Living on a busy high street with several licensed premises and a thriving market; I have never expected peace and quiet. I also expect an element of alcohol induced banter and it to reach a peak when these premises are closing.

The reason my Langleys has raised as such a problem over the past 3

years is because Lareys is the honey pot from all the other premises. Due to it being the one premises that has the latest licence.

From my home above the shop I have an excellent view up and down the High Street. It is apparent that the revellers drift from the top end of the High Street (coming direction) down to Lareys Wine Bar.

I have stated that the issue has raised in the past 3 years, it was worse in the past 12 months. Though there has been a slight improvement. The last night of violence and being disturbed from our sleep was the last weekend in January. I believe it was the Friday night, we were aware that the night was getting noisy. My 9 year old son had been woken. The issue escalated with a group outside Lareys and I feared that it was getting out of control. I rang 999 and to I'm not

Albeit that we are safe inside our well secured home. Being woken from sleep to the sounds of persons threatening violence to each other. Shouting profanities at each other, women screaming and screaming is incredibly intimidating; for me, my

wife and children.

I stated that there has been a slight improvement. It may be of relevance that we were house sitting for 4 weeks from 30th January this year

The issues are always at there worst post 1am. On most of these occasions of which we are ringing the police it is actually between 2 and 3 am in the morning.

I can recall several specific incidents. 18 months ago a male had come out of Largs and was involved in a fight outside my shop. There had been an incident fight in Largs and persons had been thrown out; this continued outside.

This incident occurred just after 2am. No persons were ever arrested for the damage ~~etc~~ as police were unable to identify the offender.

This has not been the first time by murder has been broken by drunken revellers. There was another occasion 5 years ago. This also happened in the early hours. On this occasion

a person was convicted and I received costs. Following more on the past year in any the past couple of months there was a group of males outside our shop in the early hours of the morning, they were flame throwing with lighter fluid. Setting light to lighter fluid they had sprayed on the floor. I rang the police, it was quite alarming and I was concerned about the potential fire risk to our property.

I recall on another occasion, over a year ago. It was raining with rain around 2 am and there were about 15-20 people in the High Street sizing each other up for a fight. Cars had to drive around them to avoid them.

There was an occasion late last summer, past 2 am in the evening and a group of males had left lamps and made their way down to the Old School House. They had smashed signage and were using 6 foot high wooden display board using them as

weapons. As you would use a baseball bat. I remember this was an occasion when I rang 999, but there were no officers available to attend. I am sure that it was 40 minutes before the police arrived. By this time the males had all dispersed down various alley ways.

I would never ring the police over the odd scream or shout. I only ever ring when there is a fight in progress or obvious by the persons behaviour; that it is imminent.

We no longer invite people to camp and stay in our home. Although the disturbance and violence is sporadic. On three occasions in the past year when we have invited our parents to stay; no body got to sleep until about 3 am due to the disturbance out on the streets. You really never know when it is going to happen next

I am the above named person; I am employed as a Licensing Enforcement Officer with New Forest District Council. The nature of my job is that I may be tasked to investigate complaints under the Licensing Act 2003. The result of these investigations can result in prosecutions conducted in the Magistrates Court. For thirty years I was employed as a police officer with the Metropolitan Police and later with Hampshire Constabulary. I have worked both in the Uniform Branch and briefly in CID. I am aware of the rules of evidence and the value of accurately recording information which may constitute evidence. During the course of my police career I have dealt with persons arrested for alcohol and public order related offences.

