There will be Challenge 25 Police operating at the premises. Challenge 25 meaning that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age, seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce means of identification acceptable to the Licensing Authority proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, so sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person. Challenge 25 posters shall

Protection Of Children	Historically there has been a problem in New Milton concerning children and youths under the age of eighteen managing to obtain alcohol and then drinking the same in the streets and in public areas. This has given rise to crime and disorder, public nuisance and issues regarding the protection of children from harm. Concerns for an increase in antisocial behaviour with children/young people drinking in the street. The new licence will only add to the existing problems and the area is already adequately catered for in the way of 3 off licences already in existence.



Application for a premises licence - 20 Station Road, New Milton

We write with reference to the application made by Dorset Licensing on behalf of Ibrahim Yildirim for a premises licence authorising the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises known at 20 Station Road, New Milton.

We are instructed by Mrs Vijiyamalini Selvanayagam who is the holder of the premises licence for Anglo Asian Food & Wines at 36 Station Road, New Milton and Mr Arulprasath Arulrajan who is the designated premises supervisor in respect of the same.

As the operators of a business in close proximity to the application site, our clients are interested parties entitled to make representations with regard to this application.

We have not seen a copy of the application form itself but we have been given a copy of a revised set of proposed licensing conditions, the original application having, as we understand it, been amended following discussions with Trading Standards.

As members of the Licensing Committee will no doubt be aware, historically there has been a problem in New Milton concerning children and youths under the age of eighteen managing to obtain alcohol and then drinking the same in the streets or other public areas. This in turn has given rise to issues of crime and disorder and public nuisance, quite apart from issues regarding protecting children from harm.

Such were the concerns that representations were made by both the Police and Trading Standards when this firm made an application for a new premises licence in respect of 36 Station Road.

That led to a hearing, following which although a licence was granted, it was made subject to a number of conditions.

We attach a copy of those conditions for the use of members of the Licensing Committee.

It will be seen that these include a number of conditions that are not proposed by the applicant in respect of 20 Station Road.

For example, condition 4 on the licence for 36 Station Road requires that "no alcohol shall be sold unless a personal licence holder is on duty at the premises."

Condition 5 prohibits the sale or advertising of alcohol as a loss leader;

Condition 6 restricts advertising of alcoholic products and

Condition 7 requires that all alcohol be displayed in clear view of the till point.

Further, condition 8 requires a minimum attendance by the designated premises supervisor and condition 9 relates to the disposal of waste.

Condition 10 and 11 deal with training but to a higher standard than would be required by the conditions proposed in respect of 20 Station Road.

If the Licensing Committee is minded to grant a licence in respect of 20 Station Road, it is respectfully suggested that given the locality and the specific problems that have been encountered historically, it would be right to impose the same sort of conditions to that licence.

However, that said, we respectively invite the Sub-committee to have regard to the number of premises in the immediate locality that are already licensed in respect of the sale of alcohol.

We are conscious of the fact that the Licensing Authority has not adopted a cumulative impact policy in respect of New Milton. However, national guidance makes it clear that notwithstanding the absence of such a policy, the Committee is entitled to have regard to the question of whether the grant of another licence in such an area is likely of itself to lead to issues of crime and disorder, public nuisance and/or protecting children from harm.

Further evidence will be submitted regarding the number of premises, their opening hours and the like and made available in good time for the hearing but on that basis, we would invite the Licensing Sub-committee to refuse this application.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Where licence authorises supply of alcohol:

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

(Additional Condition with effect from 1 October 2010)

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- a) General all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, e)
- b) The prevention of crime and disorder
- c) Public safety
- d) The prevention of public nuisance
- e) The protection of children from harm

nnex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

General condition:

- 1. The premises licence holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale of alcohol. The policy must require individuals who appear to be under 25 years of age to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark. Further the only acceptable forms of identification shall be a passport, driving licence, PASS approved card or such other means of identification as may be approved by the Police and/or Trading Standards from time to time.
- 2. CCTV shall be installed and maintained at the premises to the reasonable satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and the Police. The system shall include surveillance of both the internal and external areas of the premises including all entrances and exits. Recordings from the system shall be to a standard acceptable as evidence in a court of law and shall be securely retained for at least 31 days. Copies of the recordings in a playable format shall be provided to the Police and/or the Licensing Authority as soon as reasonably possible, on request. Signs shall be displayed within the premises advising customers of the presence of CCTV.
- 3. The CCTV system shall be in operation whenever the premises are open and selling alcohol. The senior member of staff present shall be capable of operating the CCTV system including in particular providing copies of recordings when requested to do so. If for any reason, the CCTV becomes inoperative, the sale of alcohol must cease until such times as the system is again functioning or a back up system is operating.
- 4. No alcohol shall be sold unless a Personal Licence holder is on duty at the premises,
- 5. No alcohol product shall be sold, offered for sale or advertised as a loss leader, in other words at less than its cost price or offered either free of charge or at a reduced price if bought at the same time as a product that does not contain alcohol.
- 6. No sign or advertisement shall be displayed either inside or outside the premises that compares the price of any alcoholic product with either a previous or future sale price and/or the price at which the same product may be purchased at other premises.
- 7. All alcohol shall be displayed in clear view of the till point.
- 8. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall be a person whose principal occupation is to work at the premises and who is on average (assessed on a monthly basis) physically present at the premises for at least 35 hours per week. If the Designated Premises Supervisor is for any reason other than normal holiday entitlements (that is 25 days per year) and absences caused by short term sick leave (that is leave of less than 7 consecutive days) unable to satisfy this condition, the sale of alcohol must cease until such a time as another Personal Licence holder who is able to comply with this condition is appointed as the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 9. No waste shall be placed outside the premises after 23:00hrs but nothing herein shall prevent waste from being placed outside before that time and left for collection the following morning.
- 10. Staff shall be trained in the licensing objectives, the conditions attaching to this licence, the age verification policy and other restricted or prohibited sales, such initial training shall be to at least NCPLH standard or equivalent. A record of such training shall be maintained on the premises and made available for inspection by the Licensing Authority and authorised persons upon reasonable request. Refresher training shall be provided at least every 3 months and a record maintained of the same; the refresher training shall be to the standard approved by Trading Standards from time to time (currently the HCC Trading Standards Age Restricted sales Retailer Pack).
- 11. Any member of staff who has not be trained (or received refresher training as detailed in condition 10 above) shall not be permitted to make any sale of alcohol unless the sale has been specifically and individually authorised by a Personal Licence holder or a Designated Premises Supervisor.

