Does not use external speakers. Site is regularly monitored particularly garden to ensure no instances of excessive noise or unruly behaviour. Door staff and management politely remind customers to leave premises with due consideration to neighbourhood. Ensures deliveries and service providers (e.g. refuse) are at such an hour as not to cause nuisance to neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

House does not actively encourage children but as a community local will tolerate children to be in the lounge bar and garden as long as accompanied by responsible adults and remain seated away from the bar. Would expect to be off the premises by 21:00, earlier if its an evening with entertainment. House employs a policy of 'zero tolerance' in terms of under age drinking. Without locally approved ID schemes, apparent attempts of underage drinking will be refused. This policy is enforced through staff training and use of competent door staff.

P) Proposals by the applicant in order to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so they are aware of the licensing objectives and in particular ensure:

No underage drinking, drunkeness on the premises, drunkeness in public, use of drugs, violent and anti-social behaviour and to protect children from harm.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Large proportion of trade is local repeat trace, therefore depth of local knowledge and of community is an advantage when applied to reducing crime and disorder. Regular monitoring of all trade areas by trained staff. Proof of age scheme. Staff trained to refer to DPS in cases of doubt. Keep to agreed capacity limits. Will not run irresponsible drinks promotions. Site has well lit outside areas. Garden will only be able to be accessed from inside the pub. Is part of a local 'ring round' system developed to communicate potential problem customers to other licensees via 'Pub Watch' Scheme. Actively involved with LVA and trade meetings held in the locality. CCTV covering internal and external areas with full recordable facilities.

c) Public Safety

Site has committed to ensuring that at least one member of staff/management holds a recognised 'first aid training' certificate by end of November 2005. Site has committed to having two Personal Licence holders trained via Door Safety Scheme by end November 2005. Review DDA policy to ensure all reasonable steps have been taken to allow disabled customers to use premises in safety. Upkeep of emergency lighting and appropriate records kept. Upkeep of fire fighting equipment; adequate staff training and appropriate records kept. Trade within recognised capacity limits and ensure adequate levels of staff to meet expected levels of trade.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

No history of noisy mechanical equipment being sited so as to interfere with neighbours; house does some catering but ensures filters are regularly cleaned to reduce potential kitchen odours, no light pollution to neighbours. Has put fencing to side area to ensure customers entering garden to be vetted. Also prevents groups gathering in the garden after the pub has closed. Does not use external speakers. Site is regularly monitored particularly garden to ensure no instances of excessive noise or unruly behaviour. Door staff and management politely remind customers to leave premises with due consideration to neighbourhood. Ensures deliveries and service providers (e.g. refuse) are at such an hour as not to cause nuisance to neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

House does not actively encourage children but as a community local will tolerate children to be in the lounge bar and garden as long as accompanied by responsible adults and remain seated away from the bar. Would expect to be off the premises by 2100hrs, earlier if its an evening with entertainment. House employs a policy of 'zero tolerance' in terns of under age drinking.

Without locally approved ID schemes, apparent attempts of underage drinking will be refused. This policy is enforced through staff training and use of competent door staff.

Additional Conditions previously agreed with New Forest District Council Environmental Protection Service

All external doors and windows shall be kept closed, other than for access and egress, when events involving live and/or amplified music (including speech) are taking place.

Where the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 the licensee shall ensure that the provisions of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 are complied with.

Additional Conditions

105.

GENERAL

- 105.1 SIA accredited door staff should be provided whenever public entertainment takes place.
- 105.2 Maximum occupancy for entertainment purposes is agreed as 100. This figure is to include all patrons and staff on the premises.
- Accurate control of numbers will be undertaken by the management of the premises. This will be by a method previously approved by the local authority and in any case not less effective than SIA registered door stewards, utilising "clickers" to manually count people in and out of the premises.
- 105.4 A CCTV system utilising six cameras, five within the premises and one directed on the entrance, with recording facilities, must be used at the premises. All tapes must be safely retained in the last recorded condition for a period of not less than 28 days following their use. The applicants have also agreed with the police to install further CCTV equipment.
- 105.5 When public entertainment functions take place the premises must operate an over 21's only admission policy.
- 105.6 When public entertainment functions take place there should be no entry or re-entry of patrons after 2300 hours.
- 105.7 The licensee(s) must be a member of the local Pubwatch scheme.

NOISE CONTROL

- 105.8 The rear windows of the Games Room Bar and the two doors to the side of the building must be kept closed during public entertainment functions.
- 105.9 The doors and rear windows of the Games Room Bar mentioned above shall incorporate an electrical interlock device which will operate if the doors open or tampering with the interlock device occurs. The activation of the interlock device shall prevent any amplified music and speech and any sound played being generated within the building.
- 105.10 Self-closing devices must be fitted to the inner door to both ladies and men's toilets.
- 105.11 All amplified music and any sound played at the premises shall be controlled through tamper proof noise limitation equipment/compressor, which said equipment must be approved by an Environmental Health Officer of the Council and set at a level to be approved by the Environmental Health Officer and maintained at such a level.
- 105.12 No amplified music and sound shall be played at the premises at any level higher than the level approved by the Environmental Health Officer of New Forest District Council as per the above-mentioned condition.
- 105.13 All employees and contractors must be made aware of The Holbury Inn's Noise Policy and it is the Management's responsibility to ensure full compliance.

Although you include details of how you will promote the licensing objectives, we would like the following conditions to be applied, thereby avoiding a representation (objection) being made by Trading Standards. Therefore, please can you agree to the following:-

I hereby agree to amend my operating schedule as follows:-

The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce means of identification acceptable to the licensing authority proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

27/01/2009

All staff shall be trained to challenge every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age and to refuse service where individuals cannot produce acceptable means of identification. Such training shall be provided not less than every six months, and written records shall be kept of all training and refresher training.

A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to serve alcohol, refusals of entry to the premises and ejections from the premises. The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that the refusals log is properly maintained and this shall involve, but is not limited to, nominating in writing a responsible person to check and sign it on a weekly basis.

'Challenge 21' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.