On the 14th January 2009 at 2030hrs I first visited Longs Wine Bar, 99 High Street, Lymington SO41 9AP. This was made as a result of complaints by local residents about the noise level and the belief that the proprietor was in breach of his Premises Licence. I initially saw a male who said his name was Daniel Stevens. I later spoke to another male who gave his name as Andrew Johnson who said he was the owner of the club. I explained the purpose of my visit which was that live music was being played at 0200hrs. There was no direct evidence that this was the case as the complainant could not actually see persons playing musical instruments. During the course of the conversation with Mr Johnson I explained in detail to the gentleman best practice in regard to the responsible sale of alcohol to the public which would have included the recording of details of persons refused alcohol, training records of persons selling alcohol behind the bar and the identification of young persons under the age of 18yrs attempting to buy alcohol. Mr Johnson did not challenge any of my recommendations and appeared to support responsible consumption of alcohol. I remained at the premises till 2130hrs. During the course of my visit I saw no disturbance or any evidence of disorder.

... On the 2nd August 2010 I attended Lymington Town Hall with police sergeants Amanda Barry, Nick Adams, the local beat officer, a senior Fire Officer, the two owners of Longs Wine Bar, which included Andrew Johnson and a number of local residents. The residents were complaining about noisy behaviour of youths leaving the club. Mr Johnson proposed that concerned residents could call the club at any time to help resolve any ongoing problems. The residents cited several recent cases of disturbances in the area close to the club but were unable to say whether the individuals actually came from the club itself. Throughout the meeting it was stressed the importance of keeping records of persons refused alcohol. I have had no further dealings with the club or any of the employees.

However it is clear from notes made on the New Forest District Council licensing file of recent public order disturbances. I can if required give evidence of these from records held within the file.

I am PC 3735 Paula Symes of the Hampshire Constabulary currently stationed at Lymington Police station.

On Friday 28th January 2010 I was on duty, in full uniform observing Lymington town centre from the New Forest District Council CCTV control room, when I observed in real time an incident in the High Street between a group of males.

I started an observation log exhibit number reference PJS/01 at 23:30 hours from the control room and made an entry at 00:20 hours on Saturday 28th January 2011 as I saw a group of six young males leave the Thomas Tripp and walk towards the High Street who gave me some concern due to their behaviour.

During the groups walk towards the High Street, I observed that the group looked in high spirits, messing around in the road and looked as if they were under the influence of alcohol. One of the group was stopped by Police Officer in St Thomas Street and warned about his behaviour. Another member of the group who appeared to be mixed race stopped in the High Street and urinated. This male is approximately 5ft 8in tall, dark wavy hair tied in a pony tail to the back and was wearing a grey hoody jacket. I now know this male to be [REDACTED]. The group continued towards Longs Wine Bar and allowed entry. I finally lost sight of them at 00:35 as they went into Longs Wine Bar.

At 01:22 hours I saw the same group outside Longs Wine Bar, unsteady on their feet and gave me concerns that their behaviour could lead to problems later on. Members of the group were spoken to by police as they stood in the High Street. The group then walked away from Longs, turning right and walked towards St Thomas Church. At this point there were five males in the group.

At 01:29 hours I observed from the CCTV control room the same group of males walking pass two males walking in the opposite direction. One of the group barges the aggrieved as he walks pass. The group stops in to St Thomas

Street, they seem to be arguing with the male who was wearing a black hoody and a white sweat shirt with logo on the front. I now know this male to be the aggrieved [redacted]. At this point I saw one of group lunge forward towards [redacted] and hit him in the face. It looked as if the male had head butted the aggrieved. This male was white, approximately 20 years old wearing a grey hoody top and black trousers. I now know this male to be [redacted]. I could now clearly see that [redacted] mouth was bleeding. [redacted] then walked away and theft the aggrieved standing with the rest of his group who seemed to be arguing.

I then saw the male with the pony tail [redacted] push [redacted] with his left hand and then punch him to the left side of his face with his right hand. Police were called to the area and I saw [redacted] hide by a pillar near to the church wall then sat facing the church as police arrived. This was relayed at 01:36 to Insp Jackson by radio. [redacted] was then spoken to by police.