- 12_a Posters and signs shall be prominently displayed in the premises to publicise the age verification policy that is in place. These shall include appropriate signage on the entrances to the premises.
- 13. A refusals register shall be maintained on the premises to record all instances when a sale of alcohol is refused, for whatever reason. The register shall be checked by the Designated Premises Supervisor or his nominated deputy at least once a week and a note to that effect shall be recorded in the register. The register shall be made available for inspection by the Licensing Authority and other authorised persons upon request.

This letter is to notify you as agent for the above application, that four objections have been received to the proposals in the application to grant a premises licence.

The representations received are based on the protection of children from harm, prevention of public nuisance and crime and disorder and details are as follows:

- This area has already experienced the problems with young people drinking in the street and open spaces. The new licensed premises will only increase the availability of alcohol in the residential area in respect of the off licence sale which is already adequately catered for by the existence of 3 off licenses within very close proximity.
- Increased concerns by residents of anti-social behaviour and noise disturbance.
- Historically there has been a problem in New Milton concerning children and youths under the
 age of eighteen managing to obtain alcohol and then drinking the same in the streets and in
 public areas. This has given rise to crime and disorder, public nuisance and issues regarding
 the protection of children from harm.

In those cases where representations are made and not subsequently withdrawn a special Licensing Panel hearing will be arranged. The Panel will hear your application and the objections of those persons making representations. Following the hearing the Panel will decide the application.

b) The prevention of crime & disorder

CCTV

The premises shall have sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including outside the premises covering the entrance and exit. The system should be able to cope with strobe lighting and all levels off illumination throughout the premises as well as outside areas.

The CCTV System must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activities

All equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

The shall be sufficient members of trained staff available during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies on request of the Police or Local Authority. Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either disc of vhs.

The recording system will be able to capture a minimum of four frames per second.

Records must be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being security retained.

CCTV warning signs to be fitted in Public Places.

Recordings to be kept for a minimum of 28 days.

The DPS or Premises Manager must be able to demonstrate that the CCTV System has measured to prevent recordings being tampered with, i.e. Password protected.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the premises licence holder/DPS must report the failure to the Police on contact number immediately.

c) We will endeavour to ensure that the premises are safe both for staff and the general public. All Fire Authority recommendations regarding the siting and maintenance of fire appliances will be complied with and a Fire Risk Assessment undertaken.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

INCIDENT BOOK

A incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises and there will; be a daily debrief of doorstaff (where used) at the close of business which will be evidence in writing. The incident book will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to Police & Trading Standards on request. The book shall detail in brief, incident of injury/ejection/refusal/drug misuse/ seizure/age challenge. Such matters shall be timed, dated and signed by the author and produced to Police/Authorised Officers/Trading Standards on demand.

REFUSALS BOOK

A refusals book to be kept detailing numbers dated and times of incidents and description of people refused service of alcohol with reasons why(including incidents relating to disorder) to the reasonable satisfaction of Hampshire Trading Standards. The incident book will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to Authorised Officers off Hampshire Trading Standards & Hampshire Constabulary on request. A responsible person will check and sign it on a weekly basis.

e) The protection of children from harm

CHALLENGE 25

There will be a Challenge 25 Policy operated at the premises. Challenge 25 meaning that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 25 years of age, seeking to purchase or supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce means of identification acceptable to Licensing Authority proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, so sale of supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person. Challenge 25 posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

STAFF TRAINING

Staff are trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under te age of 18, that records are kept of such training, which are signed and dated by the member of staff who has received the training, that staff receive refresher training every three months as a minimum and that records are signed and dated by the member of staff are kept of those refresher training. Records will be available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary, the Licensing Authority and Hampshire County Council Trading Standards.
