Prevention of Crime and Disorder	There have been alleged acts of vandalism to property in the past to the objectors' property.	
	Concerns that the premises will become a night club in a rural setting and could not be correctly policed due to lack of resources.	
	Vandalism has already been suffered to machinery as well as trespassing. Bottles, glasses and even a beer barrel have been thrown into the fields presenting a hazard to livestock. A combine harvester wheel was punctured by a beer glass.	
	There is also a risk of lawlessness which the sale of alcohol for such extended periods of time will no doubt bring drunk and disorderly people in an unlit dark quiet area who could cause damage to properties.	
	Permitting alcohol sales in a premises which is only accessible by car is asking for much drunk driving in an area unprotected by police presence.	
	People would behave in a disorderly fashion when travelling to and from the venue and cause a nuisance, especially when under the influence of alcohol.	
	There are concerns that the premises will become like a late night premises in Ringwood which recently closed due to unruly behaviour. Drunken and disorderly people interfering with property belonging to residents and disturbing sleep and livestock in the vicinity is not required.	
	There are concerned about the potential for damage that could be cause by people under the influence of alcohol with very few people to witness who is doing the damage. Will there be extra policing in the area every night to make sure that everyone gets home safely?	

Public Nuisance

It is alleged that there are already violations of the existing conditions attached to the current licence. In particular there is often considerable noise nuisance during and after the permitted times. Conditions are difficult to enforce. It is not believed that by extending permissions of the licence as requested it will benefit footballer's interests or give any encouragement or assistance to young people to develop responsible behaviour. It will also exacerbate the existing littering and traffic problems.

In addition to this, there are concerns of more noise and disruptive behaviour should the existing licence be opened up to non club members.

Objection on grounds of noise from emanating from the premises. The extended hours would mean extended noise nuisance at all times of the night. Due to the flat nature of the land, noise does carry clearly for some considerable distance.

Concerns the problems previously encountered at Legends Club in Ringwood would be experienced in Long Lane.

By granting this licence, it will increase noise and light pollution, litter, increased traffic to the detriment of the surrounding neighbourhood. Already, considerable noise and disturbance is suffered. To be able to provide alcohol until 01:00hrs is likely to increase drunken and disorderly behaviour.

The objector alleges that they already have to put up with noise and often foul mouthed individuals who are probably worse for wear for drink; leaving the club late at night and granting this licence would only exacerbate the public nuisance and encourage a potentially greater anti-social element in the area.

In the flat open terrain, noise travels a long way and the usual disturbances emanating from licensed premises, especially at closing time would cause distress to a great number of people.

Concerns of increased traffic and noise. It is felt the premises should cease trading at a suitable hour to local residents.

As a resident we would be expected to endure noise individuals who are probably worse for wear leaving the premises late at night. Granting this licence would only exacerbate this and encourage a potentially greater anti-social element in the area. Will this be the place that young people will congregate to after the pubs have closed for the evening?

Concerns of increased disturbance from cars, motorbikes, people shouting cheering fighting, music being played arising from the premises licensed to sell intoxicating liquor during the night (beyond 23:00hrs). This would be intolerable in what is currently an area where residents can enjoy a peaceful night's sleep.

Public Safety

Long Lane is a narrow unlit country lane without a pavement which is felt unsuitable and possibly dangerous for increased late night traffic, vehicular or pedestrian.

There are serious risks of injury to people walking in unlit narrow country lanes especially when drivers will be unused to meeting walkers at night time. When parking is restricted, people are likely to be dropped off or to walk having parked their cars in neighbouring roads.

The access to the football ground is a narrow country lane which does not have the capacity to handle the increase in traffic.

The lane where the premises are situated has already had its share of accidents and to encourage a lot of late night traffic would create havoc.

Protection Of Children

Supermarkets have strict controls in selling age restricted products but they are professional retailers with much to lose if they flout the law. Football/Sports clubs are run largely by enthusiastic volunteers or club officials and no such controls can be guaranteed and the opportunity for minors to purchase and consume alcohol is virtually assured with all the consequences that can follow.

The objector feels that it would be irresponsible and morally wrong to be demonstrating acceptability of mixing sport with excessive drinking. This sets a poor example to children and young people who are important users of such sports facilities.