I continued to watch the CCTV to follow the first male suspect [redacted] as he left the High Street. [redacted] walked towards an area known locally as the "Bunny Run" and I directed my police colleagues towards his location in order for him to be arrested. I can confirm that the male [redacted] who was stopped by PC 24443 RYAN is the same male who I saw on the CCTV assault [redacted] a short time before in ST Thomas Street.

I am Samuel Charles Brewis PC 1857 of the Hampshire Constabulary currently stationed at Lymington. I regularly perform the role of the duty acting Sergeant at Lymington. I have a background of over 22 years as a frontline shift officer & am level 2 public order trained as such I am experienced in a wide variety of confrontational situations.

In this statement I will provide factual information also my general professional personal opinion in respect of Longs Wine Bar, High Street Lymington.

On Saturday 27th March 2010 I was on duty as the late shift duty acting Sergeant. Aware that the clocks went forward to BST at 01.00 on Sunday 28th March, together with Pc21142 Morant we attended outside of Longs Wine Bar at 23.35 hours. Present outside was the doorman Douglas Dike & the DPS Anthony Saward. I remained in the Police vehicle whilst PC Morant spoke briefly with the DPS Anthony Saward to advise him that as a result of the clocks change 01.00 would become 02.00 & they would then have to cease serving. PC Morant informed me that the DPS Anthony Saward was adamant that the clocks did not change until 03.00.

As a result I spoke with the DPS Anthony Saward & told him the clocks DID go forward at 01.00 meaning it would become 2AM & unless he had made an application to vary his licence he would have to cease serving and close to these hours. He continued to argue his 3AM clock change time & of more concern was totally dismissive of the advice given. I told him that if he chose to ignore this advice any breach would be reported to the licence authority.

At 00.50 hours on Sunday 28th March we returned to Longs in response to the Nights Sergeant PS Thornley asking for assistance into a disturbance outside. On arrival PS Thornley said it had quietened down. There were still some 15-20 people milling about outside all well in drink.

PS Thornley had been briefed by myself in respect of the licensing issues & told me that Saward intended to remain open. I caused NFDC to make copies of CCTV footage of the licensing breach & forwarded all detail to our licensing office.

I have attended the outside of Longs Wine Bar on numerous occasions after midnight and it is the norm to find people from all backgrounds heavily intoxicated loud & frankly obnoxious in their behaviour. The worst cases of disorder are arrested however resources & practicalities of custody space make it impossible to deal with the majority of transgressors.

I have the greatest sympathy with residents who live in close proximity as the vocal noise & foul language is unacceptable.

One occasion that sticks firmly in my mind was when I had cause to politely ask a heavily intoxicated group to keep the noise down as people lived in the rooms above. A lady aged around thirty with a rather posh voice told me to "get real if they don't like it they shouldn't have bought somewhere over a fucking pub". She continued with insults such as I thought the Fucking Police would have better things to do. I am sure that when sober this lady would find the language she was using horrifying.

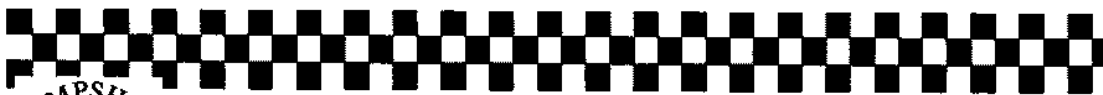
This typifies the general inherent problem of maintaining public order when excesses of alcohol have been consumed as the behaviours that result are universal irrespective of people's background.

On our night shifts we Police with very low numbers & have a duty to the wider public to provide an even spread of service. Longs Wine Bar is and has been for many years a place where people already intoxicated simply go to & drink more. The resultant behaviour is not only unpleasant for High Street residents but also puts an undue strain on our limited resources. Put quite simply it is impossible & impractical to Police the impact that Longs has on the community.

I am willing to address the licensing authority if required to quantify my opinion.

I am a police sergeant of the Hampshire Constabulary currently posted to the 6 OCU Licensing Team based at Romsey.

