## 6. Decision of the Sub-Committee

That no action be taken in respect of the review application.

## 7. Reasons for the Decision

The parties agreed that the documentary and oral evidence presented in connection with the application to transfer the premises licence to Shahed Miah (heard 9 December 2014 at 10:00am) be taken into account by the Sub-Committee. Neither party presented any additional evidence in connection with the application by Hampshire Constabulary for a review of the premises licence. In light of the fact that the premises licence had been transferred to Mr Shahed Miah, following the Sub-Committee's decision at the hearing of the transfer application that this would not undermine the crime prevention objective, the police advised that they were no longer seeking revocation of the premises licence.

The police suggested that conditions be attached to the premises licence: 1) that Mr Anwar Hussain should not be permitted to have any financial involvement with the premises; and 2) that the premises licence holder must retain records of the identifications checks carried out on staff.

The Sub-Committee declined to impose a condition limiting Mr Anwar Hussain's financial involvement with the premises on the ground that this was not appropriate to promote the licencing objectives. With regard to the proposed condition requiring that the premises licence holder retain records of identification checks carried out on staff, the police confirmed that this was a legal requirement for all employers. The Sub-Committee therefore declined to impose it as a condition on the premises licence, because the premises licence holder would be obliged to keep such records in any event.

The Sub-Committee therefore concluded that no action should be taken in respect of the application for review of the premises licence.
