2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST.

4. MINUTES (REPORT A).

5. TO CONSIDER THE APPLICATION FOR A RENEWAL OF A COMBINED HACKNEY AND PRIVATE HIRE VEHICLE DRIVER'S LICENCE (REPORT B).

The Sub-Committee considered an application for a renewal of a Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Driver Licence.

The application had been put before the Sub-Committee because the Applicant had been convicted on 4 March 2011 for an offence of 'Driving a Motor Vehicle with Excess Alcohol' committed on the 17 February 2011. The sentence imposed was disqualification from driving for 16 months (which was subsequently reduced by 4 months on 1 July 2011 for completing a course).

The Licensing Officer and the Applicant presented their respective cases and responded to Members' questions.

The Licensing Officer and the Applicant then withdrew, while the Sub-Committee deliberated the matter.

The Sub-Committee considered the Council's guidelines relating to the relevance of convictions for driving a motor vehicle with excess alcohol when determining applications of this nature. These guidelines state that an applicant shall not normally be granted a licence in such circumstances unless three years have elapsed since the restoration of the driving licence to that applicant. The guidelines also confirm that the overriding consideration is the protection of the public.

In coming to their decision, the Sub-Committee whilst mindful of the representations made by the Applicant, were of the view that in light of the nature and recentness of the relevant conviction, the Applicant was not a fit and proper person to hold a Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Drivers Licence.

As such it was,

RESOLVED:

That the application for renewal of the Applicant's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Driver Licence be refused.