I am a trained operator of the GE Itemiser (3) Ion Track Mobility Spectrometer used to check surfaces for traces illicit drugs or explosives.

Responses are reported to the user by a simple and clear computer interface. An "alarm strength" reading shows the intensity of the response. This strength is an indication of the amount of narcotic contamination that was collected on the Teflon coated fibreglass trap.

The machine is set to show an alarm above a level of 1.

Following the wiping or swabbing of a surface with the trap, the trap is then inserted into the Itemiser and analysed using the principles of mass spectrometry. (The traps used are cleaned and packaged by the manufacturers to ensure they are not contaminated before use). It is those subsequent readings that it produces that I am trained to interpret.

The machine will correctly identify contamination down to nanogram (billionth of a gram) levels. Readings of 4.00 and above are estimated to relate to microgram amounts of contamination being transferred to the sample trap. This level of contamination is not generally experienced in any other environment than somewhere where there has been direct contact with a bulk amount of the source narcotic, i.e. this level is not generally experienced as background contamination or

through incidental cross contamination by being in close contact with other contaminated areas or persons.

At 18:12 hrs on Tuesday 15th March 2011, I commenced analysis of a swab taken at Longs Wine Bar.

Having carried out daily maintenance of the GE Itemiser (3) Ion Track Mobility Spectrometer and calibrated it I used a clean sample trap to check that the machine and work area were free of drug contamination and the machine was clear.

I checked one sample trap, identified as MB/LW/1, which was in a sealed sample envelope.

I removed the trap and inserted it into the device. As a trap is inserted the particles collected on the trap are heated to very high temperatures and vaporised. These vapours then pass through the machine and are tested.

When levels of drugs above background levels are detected an alarm sounds and the display shows the type and level of drug. After each check I clear the device by initiating a purging and self check analysis prior to repeating the testing process on any other samples. The results were as follows:

MB/LW/1 – drugs detected Cocaine 1.83.

I am PC 24191 Bethan WOOD of Hampshire Constabulary currently stationed at Lymington Police Station.

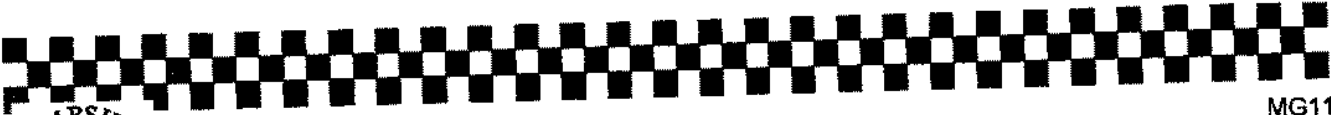
On 3rd April 2011 I was on uniformed patrol in a marked police vehicle, in company with PC 21142 MORANT. We were concentrating our patrols on the area of Lymington town centre.

At 0135hrs We were travelling down Lymington High Street, from St Thomas Street end, towards Gosport Street. My attention was drawn to a male who was stumbling along the pavement, in the opposite direction. I remember thinking that it was incredibly dangerous as this side of the road is effectively an Island and at some point the male would have to cross the road. We had already seen numerous vehicles in the area and I was concerned for his safety.

We turned around and I went to speak with the male who identified himself to me as [REDACTED]. As I was speaking with [REDACTED] I noticed that he was having problems to stand still, and that he smelt strongly of intoxicating licquor. He having to keep moving in order to maintain

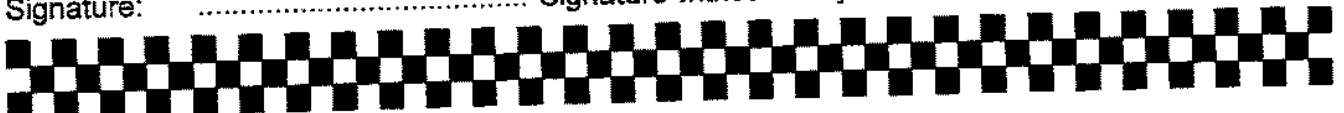
his balance. I asked him to account for how he had come to be in this state, and enquired as to where he was going to.

