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

Re: White Horse Public House, Main Road, Marchwood - Application to vary premises licence

We wish to object to the above application and now set out our reasoning in this letter.

It is understood that the Licensing Act is based on 4 principles and we believe that the application made by the White Horse Public House potentially breaches all 4. I will therefore set out reasoning under all 4 principles. Additionally, I will then make reference to a more suitable alternative solution that the White Horse Public House has at its disposal.

Before I begin however, I believe that this application has not been presented correctly by the White Horse Public House. The notice in the local newspaper states that there is a 'submitted plan' in respect of this application. I have spoken to the NFDC Licensing Office on more than one occasion about this, including a discussion with Patrick Curran. I have been told that the 'submitted plan' makes no sense. I have therefore already suggested to the NFDC Licensing Authority that the application should therefore be thrown out, until such time as a 'submitted plan' actually makes sense and is therefore of use to the Public in considering this application. How can the Public be expected to consider the application if the 'submitted plan' makes no sense even to the Licensing Authority? I therefore propose that the White Horse Public House is advised to re-submit its application, together with a clear plan and then this consultation period should start again from the beginning. This is the only fair way of anyone concerned being able to properly consider the matter.

Under the 'Freedom of Information Act' I, like any member of the public, am entitled to request in writing any documentation held by the Local Authority (albeit subject to

redaction of some personalised information). In view of this, I now request copies of the following -

- 1. The current Licensing terms for the White Horse Public House in Marchwood
- 2. A full copy of the current application including the 'submitted plan'
- 3. Details of any complaints made against the White Horse Public House (including any representations from the Police) for the last 10 years which will provide data that is both pre and post the changes effected to their Licensing terms in 2005.

Respectfully I would suggest that these are provided to me long before any proposed Hearing about this application, so that I have plenty of time to consider the content of same and make any additional enquiries that may be relevant following receipt of it, including consultation with my Solicitor.

Objection based on the 4 Principles of the Licensing Act

- 1. Prevention of Crime and Disorder the car park area of the White Horse Public House is currently subject to the restriction that prohibits outside seating areas. It seems that the application being made now is to lift this restriction in this area. This restriction was put in place following the Hearing in 2005 when it was highlighted that the criminal activity of under-age drinking, fighting and criminal damage was taking place in this car park area. Additionally there was disorder caused there by patrons playing music from their car stereos and excessive larking around / noise making. One of the main reasons why this happened in the car park area was the fact that the White Horse Public House cannot control (or see / supervise) suitably the car park area. Since the prohibition of seating areas in the car park, there has to our knowledge, been no problem at all. There is well founded fear that should the seating restriction be lifted, problems of a similar nature will quickly return.
- 2. Public Safety on occasions the car park area is actually quite full. If the White Horse Public House creates seating areas in the car park area then the parking facility will be reduced and this will have the knock on effect of patrons finding alternative parking positions. When parking is busy there we know that cars tend to be parked in dangerous positions in Woodglade Close and, at times previously, along the front of the White Horse. This affects Public Safety. Additionally, should there be a smoking area created within the car park, dangerous cigarette smoke will regularly and consistently pass across and through the fencing that bounds private gardens to the rear of the car park area. There is a growing concern developing at least in the North of this country regarding this very point, in so much as outside areas with high density of cigarette smoking can detrimentally affect non-smokers also situated in close proximity. I have read that there is medical opinion to support this view. In fact, I believe that changes to the law are being proposed by some MPs. Also, under this heading, an uncontrolled area such as this car park, should it be permitted to have people drinking in it, is a serious threat to Public Safety for both those who are walking past it along the pavement and those who may need to complain about it over their boundary fences. Furthermore, litter (including glass bottles) has been found in various residents' gardens prior to the prohibition of the seating area in 2005. Finally,

- there is a significant fire risk to the trees, bushes and wooden fencing that bounds the properties around the car park area from carelessly discarded cigarettes and matches. There is a resultant risk of a fire developing there, spreading to the public dwelling houses themselves.
- 3. Prevention of Public Nuisance as highlighted in points 1 and 2 above, there is great potential for public nuisance if this latest application is successful. Nothing fundamentally has changed since the restriction to outside seating areas was put in place back in 2005. The White Horse Public House still has no direct control over who enters this area it's a car park, therefore people come and go to it 'unrestricted' and un-vetted. Likewise, should the restriction be lifted, it will be possible to transport drinks to anyone in the car park area without any knowledge of where (or who) the drinks are actually going to. Back before 2005 when this restriction was put in place, there is plenty of evidence on your files to show what kind of public nuisances potentially can occur in the car park area.
- 4. Protection of children from harm like many of the residents who flank the car park area of the White Horse Public House, on evenings and weekends we entertain nephews, nieces and other family members / friends who are children in our garden. At the moment our garden backs onto a car park. In the event that it becomes a seating area in any part there will be the associated foul and abusive language, shouting and intimidating rowdy behaviour occurring just a few feet behind our boundary fence. Combined with the risk of cigarette smoke too, this is potentially a very harmful situation for children.

I find it frankly staggering that the White Horse Public House has made an application to have the seating restriction lifted in the car park when it actually has its own garden to the rear of its premises! Yes, that's right - they actually have a garden already! This particular garden is separated from properties to the rear by a decent amount of foliage, together with a separate alleyway / pathway before any bounding property gardens are affected. Additionally, and crucially, access to this garden would be via the rear of the bar only - meaning that all patrons using it would be suitably vetted as they passed through. Under-age drinking would be eliminated and poor behaviour witnessed and controllable, should it even occur. Also, no car stereos or people passing along the pavement would be possible to affect, or interact with, this area. Maximum use of the car park would be retained. Only people who bought a house that backed onto / adjacent to a pub garden would be affected by same - and to a significantly lesser degree. They bought what they could foresee – whereas, if the car park is allowed to be changed to one providing seating areas, the affected property owners did **not** choose to buy properties that flanked public house seating facilities. Why, you may ask, is the White Horse not currently using their own garden area? I am informed that the reason for this is that they want to retain it as their own 'private garden' for their tenant! This is unfair and downright selfish, however there may be a different reason that perhaps concerns cost of creating more suitable access from the bar. If this is a 'cost' issue, then Punch Taverns needs to deal with this rather than causing potential problems for local residents simply to save a few pounds. How can a Public House seek to preserve its own 'private' garden at the expense of numerous neighbouring private gardens?

So, to summarise, the only sensible answer to the White Horse's application is to decline it, to save potential breach of the 4 core principles of the Licensing Act. At

the same time, the White Horse should be asked to explore its current garden for any outside seating area proposals, with relevant and appropriate plans submitted for further consideration.

I end this letter with reference to the European Convention on Human Rights. - most specifically to Article 8 (Right to respect for private and family life) and to Article 1 of the First Protocol (Right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions). I firmly believe that if this application is allowed, then it will contravene these rights.


