APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE – 6 BARRELS-31 SALISBURY ROAD, TOTTON.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The purpose of the report is to provide Members with information at the hearing to determine an application for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. The premises is located at 31 Salisbury Road, Totton, SO40 3HX. The premises will be called 6 Barrels.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The new business venture is situated in a row of shops on Salisbury Road. The premises are currently licenced and have operated as a Thai restaurant since 20 September 2017. The current licence permits live and recorded music and sales of alcohol between 12:00 to 23:30 daily (On and off sales permitted). The opening hours are the same. In addition, late night refreshment has been provided from 23:00 to 23:30.
- 2.2 A location plan of the premises is provided at **Appendix 1**.
- 2.3 As the new business varies in operation to a restaurant, the Premises Licence Holder (K&S Trading1) is applying for a new licence which reflects the style of operation of this new venture, together with a change to the trading hours.
- 2.4 The current application describes the premises as a Micro-pub selling craft ales, lager, cider, wine, spirits, hot drinks and soft drinks and bar snacks.
- 2.5 There will be seating for approximately 40 persons inside the premises with some provision for outside seating within a roped-off area to the front of the premises. However, the Applicant has stated that the use of this outside seating will cease at 22:00 each day.
- 2.6 The property is situated in a row of shops on a service road which is parallel to the main A36. Limited parking is available on the road in front of the shops and there is also a large public car park opposite. There is a variety of retail units in the area, including a pizza takeaway which is open until 23:30 each night and midnight on Friday and Saturdays.
- 2.7 The premises benefit from a recently granted planning permission which permits the proposed activities and timings. A copy of the permission is provided as **Appendix 2**.
- 2.8 Photographs of the property and immediate location are provided for members as **Appendix 3**.

3. THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 On 4 September 2019 New Forest District Council received an application for a new premises licence from K&S Trading1 Ltd. The application is attached as **Appendix 4**. (blank pages removed).
- 3.2 The application seeks permission for the following:-
- Live music, recorded music, performance of dance and supply of alcohol From 12:00 to 00:00 daily (on and off premises sales);
 - Late night refreshment from 23:00 to 00:00 daily; and
 - Opening hours from 12:00 to 00:00 daily
- 3.3 The Applicant has also requested an additional hour in respect of all licensable activities and opening hours on Christmas Eve, New Year's Eve and Bank Holidays.
- 3.4 The planning permission for the site (**Appendix 2**) currently includes a condition that:
- 'No activity shall take place on the site in connection with the approved use other than between the following hours of 11.00am and 12.00 midnight, Monday to Sunday and Bank Holidays.'
- 3.5 The Applicant has submitted a number of conditions which would be attached to any licence granted. These include staff training, an age verification policy, CCTV, control of patrons outside the premises and limitation on the time that the outside seating area can be used.
- 3.6 Public consultation as required by the Licensing Act 2003 has been correctly carried out and the application has been advertised both on the premises and in the local newspaper.

4. REQUIREMENTS FOR A HEARING

- 4.1 The Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to determine the application where relevant representations are made regarding the likely effect of the grant of the premises licence on the promotion of the licensing objectives. These are:
- 1) The prevention of Crime and Disorder;
 - 2) Public safety;
 - 3) The prevention of public nuisance;
 - 4) The protection of children from harm.
- 4.2 Members are referred to statutory guidance issued by the Home Office under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 dated April 2018.

- 4.3 In determining the application, the Licensing Sub-Committee must give appropriate weight to:
- 1) The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;
 - 2) The relevant representations presented by all the parties;
 - 3) The Home Office guidance;
 - 4) The Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy.

5. REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED

- 5.1 During the representation period, the Licensing Authority received two representations against the application. One from a member of the public and one from Totton and Eling Town Council, who discussed the application at a Town Council meeting. These are provided at **Appendix 5**.
- 5.2 Members will note from the location plan at **Appendix 1** that the resident who has raised an objection lives a distance from the premises. However, the Licensing Act 2003 no longer refers to "vicinity", in relation to relevant persons who can submit a representation against a premises application. Therefore, any individual, body or business is entitled to make representations to licensing authorities in relation to applications for the grant of a premises licence regardless of their geographic proximity to the premises.
- 5.3 The representations raise a number of concerns about the impact of the application on the licensing objectives. These being that the serving of alcohol until midnight will cause disorder, threats to the public using the businesses next door, noise from the business, disturbance from patrons and that the location is not suitable for late hours of operation applied for.
- 5.4 There are no representations from any of the responsible authorities consulted, however the Police Licensing Officer requested that a number of additional conditions be placed on any licence granted for the premises. The Applicant agreed to these and they are provided as **Appendix 6**.

6. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.
- 6.2 The Applicant and those parties making representations have been invited to this hearing and have been provided with this report and the procedures to be followed at the hearing.
- 6.3 The Applicant and those who have made relevant representations are entitled to address the Sub Committee and to ask questions of the other party as set out in the procedure.

7. RIGHT OF APPEAL

- 7.1 It should be noted that the Applicant and those who have made relevant representations may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub-Committee to the Magistrates' Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 7.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub-Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.

8. CONCLUSION

8.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations and consider which of the following measures are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. Members may therefore:

- 1) Grant the licence as applied for. To include Police and applicant conditions modified to such extent as the Sub-Committee considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives;
- 2) Grant the licence but exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates; or
- 3) Reject the application.

9. RECOMMENDATION

9.1 That the Licensing Sub-Committee determines the application.

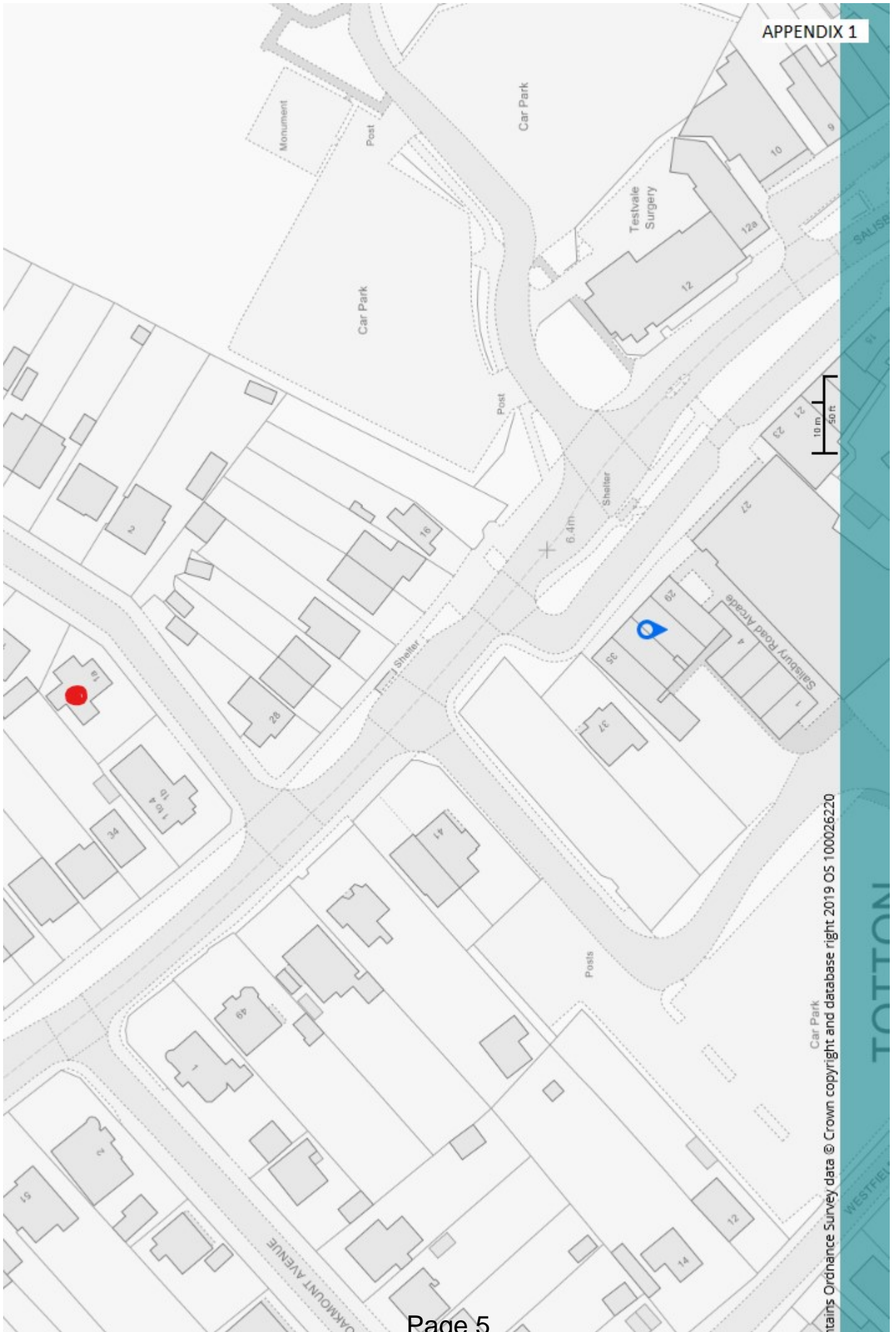

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

All staff will be trained appropriately including Challenge 25 directives, Staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. Our experienced manager and DPS Michelle Manser will oversee all training and ensure all staff are constantly up to date. A record book, refusals book and incident book will be kept and filled in appropriately.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