I am PC 24191 Bethan Wood of Hampshire Constabulary currently stationed at Lymington Police Station. I am making this statement in relation to an incident that I observed from the police station on Saturday 23rd April 2011.

At about 0220hrs I was upstairs at the police station when my attention was drawn to outside, where I could hear two males, clearly revellers, making their way down Southampton Road from Lymington Town towards the police station. A few moments later the voices were louder, shouting things like "WE'RE SO COOL". I opened the blind to see outside. What I saw shocked me.

I saw two males in the road. One (the shorter male) was quite clearly urinating in the middle of the road, right outside the police station, and directly opposite the retirement homes. His behaviour was exhibitionist. He made no attempt to be discreet, he was waving his penis around, causing the urine to cover a large area of road.

My colleagues, PC 21142 MORANT and PS 24209 TOWLER and I left the police station to speak with the males. PC MORANT spoke with the male who had urinated. He identified himself as [REDACTED]. Mr [REDACTED] was in drink, but coherent. He smelt heavily of intoxicating liquor. Mr [REDACTED] and his companion, [REDACTED]

Impact Statement

Longs Wine bar **Lymington**

This document has been written to represent opinion of the local Police Inspector in relation to the Community Impact that is influenced by this establishment.

I have only been in this post for eight months but as soon as I arrived I became aware of a history of disorder associated with Longs, and indeed the regular deployment of Police officers at weekends to address incidents relating to excess drinking and its aftermath.

Longs is my only post midnight licensed premises in the Lymington and New Milton area that I am responsible for. Being new in the area I undertook some analysis of the demand for resources that I was faced with at my new location and it become apparent that we had an increased drink related public order problem in Lymington town that wasn't a problem across the rest of my 9 beats.

I found that in the main we weren't being called prior to midnight but mostly after one being hours after the other pubs had closed. As a result I put together a licensing operation to evidence the issue.

Since coming into post I have worked very closely with the New Forest Safer Streets team and the Licensing Team to assist with the monitoring and enforcement of this venue.

As a result of this one venue my staff are pulled away from their core business – public engagement and local beat management – to police, in effect, one premises. This affects not only the Lymington Safer Neighbourhoods officers but also the New Milton team all of whom now work a 2am finish on a Friday / Saturday. This has meant that we are not able to effectively police or engage with the public at the biggest market in the Forest area each Saturday.

Further, as we have a disproportionate amount of public order we have had to centrally bid for overtime to enable increased patrols to try and prevent and where we can't prevent them to investigate and detect these crimes.

The result of poor management has been fed back to my two local beat officers responsible for this beat who have advised me that they regularly receive complaints from local store owners and staff in the direct vicinity that they come into work and open up to find they have to clear up the after effects of public urination. This has also been fed back to me personally during my walks around town by stores. We also receive public complaints around excess noise, fighting in the streets, damaged shop windows, litter, urinating in public etc.

We had conducted regular licensing compliance checks to both try to assist management and clearly demonstrate our positive action but the incidents continued.

On the weekend of the 11th December there was a serious confrontation that started within Longs on the dance floor the victims [who work for the RNLI] left to get way and drunken males followed them out and continued on them resulting in the RNLI staff getting serious injuries including broken noses and teeth. As this was happening a female member of the public that was walking by was also assaulted. Two ambulances were called and this incident took all of my available resources that night for several hours but also a big resource impact over the following days to resolve.

My colleagues who dealt on the night had stated that whilst the DPS came out and was very helpful in trying to support us and give us any information they felt that he could have prevented such an incident by having better control of his staff and the flow of alcohol to people who were clearly drunk.

As a result I secured extra regular weekend visits from our Force Support Teams who are on standby to cover problems in the whole of Hampshire Constabulary- a further draw on Police resources.

