





Please see the below confirmation to add the following on to the premise licence for Central Bar, New Milton. Hampshire Constabulary has no objection to the granting of a premise licence.

CCTV will be installed and maintained at the premises to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and Police. As a minimum it will enable surveillance of both internal and external areas of the premises including all entrances and exits. Recordings from the system will be to a standard acceptable as evidence in a court of law and will be securely retained for a minimum of 30 days. The recording will be surrendered in a playable format to Hampshire Constabulary immediately on request.

The Designated Premises Supervisor must be a "active" member of the local Pub watch scheme, where there is one in situ. For sake of clarity this will entail regular attendance at meetings by the Designated Premises Supervisor or nominated deputy. The management will fully support and enforce any banning orders or similar arrangements agreed by the pub watch scheme.

- The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce means of identification acceptable to the licensing authority proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.
- All staff shall be trained to challenge every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age and to refuse service where individuals cannot produce acceptable means of identification. Such training shall be provided not less than every six months, and written records shall be kept of all training and refresher training.

A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to serve alcohol, refusals of entry to the premises and ejections from the premises. The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that the refusals log is properly maintained and this shall involve. but is not limited to, nominating in writing a responsible person to check and sign it on a weekly basis.

'Challenge 25' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

I am writing to object to the above application, due to the problems it would cause and has caused in the past to residents who live close by.

When the Snooker club was operating in the past, we had problems with drug dealing/taking, drunken behaviour, people urinating and vomiting.

Also people having sex in the alleyway.

My own personal experience has been unable to access my property many times due to lorries and cars blocking the access when delivering