There shall be in place for the premises a written policy to prevent the sale or supply of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age. No nuisance shall be caused by noise coming from the premises or by vibration transmitted through the structure of the premises, CCTV will be in operation at all times. **No licensable activities to take place in the outside seating area after 10pm each day.**

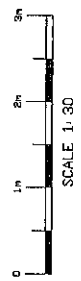

CCTV

The premises shall have sufficient cameras located within the premises to cover all public areas including outside of the premises covering the entrance and exit. The system will be able to cope with strobe lighting (where used) and all levels of illumination throughout the premises as well as outside areas.

CCTV warning signs to be fitted in public places.

The CCTV system must be operating at all times whilst the premises are open for licensable activity. All equipment shall have a constant and accurate time and date generation.

The recording system will be able to capture a minimum of 4 frames per second and all recorded footage must be securely retained for a minimum of 28 days.

Records must be made on a weekly basis and kept for inspection to show that the system is functioning correctly and that data is being securely retained.

The DPS or premises manager must be able to demonstrate that the CCTV system has measures to prevent recordings being tampered with, i.e. password protected.

There shall be sufficient members of trained staff at the premises during operating hours to be able to provide viewable copies immediately to police on request when investigating allegations of offences or criminal activity.

Any images recovered must be in a format which can be viewed on readily available equipment without the need for specialist software.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST report the failure to the Hampshire Western Police Licensing Unit within 24 hours.

Training

Staff will be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the signs and symptoms of drunk persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication. Records will be kept of such training which must be signed and dated by the member of staff who has received that training.

All staff will receive refresher training every six months as a minimum and records are to be kept of this refresher training which should be signed and dated by the member of staff who received that training.

In addition to their training a written test related to the training given will be conducted before the staff member is permitted to sell or authorise alcohol. The test will consist of a minimum of ten questions of which the pass rate is 80%. Anyone who fails to reach the prescribed pass rate will be retrained and re-tested. Anyone not attaining the pass rate will not be permitted to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol until the pass rate is attained. There will be a minimum of two sets of questions to be used in the training which will be rotated upon each subsequent six month training session.

All training records will be made immediately available for inspection by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible Authority upon request. Training records will be kept for a minimum period of two years.

Training records will be kept on the licensed premises to which they relate to.

Challenge 25

There will be a Challenge 25 policy operating at the premises. Challenge 25 means that the holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual, who visually appears to be under 25 years of age and is seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at the premises or from the premises, shall produce identification proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older.

Acceptable identification for the purposes of age verification will include a driving licence, passport or photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the persons date of birth.

If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.

'Challenge 25' posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

Incident book

An incident book will be provided and maintained at the premises. It will remain on the premises at all times and will be available to police for inspection upon request.

Any incidents that include physical altercation or disorder, physical ejection, injury, id seizure or drug misuse will be recorded in the incident book. The entry is to include an account of the incident and the identity of all person(s) involved (or descriptions of those involved if identity is not known). Should there be any physical interaction by members of staff and the public the entry will include what physical action occurred between each party. The entry shall be timed, dated and signed by the author.

If the member of staff creating the entry has difficulties reading or writing then the entry may be written by another staff member. This should however be read back to the person creating the entry and counter signed by the person who wrote the entry.

At the close of business on each day the incident book will be checked by the manager on duty where any entries will be reviewed and signed. If incidents have occurred the duty manager will de-brief door staff at the close of business. Should there be no incidents then this will also be recorded at the close of business in the incident book. This record will be retained for 12 months.

Refusals book

A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to sell alcohol. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the refusals log is checked, signed and dated on a weekly basis by the store manager/manageress.

The refusals log will be kept and maintained at the premises and will be available for inspection immediately upon request by Hampshire Constabulary and any responsible authority.

The record of refusals will be retained for 12 months.

Licensable areas

No licensable activities will take place in the outside seating area after 2200 hours. The area shall be permitted to be a smoking area.

Off sales

All sales of alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be supplied in sealed containers.