On the 28th of January I put together and led an operation to evidence the poor nature of the running of this premises. On that night I had 12 staff dedicated to me plus the normal response teams that would have been on duty.

Statements were provided by the key staff in relation to what was found that night.

I went on patrol with PS Tim Adams of the Licensing team we drove round and saw many people milling around but generally in good spirits and good natured. I had instructed my teams to undertake high visibility licensed premises visits to all the surrounding feeder venues that closed around midnight.

I had staff in the CCTV office and also had placed plain clothes staff in Longs.

During the evening I had cause, with PS Adams, to stop and speak to a group of rowdy lads who were drunk and being noisy walking down the street we spoke to them calmed them and advised that they quieten down and have a pleasant and safe evening. We then passed their details over to CCTV for monitoring and also to the staff who were inside the premises.

I was advised that this clearly drunk group were watched as they approached Longs and go in unchallenged; further they were served alcoholic drinks in the venue.

At approximately 00:45am, PS Adams and I stood on the corner of the High Street and New Street outside Costa coffee shop this being approximately 100 yards away from the venue. I could clearly hear the repetitive and loud drum beat of music emanating from Longs. This was clearly heard in full when the front door was opened.

We then walked and entered the premises asked the doorman who many people he had inside and he showed us his entry and exit clickers and said about 40.

As we entered the noise was extremely loud and we could see the aforementioned group drinking pints of beer. We saw that many of the customers were excessively drunk also there was a person in the DJ booth putting on the music and there were about 15-20 people dancing on the dance floor with all the disco lights flashing.

We went to the bar to speak with the DPS, Andy Johnson, we explained our concerns that he was breaching several points of his licence, in terms of music, dancing , an unauthorised bar staff member but more importantly the drunks inside who had been allowed entrance unchallenged and then served further intoxicants inside by his staff.

I had never met the DPS before but found his lack of responsibility shocking, I explained that there were drunk people who had come in and we pointed them out he stated he couldn't be held responsible for the action of his door staff. I then pointed out several males who were clearly extremely drunk and that they had been seen to be served Mr Johnson then said to me that he didn't know that they were that bad and what did we expect, for him to walk round every 5 minutes checking people were not drunk. I explained that I expected him and his staff to not serve drunks. We pointed out the issue with the loud music and he became very argumentative and accused us of trying to trip him up over the terms of his licence.

We walked round the premises with the DPS and pointed out the groups that were drunk; he again blamed his door staff so we called the doorman down. The doorman claimed that he was professional in his judgement and that the group were not that drunk when they had come in. I pointed out that one of the males could hardly stand and was slurring his words and the pair seemed to be blaming each other.

We suggested that the group be asked to leave by the DPS but that we would support his actions in removing them. The group were asked to leave, their drinks taken away and they left in good spirits even though extremely drunk.

Shortly afterwards we left.

Within twenty minutes this group had assaulted a male in an unprovoked attack whereby the victim had half of his front tooth snapped. The males were arrested.

I have to conclude that at the weekends this establishment run in its current manner poses a continued risk of harm to public, damage to property and a drain on police resources. It has become viewed as local nightclub in every way and its extended licensing hours have led to incidents of serious violence and disorder, necessitating a disproportionate deployment of Police resources in order to address associated incidents. Even with this input the effect on the local community has been significant and negative. Community tensions are high and there is an expectation that local partners will impose sanctions with minimum delay to restore order to Lymington Town.

I am a resident at 19a, High Street, Lymington, which is the maisonette in the same building as Longs Wine Bar. The operators of the bar regularly talk to us and are keen to take on board any concerns we may have with regards to the operation of their licensed premises. I feel they have demonstrated a desire to work with local residents with regard to any concerns about the operation of the bar.

I hold a NPLC personal license, for alcohol sale, and as such am well aware of the law regarding operating a licensed premises. I would say that the operators of Longs have tried to work within the laws regarding their license. I have certainly never seen any underage drinkers around the property, and have noticed a full team of door staff at all times the bar is open.