A letter covering outline details of the objections has been sent to Mr Simpson who was making the application on behalf of the club, asking if they intend to make any further adjustment to their application in the light of the objections received during the consultation process.	Appendix 4
The club have already reduced their request for late night refreshment to 01:00hrs and further details in the non-standard timings box and revised conditions with both the Police and Environmental Protection during the consultation period with Responsible Authorities, as detailed previously in Appendix 2.	
Further correspondence has been sent to all interested parties advising them of the amended application and the agreed conditions between the applicant and Responsible Authorities (Police & Environmental Protection), asking if they would now consider withdrawing their representation.	
Licensing Services received two complaints from residents alleging that the blue notice was not correctly displayed.	
Under the Licensing Act 2003, applicants are required to publish a notice in a local newspaper or, if there is none, in a local newsletter, circular or similar document circulating in the vicinity of the premises and also display a brief summary of the application on an A4 size blue notice immediately on or outside the premises.	
A copy of the advert notice which was placed in the newspaper has been sent to the licensing office and also a statement from the Licensing Enforcement Officer relating to his visits made to the premises upon receipt of these concerns raised by these residents.	

Conclusion

The Licensing Sub-Committee must, having regard to the representations, take such measures as it considers necessary to promote the licensing objectives. These being:

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
- · Public Safety;
- The Prevention of Public Nuisance:
- The Protection of Children from Harm

Recommendations

The licensing objectives are the only matters to be taken into account when determining applications.

The **options** available to the Licensing Sub-Committee are:

- Grant the licence with the conditions consistent with the operating schedule and the mandatory conditions of the LA2003 Act;
- Grant the licence but modify the conditions, restrict certain licensable activities or operating hours;
- Reject the whole or part of the application.

Our venue is football club with a bar and function room, it is the main football club in Ringwood and currently has a members licence. The main club hall can accommodate approximately 120 people and the football grounds provides sport for around 300 of the towns youth..

Training takes place in the evening during the week and matches take place on Saturdays and Sundays.

The bar is open after senior matches where adults are present and the room is used for the service of food and standing drinking.

The function room and licensed bar will be also used for functions such as weddings, wakes and christening parties as well as private parties where children may be invited.

The bar area will be open during permitted licensing hours and will be open to the public.

The venue is located in it's own grounds and is away from the town centre and residential accommodation, the nearest house being approx. ½ mile

# Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, e) (please read guidance note 9)

We intend to have a Personal License Holder on the premises or on call at all times when licensable activities take place. This ensures that a fully trained and compliant person is available at all times

We intend to work closely with the police, local authorities and the local residents to ensure that the impact of the change to a full licence is negligible and we are able to react to any concerning issues that may arise.

We intend to make sure that every person involved in the sale of alcohol takes course in Responsible Alcohol Retail and the licence holder will take the level 1 exam.

# b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The club has been operating for over 20 years without any disturbances and the change to a full licence will not change the general operating policy of the bar, it will give us the option to hold additional events which will be subject to controls as detailed below.

Marketing will not involve excessive drink price offers and we will actively promote safe drinking schemes, we will not serve anybody who appears to be drunk.

Any security staff employees either directly by the venue or through a security company will be SIA trained and budged or as per legislation. Appropriate numbers will be used based on the function.

Keep out excluded individuals (subject to court or pub watch bans)

No customers will be admitted, or permitted to leave when carrying open or sealed bottles or glasses

We will adopt and comply with the British Beer and Pub Associations Guidelines on On-Trade Promotions and work to the laws relating to drinks promotions as set out in the 2003 licensing act

The Designated Premises Supervisor, when present, and all members of staff shall ensure that all lawful instructions and /or directions given by the Police are complied with.

No drink shall be removed from the premises in an unsealed container.

There shall be in place for the premises a written policy to prevent the sale or supply of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age. That policy shall require any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years to produce a recognised proof of age card accredited under the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) or if a proof of age card is not available a photo driving licence or passport indicating that they are over 18 years of age.

Frequent collection of glasses and bottles will be undertaken to ensure that empty containers do not accumulate in or around the licensed premises

The licence holder and the Designated premises Supervisor shall ensure that the arrangement for the storage of empty bottles prevents unauthorised access to those bottles

The designated premises supervisor or the personal licence holder for the premises who is supervising the sale or supply of alcohol at that time shall not permit customers to congregate and consume alcohol sold or supplied by that premises in a public place within the immediate vicinity of the premises and in an area not so licensed for consumption to the annoyance or obstruction of others and shall prevent the removal of alcohol if it is intended for such a purpose.

