	There are 6 letters making representations from residents who reside in the vicinity, mainly concerned with the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective, but also the Prevention of Crime and Disorder.	Appendix 3
Prevention of Crime and Disorder	Extending the hours for the premises could result in increased drunkenness and associated anti-social behaviour.	
Public Nuisance	Noise emanates from the premises and overflows into objectors garden at the moment. The objector is prepared to accept noise until 23:00hrs. However, they vigorously object to any extension of time or further later activities at the premises.	
	The use of the rear garden for drinking and smoking is causing excessive disturbance to the residential properties within close proximity. The problem is further exacerbated when there is loud music as the doors and windows are left open to give access to the garden. The premises already remains open until 23:30hrs, which is felt to be late enough.	
	Due to the inside smoking ban, the garden of the premises is understandably used by customers for smoking. This means people smoke, drink, talk (due to the effects of alcohol - loudly) and play loud music. This is acceptable to residents until 23:00hrs during the week and midnight on Friday and Saturdays. However, local residents should be entitled to sleep without further disturbance after these times.	
	The premises are in close proximity to many residences and loud music and strident laughter associated with the existing licence, late at night are already excessive to the extent being a public nuisance.	
	It is felt that the licence should stipulate no music and alcohol sales after 22:30hrs.

Environmental Health (Pollution) Comments Relating to the Prevention of Public Nuisance

Thank you for consulting Environmental Protection.

A complaint about the Royal British Legion was received in 2009 due to doors being left open and live music being heard. This was dealt with in the licensing application for a minor variation to the premises where conditions were put on the premises licence to keep doors closed when regulated entertainment takes place.

Having spoken to the complainant from 2009 and more recently to one of those that have recently objected, it appears that the doors and windows are being left open during periods of regulated entertainment; however, this has not been substantiated by Environmental Protection.

Further comments were made concerning loud noise from patrons gathering in the patio area to the rear of the premises; however, again, this has not been substantiated by Environmental Protection.

If the increase in hours for the supply of alcohol were to be granted then this would appear to be contributing to a potential problem. The above comments need investigating and the granting of a further relaxation to this premises licence to increase the hours allowed for the supply of alcohol would appear to be unsatisfactory when there might be issue with the premises.

With regards to the above, I object to the increase in the hours to supply alcohol and the increase in regulated entertainment provision.

I also object to the increase in the provision of Regulated Entertainment when the above comments have not been fully investigated.

I write to register our objection to the hours of opening and sale of alcohol being extended, as requested in the above Licensing Application.

Our property adjoins the rear boundary of the Royal British Legion Lymington ("The Legion"). The Legion has a right of way through our garden, I believe intended as an escape route for patrons in the event of fire, but which is also used on an occasional basis by members of the Legion.

We find that noise in the Legion's garden carries clearly into our property. The garden is regularly used by members, I presume for smoking, and by their families. This use seems to be nearly always accompanied by long periods of very loud laughter, not from the children, but the adults. This is worse during weekends, when more people use the garden, and for longer hours. When music is being played that is also clearly heard, as doors are left open.

We would object to hours of opening and sale of alcohol being extended, which would increase and prolong the noise nuisance we currently experience. It would be good if something could be done to reduce this rather than increase it.

One feels that there are more than enough opportunities in the community to buy and consume alcohol, and that the value of quietness in the town during hours of sleep should be respected.

We trust the Application to extend these hours will be rejected.

- 1) Lymington does NOT need any more late night drinking venues, there is already much trouble in the town with people under the influence causing havoc and damage around the town after final closing time. Longs Wine Bar being a prime example as they have later closing than some other venues. When they are refused entry due to the state they are aleady in, they go on the rampage smashing car and shop windows and generally causing noise and mayhem.
- 2) People in the town do not want to be kept awake well into the early hours, plus with the very limited policing now there will be no stopping the trouble, and people living in the immediate vicinity will not have any peace of mind.

