Dear NFDC Licensing and Police Licensing

With regards to the TEN for Hyde Club on 25 May 2009 I made a visit to the site between the hours of 19:30 and 21:00.

During the early parts of my visit the music noise was at an acceptable level, however, the music noise increased to an unacceptable level to the point whereby I believe that the Abatement Notice served on the Club in 2005 was contravened.

At 19:30 hours I heard what sounded like an acoustic guitar being played outside the club with several people singing an Oasis song – 'Don't look back in anger'. This might have been an impromptu performance but appeared to be outside on the terrace directly outside the club. Clearly a lack of management.

At 20:16 hours I heard a vehicle screech off wheel spinning on what sounded like gravel for several seconds and this appeared to be from the club car park.

At approximately 20:00 hours, several bottles were thrown into the bottle bank and was rather loud.

The music noise crescendo continued until 20:45 hours which appeared to be in contravention of their TEN which should have finished by 20:30 hours.

I could also hear several expletives such as F\*cking/F\*ck that could be heard in the rear garden of Uphill from two males shouting at each other at the Club. Not very pleasant to hear whilst relaxing in a garden on a nice warm evening.

As I was packing up my car to leave at 21:03 hours I flagged down a Police car coming up Hern Lane, just below the club. I spoke to the officers asking if they were there for the TEN at the club to which they advised they didn't know anything was going on there. They advised that they were trying to find the driver of a car which had crashed in the vicinity. On my way in, earlier in the evening, I recalled an incident on the A338 and thought it was that incident; however, as I left the site I drove down Hern Lane in the direction of the A338 and approximately 100m down the lane a white car was in the ditch with the lights still on. I can only presume that it might have been the vehicle that wheel span out of the Club car park about ¾ hour earlier.

In my opinion I believe that the Abatement Notice served on the club under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 has been contravened and as such I shall be requesting the police licensing team to object to any further TEN's to avoid a criminal act taking place in contravening the Abatement Notice which carries a level 5 fine of £20,000 upon conviction in the Magistrates' Court.

In light of the above comments this visit gives me a clear view that the premises are not suitable for regulated entertainment of this nature with the club in its present condition.

Inevitably there will be occasions when NFNPA Development Control receive applications which should have been sent to NFDC Planning, and visa versa. In these instances on receipt of applications would both authorities quickly identify these applications and send them to the correct planning authority by way of the fastest possible means.

#### Response:

As you may be aware the Club has a history with regards to noise complaints and these were substantiated in May 2005 and a subsequent Noise Abatement Notice was served under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 on the Club to prohibit a statutory nuisance from recurring due to amplified music and speech.

At the time the noise abatement notice was served, it was made very clear to the committee that extensive works would need to be undertaken to make this venue suitable for amplified music events.

There have been several Temporary Event Notices (TEN's) in 2008/9 and we have received several complaints of alleged excessive music noise from these events.

It is, ed the club on the evening of 20 May 2009 on a pre-arranged appointment to listen to the external noise levels associated with a live band. The noise could be heard on the road below Cass Cottage, at the road to the entrance to Rippleside and outside Honeysuckle Cottage. I found that there were several acoustically weak points in the building. These were the two Vent-axia type air movement fans in the left hand wall in room 1 (as per the plan provided), the four windows in room 1 and the fire door to room 1. It is likely that the window in room 2 opposite the bar (between the fire door and lobby entrance) is also a weak point. The doors to rooms 1 and 2 would most definitely be weak points if these were used for access and egress during regulated entertainment performances.

The club chairman advised that they are willing to undertake some acoustic work and I gave limited advice on covering over the windows and vent axia fans.

As with any venue that will have say 100 people attending, there will be a need for ventilation in the room and this is where the problem arises with both the windows and fans blocked off to prevent the escape of the music noise.

The above list of acoustically weak points are not exhaustive and it may be found on treating the ones I have pointed out above that there are other weak points such as the roof and walls etc.

For information only – Although outside the scope of the Licensing Act 2003, if the Club were to acoustically insulate the club to achieve the licensing objective 'Prevention of Public Nuisance' the Club must still ensure that they insulate the Club to prevent a Statutory Nuisance occurring. Statutory nuisance can be both public and private nuisance and thus affect just one property.

Speaking to the Steward on 20 May 2009 he advised that performances would only be undertaken until 21:00 hours, however, the application is until 22:30 hours. He also mentioned that they only wanted one performance per month; however, the application shows Mondays, Fridays and Saturdays with no restriction over the number of occasions events may take place.

There is also no noise management and monitoring policy attached to the operating schedule to show how the committee will control noise from the venue, including exiting of patrons plus their cars.

In light of the above, (except the last paragraph, which was for information only) the club in its present condition is not a suitable venue for regulated entertainment and I therefore object to this application until the premises have been acoustically treated to the satisfaction of the Environmental Health Officer.

Re: Hyde Club application for Premises Licence variation

We are writing to you in relation to the above to outline our objection to this application.

#### 1. Prevention of Public Nuisance

Due to regular and disturbing noise levels, the previous owners and neighbours of Honeysuckle Cottage were driven to obtain a Noise Abatement Order in 2003 against Hyde Club, which we have been informed is not subject to an expiration date. Since our occupation of the property (July 2006) Hyde Club has continually breached this Order, holding events at which amplified music was played and causing general noise nuisance; with no regard for surrounding residents. Numerous verbal complaints of excessive volume were made to the management of the Club with no effect.

We have been working closely with Mr Gary Worsley, Environmental Health Officer, during our occupation of the property and, like our neighbours, have written to him several times to formally complain about the public nuisance caused by the Club; which is not only restricted to music but also inappropriate language and behaviour.

We are therefore objecting on the grounds that primarily the current situation has not changed from the original problem for which the noise abatement order was served, that the proximity of housing and very low background noise level, and being within the bounds of the New Forest National Park, suggests that amplified music is neither acceptable nor necessary and will cause a public nuisance.

#### 2. Prevention of Crime and Disorder

In recent weeks the Club has also been found to be in breach of current licensing laws, in the selling of alcohol to non-members, which we assume you are aware of. Despite the existence of the Noise Abatement Order and current licensing laws the Club seems to have shown no regard in adhering to these binding rules.

#### 3. Public Safety

With regard to public safety, we do not feel able to comment on this specifically.

In summary, we are objecting to this application on the grounds that any event utilising amplified music will constitute a public nuisance.