There shall be placed at all exits from the premises in a place where they can be seen and easily read by the public, (or member and their guests) notices requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly. (Note, this may also include a reference to vehicles).

We shall participate in the local pubwatch/nightsafe scheme operating in the Borough/District

We will be responsible for the disposal of waste on the premises and make provision for the emptying of litter bins in the vicinity of the premises.



premises and ejections from the premises. The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that the refusals log is properly maintained and this shall involve, but is not limited to, nominating in writing a responsible person to check and sign it on a weekly basis.





We do already suffer regularly from noise from the club, and the extended hours they desire could cause noise and nuisance at all times of the night to properties in quite a large surrounding area. Because of the flat nature of the land here noise does carry clearly for a considerable distance.

This is a rural area, with livestock in nearby fields, and we feel it would be totally out of character to have premises with such an extended licence. We are also concerned that the problems recently with the Legends club in Ringwood town centre may also be experienced in Long Lane.

Long Lane is a narrow and unlit country lane, without a pavement, which we feel is unsuitable and possibly dangerous for increased late night traffic, either vehicular or pedestrian.

We hope you will be able to take our points into consideration when making your decision.



From the minutes of the Ringwood Town Council meeting on Wednesday 7th September. -

"Cllr Wiseman made a statement.

As representative of the south ward, she wanted to bring forward concerns that had been put to her by local people. Overall the main worry was that longer opening hours would bring further noise and nuisance to those nearby. This is an open and flat area, noise travels because it is windy and there's nothing to muffle the noise.

The request as detailed previously would change the hours considerably. Concerns were not only that this would change the type of club, but it would give youngsters the wrong messages. There were also fears that by opening much longer than the pubs they could draw the sort of problems that Legends created in Ringwood.

The club had not contacted any of the local people who spoke to her, over this issue or any other issue. They had failed to display a notice about the application applied for on 18/8/11, which is a requirement in law. They were repeatedly asked to keep the gate shut and locked yet as recently as Monday 3rd September it was unlocked and open.

Cllr Frampton said that as the landlord the Council needed to consider the impact which increased opening hours would have including litter and wear and tear on its property. He said it would be prudent to retain the existing hours; the change to the licence to allow non-members entry was a huge benefit already. He also felt that it would be enough to allow for up to 12 applications for temporary events with extended opening only for late night refreshments"

While not a member of the Leisure and Open Spaces Committee, I too endorse this opposition to any change in the licencing conditions. The football ground is quite close to dwellings and to a narrow road and as such not, I would have thought, a place for young people to be drinking; it is after all a football club, not a dining club. I would thus personally oppose any application for a liquor licence there, as there are plenty of pubs locally. However since a licence is is currently in force, then I would argue it should not be made any less stringent.

We have lived in Green Lane since 2003. We moved to the country for peace and quiet. The football club makes a lot of noise already. We have 5 children aged 3, 5, 9, 12 and 13. Several of them are already woken regularly by the noise created by the football club. This effects their education as they arrive at school tired.

I understand that there was a late night club in Ringwood that was shut down due to unruly behaviour. We get very little problems here at the moment (to my knowledge), and is one of the few areas that the police have reported no crime for many years – we would like to keep it that way. We certainly do not want drunken and disorderly people interfering with our property, or disturbing our sleep, or livestock, in the middle of the night.

Due to the rural location of the football club, I am also concerned about the potential for damage that could be caused by people under the influence of alcohol, with very few people to witness who is doing the damage. **Prevention of public nuisance** - as residents of Green Lane (next to Long Lane) I feel that activity at the football ground (cars coming and going, people talking/shouting, music, cheering if watching televised football) until 5am possibly 7 days a week would potentially create tremendous disturbance to local residents at very unsociable hours and greatly affect the enjoyment of what is currently a very quiet lane. We can at present hear activity whenever the football club is in use, but as this is only during the

Are we expected to believe that the customers will sip lemonade until 5 o'clock in the morning? Who would keep check on these licensing hours? Certainly not the Police whom we know are vastly over-stretched at night. What sporting occasions warrant serving to 5.00 am? I can only think of the Rugby World Cup and perhaps cricket in Australia

**Traffic.** The Clubhouse is situated in an open rural position on a narrow country lane. This lane already has its share of accidents, and to encourage a lot of late night traffic would create havoc.

On behalf of the members of the Crow Hill Residents' Association (whose Committee members are listed below), I write to object to the application for a Premises License by the Ringwood Town Football Club. As comments on this application are required by 19th September it has not been possible to contact all members of our Association but we are confident that the majority would overwhelmingly support our objection.

