



Further to our meeting this morning. I hope that you found it productive.

I think that we agreed that you would only like to have four outdoor music events per year that would terminate at 2300 I would advise that you keep a record at the property of the number and nature of events that you have plus any complaints and remedial actions that you took to address the issues. With regards to noise level for the outdoor events, I would suggest that you undertake a sound check to ensure that the noise levels at the neighbouring properties is not excessive and that you maintain some control over the levels to ensure that they do not become excessive during the course of the event. **AGREED**

This is a list of the conditions that I suggested that you might like appended to your licence for indoor events which we discussed this morning?

- During any event involving live or amplified music (other than low level background music), all windows will be kept closed. External doors will also be kept closed, except where necessary for access and egress i.e. the doors will not be secured open and will be fitted with self closers if necessary.
 AGREED
- Speakers will not be positioned outside at any time. AGREED
- (WE DO NOT HAVE AN AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM) THE KITCHEN EXTRACT WILL BE TURNED OF BY 2200 AT THE LATEST
- The disposal of empty bottles into out door storage receptacles will not take place between 1900 – 0700 AGREED
- Arrangements will be in place to ensure that deliveries of consumables will not take place between 1900 – 0700. AGREED
- Arrangements will be in place to ensure that waste collection contractors will not collect between 1900 – 0700. AGREED
- So as to minimise disturbance to local residents late at night, staff will be given appropriate instructions and training to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly and not loiter in the vicinity of the premises. AGREED I BELIEVE THIS CONDITION WAS INCLUDED IN OUR APPLICATION
- At each exit point a prominent and clear notice will be displayed to the effect that customers should be considerate to local residents by leaving the premises and the area quietly. AGREED
- Noise from amplified music and amplified voices emanating from the premises between 2300 and 0100 will be inaudible when measured at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises. AGREED
- Prior to 2300, music noise emanating from the premises whilst audible, is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any bass beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.AGREED

RE: Licensing application at the Cliff House Hotel, Marine Drive West, Barton on Sea, BH25 7QL

I have a number of concerns regarding the above application to extend licensing hours and provide regulated entertainment:

- Noise from people leaving the premises. Currently there is noticeable noise when people leave the premises; this comes from voices, car doors being shut, engines starting and running and the noise of the cars on the gravel. The license being applied for would not only ensure that this noise happened later in the night but it is also likely that it would be spread over a longer time as people leave at different points during the evening. Additionally there is likely to be more people attending the premises for late night events and so there would be an increase in the number of people and vehicles leaving.
- Noise from staff. Currently there is noise from staff when they are in the outside parts of the premises. This disturbance includes voices from conversations and from rubbish being emptied, in particular glass bottles. If the license application is granted then the disturbances will no doubt occur later in the night and possibly be more frequent if there are more people on the premises which need clearing up after.
- Noise from music, entertainment and functions. Clearly any entertainment will
 create additional noise. As has already been mentioned, noise from the Cliff
 House Hotel already causes a disturbance to local residents. Additional noise
 from music and increased people density at functions will result in greater
 noise disturbance which will go on later into the night.
- Smoke from barbecue. With the wind tending blow in off the sea smoke from the barbecue (or outdoor grill) as well as cigarette smoke blows directly towards local residential properties. The proposed license amendments would allow this to happen for longer.

The above points are issues that currently exist and create a public nuisance and as such create a concern under the point of Prevention of Public Nuisance. All of these issues would be exacerbated if the license application was granted for the reasons identified above. I am particularly concerned as we have a young baby who may be

disturbed more and also for my wife who is already on reduced sleep because of the baby being further disturbed by outside noise and events.

There will no doubt be further issues that would arise if the license application was granted and the points I have made should not be considered an exhaustive list. Attention must also be given to the future of the Cliff House and what would happen if the premises were taken over. The points I have raised above relate directly to the current experience of the Cliff House. It is entirely possible that the premises will be sold or taken over in the future and the provision of carte blanche on late night entertainment with no clauses protecting local residents is a significant concern. As such at the present point in time I have no option but to oppose the application to alter the license at the Cliff House Hotel.

Further to my conversation with Sarah this afternoon , who was most helpful, Please see my comments below.

If time allows I would be happy to host a mediation meeting with objectors however as we are away from the 9th of November returning on the 25th this may not be possible.

- 1) With the exception of one local resident, who asked if we could stop using the bottle banks early on Sunday morning which we have now done. We have not had any complaints of noise nuisance hence I can not comment on any historical issues. Following my meeting with Mat Robinson I believe we have put in place the necessary measures to avoid any noise nuisance during or following events.
- 2) Please see the following conditions as agreed with Mat Robinson

I think that we agreed that you would only like to have four outdoor music events per year that would terminate at 2300. I would advise that you keep a record at the property of the number and nature of events that you have plus any complaints and remedial actions that you took to address the issues. With regards to noise level for the outdoor events, I would suggest that you undertake a sound check to ensure that the noise levels at the neighbouring properties is not excessive and that you maintain some control over the levels to ensure that they do not become excessive during the course of the event. AGREED

This is a list of the conditions that I suggested that you might like appended to your licence for indoor events which we discussed this morning.

During any event involving live or amplified music (other than low level background music), all windows will be kept closed. External doors will also be kept closed, except where necessary for access and egress i.e. the doors will not be secured open and will be fitted with self closers if necessary. AGREED

- Speakers will not be positioned outside at any time. AGREED
- WE DO NOT HAVE AN AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM THE KITCHEN EXTRACT WILL BE TURNED OF BY 2200 AT THE LATEST
- The disposal of empty bottles into out door storage receptacles will not take place between 1900 – 0700 AGREED
- <u>Arrangements will be in place to ensure that deliveries of consumables will not take place between 1900 0700. AGREED</u>
- Arrangements will be in place to ensure that waste collection contractors will not collect between 1900 – 0700. AGREED
- So as to minimise disturbance to local residents late at night, staff will be given appropriate instructions and training to encourage customers to leave the premises quietly and not loiter in the vicinity of the premises. AGREED I BELIEVE THIS CONDITION WAS INCLUDED IN OUR APPLICATION
- At each exit point a prominent and clear notice will be displayed to the effect that customers should be considerate to local residents by leaving the premises and the area quietly. AGREED
- Noise from amplified music and amplified voices emanating from the premises between 2300 and 0100 will be inaudible when measured at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises. AGREED
- Prior to 2300, music noise emanating from the premises whilst audible, is so low that distinct tunes, lyrics, musical instruments and any bass beat cannot be recognised at the boundary of all noise sensitive premises.AGREED
- 3) The nearest property is at least 40+ meters from the front of The Cliff House so the nuisance caused by smokers, who incidentally can smoke at any hour irrespective of licenced activities, can not be seriously considered as a genuine nuisance. The outdoor fire is not used for cooking just as a patio heater.
- 4) We have a very large car park and am not aware that even on very busy days that customers need to park off site.

As we live on the premises it is in our interests as much as any resident that noise is kept to a minimum and can assure any concerned that we will continue to run a respectable establishment and are sympathetic to residents concerns.