I have no problem with any extensions valid within the building,

The issue is environmental noise as a result of the use of the garden late at night, and also (understandably) open windows during hot summer evenings.

The conditions "to be agreed between the Applicant and Environmental Protection" outlined on Page 40 of your dossier would appear to address the issue.

However, in view of the problems which the RBL management already encounter in enforcing the existing licensing conditions, I agree with the Senior Environmental Health Officer that any relaxation of these conditions is likely to be detrimental to the environment for the residential property surrounding the Legion (particularly its garden).

I would stress that problems appear to be caused by some of the users of the RBL facilities, and are not condoned by the RBL management. I strongly support the aims of the RBL, but not to the extent of providing carte blanche for turning an existing nuisance into an aggravation.

In response to your specific questions:

- 1. I do not think a hearing is necessary, since the issue is very clear and simple.
- 2. I will not attend, and will not be represented at any hearing, for the same reason.

Following my telephone conversation today with your colleague Jane Bateman, I am writing to comment on the above Application.

Unfortunately, we will be away on the day of the Hearing and therefore unable to attend.

At this moment, we do not intend to have anyone to represent us.

However, we wish to ensure at least, that the conditions stated in Appendix1. (page 40) of the Hearing Documents will be imposed and enforced.

I understand that these conditions were imposed when the most recent variation to the license was applied for.. Nevertheless it is quite clear that the outside patio and garden area are still used by patrons (predominantly smokers) until the premises close at 23.30 or later at Weekends and Bank Holidays. It would appear that these conditions are impossible to enforce unless alternative arrangements can be made for smokers.

When we had cause to complain about the excessive noise from the garden area in September 2009, we made the point that following the erection of outside porches for smokers in March 2009, the noise level from the rear of the premises had increased significantly, particularly when live or disco music was being played at weekends and Bank Holidays as patrons constantly move from inside to the patio area outside in order to smoke and the doors remain open.

As you can read from other complainants, the neighbouring residential properties (about 12) all suffer from the same disturbance.

If the conditions referred to in Appendix1 are to be imposed and enforced, and no alcoholic drinks are taken into or consumed in the beer garden or patio areas after 23.00 hrs this will not stop smokers using these areas with the consequent loud voices and laughter which are so disturbing after 23.00. Any extension to licensing hours will undoubtedly exacerbate this problem, unless alternative arrangements can be made for smokers.

These are the reasons why we are against any extension to the existing licensing hours, which we feel are barely acceptable at present.

Further to our telephone conversation today, I have the following comments.

Unfortunately we will not be able to attend the Hearing on 26th September but wish to clarify that the existing conditions as stated in Appendix 1. (page 40) of the documents will be applied and enforced. When we had cause to make a complaint in September 2009, following the erection of outside porches for smokers, we stated that the noise level from the rear of the premises had increased significantly, particularly when live or disco music was being played at weekends and Bank Holidays and frequently until midnight or later.

In addition, strings of coloured lights had been installed as well as flood lights which affect neighbouring properties.

I understand that when the most recent license variation was applied for, the conditions stated in the Appendix 1, (above) were imposed.

Although we are rarely disturbed on weekdays, most Friday and Saturday nights, the garden and patio area are used by a number of patrons until 23.30 or occasionally later.

Depending on whether there is a Social Function or not, the numbers are from about 6 to about 20.. Needlesss to say by that time, after an evening of alcohol, the voices and laughter levels become quite unacceptable.

As you can read from other complainants, the neighbouring residential properties, (about 12) all suffer the same disturbances.

The most recent occasion we heard the hubbub from our bedroom, was last Friday, the 9th September. However, the outside area was closed shortly after 23.30.

Unless alternative arrangements can be made for smokers, I cannot see how this problem can be resolved unless the garden and patio area is closed at 23.00.