We have noticed in cases where others from our flat attack of police support at key times such as closing, occasionally visitors to our flat have received verbal abuse from police officers, despite not visiting the bar and being sober.

In conclusion, the operators of the bar have attempted to run their premises within the law and the terms of their license, as far as is possible for any premises of this type.

As a resident closest to the bar, I would welcome any discussion with authorities, and am a little surprised no attempt has been made to talk to us to date with regard to the current issues surrounding their license. A coordinated approach between police and licensees could ensure a safe environment for residents who do and do not wish to visit Longs Wine Bar.

I am a self-employed security officer and have been working at Longs Bar for the past 5/6 years.

I usually work at Longs Bar with one other doorman.

Longs Bar is open from Wednesday night to Saturday night. During the course of the evening, I stand outside the entrance and assess people that want to come into the bar.

There is a maximum allowance of 80 people. I monitor the number of people in the bar, by using two clickers, which I keep in my pocket. I click people in and out of the bar. We do not allow anybody in the bar that is underage. If I have any doubt, I ask to see ID. I usually asked to see a driving licence.

We do random body searches for drugs or weapons. I have not found any drugs on anyone for approximately 2 years. All our regulars are aware that we will not tolerate anyone bring drugs in to the bar. In the past we have banned people forever, if we have found them with drugs. If I have any suspicion that someone has had too much to drink, then I speak with them to assess the situation. If I believe they have had too much to drink or are obviously drunk then I do not allow them into the club.

I keep a note of all the refusals during the evening, and at the end of the shift I write all the details into a daily refusal log.

I also check the fire exits at the beginning of my shift and during the course of the night.

There are alarms around the premises and there is a button at the entrance, that I can press if I believe the music is too loud. This buzzer goes straight to where the DJ is situated and this will alert him that I can hear the music and the music will be turned down.

If there is any disturbance in the bar, then the bar staff or Mr Johnson will press the alarm and either Frank or I will deal with the situation straightaway and remove the person from the bar if necessary.

However, there is not much disturbance in the bar, it is usually when we have to turn someone away for being drunk, that they become a nuisance.

I believe that the bar is run efficiently and that we do not tolerate any drunken or violent behaviour.

I hold a NFDC personal licence, for alcohol sale, and as such am well aware of the law regarding operating a licensed premises. I would say that the operators of Longs have tried to work within the laws regarding their licence. I have certainly never seen any underage drinkers around the property, and have noticed a full team of door staff at all times the bar is open.

We have noticed in casual observations from our flat a seeming lack of police support at times such as closing, occasionally visitors to our flat have received verbal abuse from police officers despite not visiting the bar and being sober.

In conclusion, the operators of the bar have attempted to run their premises within the law and the terms of their licence, as far as possible for any premises of this type.

As the residents closest to the bar, I would welcome any discussion with authorities and am a little surprised no attempt has been made to talk to us to date with regard to the current issues surrounding their licence. A coordinated approach between police and licensees could ensure a safe environment for residents who do and do not wish to visit Longs Wine Bar.

WITNESS STATEMENT

Statement of: Michelle Race
Date of Birth: 15th January 1986
Occupation: Bar Manager Longs Bar

I have been employed as the Bar Manager at Longs Bar for the past 2 years. Prior to working at Longs, I managed an independent shop and have also been trained as an assistant manager at a Fullers Pub. I have achieved a Beer and Cellar Quality Award as well as my Personal Licence.

I am at Longs every night we are open, and most days as well. I am generally the point of contact for the Police outside of opening hours, and also gave my personal number to residents and shop owners at the Town Hall meeting last year if they had any issues. No one has ever contacted me with any problem.

