



 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section:
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

(Additional Condition with effect from 1 October 2010)

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Dear Stephen,

Thank you for taking time to talk with me earlier. I have taken time to consider your current application and the existing licence. The current premises licence does not indicate how the licensing objectives are supported, and as the application advises that no additional steps are proposed. I would be grateful if you could consider adding the below conditions to the licence. Support of the licensing objectives (the prevention of crime & disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm) is imperative and it is commonplace for a premises to set out in the operating schedule just how the objectives are going to be upheld.

Staff Training

Staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.

All staff will receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and that records are to be kept of this refresher training which should be signed and dated by the member of staff who received that training.

All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and the licensing Authority upon request. Training records will be kept for a minimum period of

two years. Training records will be kept on the licensed premises to which they relate to

Crullenge 25

There will be a Challenge 25 policy operating at the premises. Challenge 25 means that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual, who visually appears to be under 25 years of age and is seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at the premises or from the premises, shall produce identification proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older.

Acceptable identification for the purposes of age verification will include a driving licence, passport or photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the persons date of birth.

If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person

Incident Book

An incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises. It will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police for inspection upon request.

Any incidents that include physical altercation or disorder, physical ejection, injury, id seizure or drug misuse will be recorded in the incident book. The entry is to include an account of the incident and the identity of all person(s) involved (or descriptions of those involved if identity is not known). Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and the public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party. The entry shall be timed, dated and signed by the author.

If the member of staff creating the entry has difficulties reading or writing then the entry may be written by another staff member. This should however be read back to the person creating the entry and counter signed by the person who wrote the entry

At the close of business on each day the incident hook will be checked by the manager on duty where any entries will be reviewed and signed. If incidents have occurred the duty manager will de-brief door staff at the close of business. Should there he no incidents then this will also he recorded at the close of business in the incident book.

Refusals Book

A refusals book will be kept and maintained at the premises and will be available for police inspection upon request. All refusals for the sale of alcohol and the reasons for refusal should be recorded. Any age challenge or identification seizures should also be recorded.

These may seem stringent however, in practise I would recommend using a simple diarised book to incorporate the Incidents/Refusals (and I would be quite happy to meet up with you to go through this, and any staff training you would like to conduct). Challenge 25 is supported by the Home Office and I am able to provide you with literature in support of this.

CCTV is something that can be of great benefit to premises; it protects staff in the event of allegations regarding short change/assaults/theft etc, and also assists any police investigations into these things as the 'camera never lies'. I haven't attached a copy of the CCTV condition that we sometimes add as I am keen to know your thoughts on whether CCTV is a possibility at the moment, and to what extent this might be (just the till/entrance/exit for example).

I look forward to hearing from you.

I refer to the above application for a variation of the existing licence, to extend to on sales for the hours of 8.00 until 23.00.

The council has grave concern for the sales of alcohol on the premises for such long period of time during every day (with marginally shorter hours on Sundays).

The council has consistently for several years been resisting successfully such blanket licences in the village. The village has already substantial provision of licensed premises, but has a plethora of visitors during particularly the summer months, and the premises are located in the centre of the village in an area without pavements, where currently traffic can pass at 30mph. We are particularly concerned for public safety in this regard, if late night drinkers were coming out into the road in a dark unlit area.

The school children currently visit the premises and pass the premises during the daytime and there is a significant risk that under age drinking may occur in a premises that otherwise would be one they would tend to visit, as opposed to an actual restaurant or a pub.

At present licensed premises open regularly in the evening are located at the top end of the village with their own car parks. Visitors to these premises must pass other premises on the main road or in the Mall to reach cars, and there would be considerable temptation for criminal or vandalous behaviour on route. The village is most anxious not to encourage it to be a place that is visited for the purpose of late night drinking.

The premises might at present be used as a tea room for mid day and afternoon food only, but it has been for sale and may well still be for sale. Any buyer could easily change the nature of the premises radically without the necessity to vary the licence. The precedent would have been set.