Even if smoking arrangements were made in the courtyard at the front of the premises, the flat above Tres Bon (occupied by one of their employees) would suffer, although this is the only residential property in that area, the adjacent building being Barclays Bank.

I hope these comments assist in your attempt to decline any further extension to licensing hours.

The Royal British Legion Club wish to make this statement to you in regard to our Licensing Application.

First and foremost the RBL Club believe our application has been misunderstood.

We only require a relaxation on our current Licence on an occasional Saturday night by an extra half hour.

We will apply this relaxation on function nights only.

These run at approximately 8 to 10 yearly.

We are a recently formed Committee this year who believe that RBL standards had deteriorated during the past few years and are striving to address this.

We operate and function as one unit for the welfare and wellbeing of the RBL Club and its patrons.

We have recently appointed a new Club Steward who agrees totally with the Committee's thoughts.

We recognise the concerns of our neighbours, and the environmental officer, and would welcome them into our Club if they have constructive suggestions on how to improve noise reduction.

Obviously the noise problem has increased since the ban on internal smoking and our garden is our only alternative.

To help noise reduction.

- 1.) We will continue to make sure our fire exit door and the windows in the dance hall are kept closed, as well as erecting a no exit sign after 7.00p.m.
- 2.) We will make sure the garden is clear by 11.00p.m.

- 3.) Fencing is being erected in part of the garden after a concern raised by one of our neighbours. But this was on a privacy issue caused by the clearing of the adjacent site. We believe this shows our good intentions as we had no responsibility to do this.
- 4.) The fencing could be continued when finances allow as well as noise inhibitors being considered.

Apart from the fencing issue we can recall of no other complaints or concerns being raised during the summer months when our garden is at its highest use. Obviously with the onset of winter our garden use will be negligible.

If a complaint had been received we believe the current Committee would have ensured it was dealt with in the correct manner.

In answer to Sarah Wilson's email we would like to clarify some of the facts.

1.) We apologise for any disturbance between 11.00 and 11.30 on the ninth of September.

We have live music on Saturdays so obviously this was not the issue. We usually cease the music played on Saturday at 11. 20 at the latest, although our music Licence gives us until 12.00.

The string of coloured lights (this is the second one) have been in place for over 20 years, as they are under the existing canopy and at least ten feet from the outside edge of the newer canopy put up for the smokers in 2009 we find it hard to see how they interfere with the other properties.

There is one floodlight in place, this also for some twenty years.

All lighting is to ensure the safety of our customers and staff or is part of an alarm system regarding intruders. Our single flood light is tripped by a sensor which switches it on for three or four minutes and can be adjusted or redirected. The majority of households have exactly the same type of system installed. We are staunch members of Pubwatch, and have CCTV cameras within the Club area. We will not have bad behaviour or excessive drinking either in the Club or out of it.

We do feel that there is some discrimination towards the RBL Club and that we are being penalised for our locality in which we have been situated since 1926.

All other licensed premises in the vicinity are all in a residential area just like us and have the opportunity to open until 1.00 or 2.00 am, and many play music until after 11.30p.m.

As mentioned the RBL Club has been located in the High street since 1926, and we have seen many houses erected around our perimeter during this time. We feel that we contribute a great deal, not only to the armed forces and local charities, but to our local community as well where people can come to socialise and when needed our welfare unit can help them. (This happens regularly) It also a place where ex service factions can meet and catch up with each other. Our bar income helps to aid all of this.

Over the past few months we have been praised many times by our visitors over the friendly atmosphere that exists within the Club. This has happened because we have been working hard to make it happen.

We have read all of the adverse comments made about us and frankly are at loss to understand the depth of bad feeling against us. We are truly not half as bad as we have been painted. We wish everyone who had a problem would have approached us and said something we sincerely hope they will in the future.

Finally to recap we would welcome thoughts to improve our noise reduction, but stress once again that our extension needs only equate to an extra half hour monthly.

With regard to noise we are at this time looking into internal glazing in the dance hall.