We would like to reiterate that we are not opposed to the football Club and believe that RTFC are benefiting young people by providing organised matches and training.

However, we urge you to refuse to grant the License RTFC seek on the following grounds:-

#### 1. Public Nuisance.

We believe that more frequent musical entertainment will increase the nuisance of noise, light pollution, litter and increased traffic to the detriment of the surrounding neighbourhood. Neighbours living adjacent to RTFC clubhouse and those living on surrounding higher ground already suffer considerable noise disturbance when musical

entertainment has been arranged, especially those properties without the benefit of double glazing.

#### 2. Crime and Disorder

RTFC probably intend to restrict attendance at functions at Long Lane but they may not be able to do so when young people realise they can drink after the local Pubs are closed. Mobile phones can summon large numbers of people at short notice. Serving drinks until 1am is likely to increase the possibility of drunken and disorderly behaviour.

#### 3. Risks to the Public

There is a serious risk of injury to people walking on unlit narrow country lanes especially when drivers will be unused to meeting walkers at night time. When parking is restricted, people are likely to be dropped off or to walk having parked their cars in neighbouring roads. This already happens for matches and training sessions.

- 4. Local people tolerate the occasional disruption caused to them by entertainment organised by RTFC but feel more confident, knowing that RTFC are in control of who is using their premises, and, that visitors to their Club are known to members. RTFC are obviously wishing to increase the number of events and widen attendance to the general public.
- 5. The site at Long Lane is sensitive in that it is in a rural setting and, we would argue, is unsuited to evening entertainment on a regular basis. There are animals kept close by. It's position within the Green Belt and 300yds from the New Forest National Park boundary, suggests a Licensed premises would be incompatible with the expectation of "peace and tranquillity" within the Park.

We trust that these comments will be taken into account by the Licensing Committee.

- It is alleged that there are already violations of the existing conditions attached to the current licence. In particular there is often considerable noise nuisance during and after the permitted times. Due to the flat nature of the land, noise does carry clearly for some considerable distance. Conditions are difficult to enforce. It is not believed that by extending permissions of the licence as requested it will benefit footballers interests or give any encouragement or assistance to young people to develop responsible behaviour. It will also exacerbate the existing littering and traffic problems.
- There have been alleged acts of vandalism to property in the past to the objectors property.
- The problems previously encountered at Legends Club in Ringwood would be experienced in Long Lane.
- By granting this licence, it will increase noise and light pollution, litter, increased traffic to the
  detriment of the surrounding neighbourhood. Already, considerable noise and disturbance
  is suffered. To be able to provide alcohol until 01:00hrs, is likely to increase drunken and
  disorderly behaviour.

- Supermarkets have strict controls in selling age restricted products but they are
  professional retailers with much to lose if they flout the law. Football/Sports clubs are run
  largely by enthusiastic volunteers or club officials and no such controls can be guaranteed

  the consequences that can follow.
- The premises will become a night club in a rural setting and could not be correctly policed due to lack of resources.
- Vandalism has already been suffered to machinery as well as trespassing. Bottles, glasses

As discussed, I attended Ringwood Town Football Club on the 12/9/11 at 1500hrs. I made a thorough inspection of the entrance to the club grounds I could see no trace of any Blue Notice displayed in said position. As far as I am aware this is the only entrance to the site. I was aware that the Club had made an application to have a Premises Licence that if granted, enabled them to sell alcohol. I took photographs of the entrance of the club which confirmed same. I then made my way to the club house & could see a Blue Notice displayed on the exterior as legally required. I took several further photographs. Shortly afterwards I was joined by a male who gave his name as Aubrey Hodder who said he was the Club Secretary, I introduced myself & said the purpose of my visit. He said that as far as he was aware Blue Notices had been displayed at the entrance to the Club but must have blown down due to the prevailing weather conditions. I said that these would have to be replaced as soon as possible as interested persons would have to enter onto private grounds to be made aware of the licensing application. He said that would be dealt with as a matter of urgency. I later received a telephone call from a Steven Simpson who said he was the chairman of the club & confirmed what had earlier been said to me by Mr Hodder

On the 14/9/11 at 1041hrs I returned to the club & saw two Blue Notices displayed at the entrance to same, containing the relevant licensing information. I took several photographs confirming my observations.

I have had no further dealings with the premises.
