

NEW FOREST DISTRICT COUNCIL LICENSING ACT 2003

APPLICATION: VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE: TESCO SUPERMARKET, CAIRD AVENUE, NEW MILTON

6. Decision of the Sub-Committee

The application is granted on the following terms and conditions.

Licensable activities and times permitted:

M: Supply of Alcohol

Monday 06.00hrs to 00.30hrs Tuesday 06.00hrs to 00.30hrs Wednesday 06.00hrs to 00.30hrs Thursday 06.00hrs to 00.30hrs Friday 06.00hrs to 00.30hrs Saturday 06.00hrs to 00.00hrs Sunday 10.00hrs to 22.30hrs

During the month of December, alcohol may be sold up to 24 hours a day when the store is open to customers.

Mandatory conditions:

As provided in the Licensing Act 2003

Other conditions: None.

7. Reasons for the Decision

The Sub-Committee carefully considered the application along with the evidence, both written and oral, supplied by the applicant and objectors.

Whilst the Sub-Committee was sympathetic with objectors' concerns and fears, it was of the view that the objectors had not provided any substantiated evidence to demonstrate that the extension of hours for the supply of alcohol at the premises would increase the level of public nuisance or crime and disorder (or adversely affect or breach any of the other licensing objectives) within the vicinity of the licensed premises.

In reaching this conclusion, the subcommittee noted the fact that there were no objections from any responsible authorities, including the police. The lack of formal police objections was deemed particularly important in light of the premises' current ability to sell alcohol over a 24 hour period for the whole of December without any known incident or complaint.

Accordingly, the Sub-Committee was prepared to grant a premises licence for the supply of alcohol (for consumption off the premises) in the terms set out at section 6 above.