I have the responsibility of running the bar and managing the bar staff. I train the staff with regard to the licensing requirements, this includes information on underage sales and the refusal to sell alcohol to anyone that appears intoxicated. The staff all know they are not allowed to sell alcohol to anyone that is drunk or causing a nuisance, and that they must check for ID if they have any doubts as to age.

If we feel someone has had too much to drink we offer them water, and make the other members of staff aware to not serve them anymore alcohol. If anyone looks under age we always ask for their ID, however we do not usually have this problem, because our doormen check ID's before they allow people into the bar. We have a refusals book that we keep at the bar, which is completed by the staff on a daily basis.

Doug, our head doorman, also completes his own diary/refusal log every night after his shift. He enters any event that has occurred during the course of the night, including any refusals that he has had to make or any trouble that has arisen.

The whole of Longs has alarms positioned throughout, including remote points in the ceilings and stairs. Any of the staff can alert the doorman by pressing one, if a situation needs dealing with immediately. Our doormen are very efficient in dealing with issues, and I feel very comfortable as a female and as a manager to have them behind me and the rest of the staff. Mr Johnson, the doorman and the bar all have walkie talkies as well, so if there are any problems in the bar, the staff can alert the doorman by radioing it through.

Doug stands at the entrance to the club where he ID's people that want to come into the bar. He also chats with them to assess that they are not drunk. There is a buzzer on the door that Doug can press if he thinks the music from inside the bar is too loud. The buzzer goes straight to the DJ and he will turn the music down.

I recall an incident with PC Bethan Wood. Doug asked me to come upstairs and I had a chat with the police. PC Wood told me she wanted to come downstairs so I went with her and the other officer. They came behind the bar to where the CCTV station is situated and discussed issues such as music and the refusals book with me. PC Wood asked me questions about the CCTV. I said that I knew the basics and that the person that lived upstairs to the bar would assist if we needed any further help. She said it wasn't helpful not having someone who knows how to burn the disks off on the premises at all times, despite the fact in the past we have been asked by the police to provide recordings from the CCTV, but they have not come back to pick them up and then complain we are unhelpful.

The following night Andy and myself played back the CCTV from my encounter with PC Wood, I remember it clearly because I noticed that I was standing outside the bar with my arms crossed because it was very cold that night. The CCTV was working perfectly well, and we have never needed to record to disk anything imminently. A copy of the CCTV of PC Wood and the other officer, PC Bryant in the premises was given to Sergeant Amanda Barry, as the police returned the following night stating the CCTV had not been working, although they stood with me and watched it!

I believe that the bar is run efficiently and that there are not many disturbances or problems that have to be dealt with either by our door staff or the police. The police have never spoken to any of my bar staff, despite quoting they have been "working with the bar staff for years to no avail." There have been a few instances in the 4 years I have been working at Longs, but

I don't feel anymore than any other Licensed Premises in Lymington. Longs is easily made a scape goat, and when the other pubs shut, and Longs is the only place left open, I personally feel the police presence of sometimes 4 cars, is a little antagonizing to the customers. There has also been instances where I have called the police and they either do not arrive, or arrive after an incident.

One occasion a person off Pubwatch sneaked in through our back door (which has since been alarmed) the person is on Pubwatch for arson and violence, I was not happy with him being outside the premises let alone inside! I was made aware by PC Jason Eastwood who is the officer assigned to Pubwatch, that we should call the police if we had someone from the list in. So I called, about 1.10am. The phone operator said the police were 20 minutes away, and was the guy really causing an issue. I called them again 20 minutes later when the guy kicked off and pushed someone over. The police arrived at 1.40am after the guy had run away. I was trying to be preventative, and yet was hindered by the police.

We all work very hard to maintain a friendly and safe environment for people looking to carry on their evenings after the pubs close. I trust all my bar staff implicitly to uphold their training and feel comfortable having such efficient yet caring door staff. I take great insult to the idea that "Poor Management is at the root of the problems" as I think we run a very tight ship.

Longs is not just a business and a job, it is our very own little family.
