# APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE MINSTEAD LODGE, SEAMANS LANE, MINSTEAD, LYNDHURST, SO43 7FT

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The purpose of the report is to provide the Sub-Committee with information at the hearing to determine the application for a new premises licence in respect of Minstead Lodge, Seamans Lane, Minstead, SO43 7FT

#### 2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 2.1 That the Licensing Sub-Committee determines the application for a new premises licence as provided at **Appendix 1**, which has been submitted in accordance with section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act").
- 2.2 Under section 18 of the Act, the Sub-Committee may determine the application as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and select from the following options:-
  - Grant the application as applied for, subject to conditions which are consistent
    with the operating schedule accompanying the application and modified to such
    extent as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing
    objectives; and any condition which must be included in the licence in accordance
    with the Act:
  - Refuse the application;,
  - Exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
  - Refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor.

# 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The premises site is the administrative headquarters for the Minstead Trust, a charitable organisation that provides support for adults with learning difficulties. It is a registered charity (No 1053319) and has been in existence for a number of years.
- 3.2 The Trust supports a number of sites across the New Forest and beyond, all with the same aim, supporting and encouraging adults with learning difficulties to integrate, meet friends and to interact with others. Tea rooms, cafes and performance spaces provide training in hospitality together with outdoor activities such as the maintenance of the gardens at the sites and Furzey Gardens which is open to the general public. Sites managed by the Trust are:-
  - Hanger Farm Arts Centre-Totton,
  - Furzey Gardens-Minstead,
  - · Brickyard Café-Brickworks at Burseldon and
  - Lily and Lime-Portsmouth.
- 3.3 The site at Hanger Farm has held a premises licence, granted by this Authority, for the sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment since 2009. The terminal hour for the premises is midnight, however, as with all premises licences granted under the Act, this is the latest a premises may operate. Any premises may close earlier, on any occasion. Mr Kyle Maxwell is the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) at Hanger Farm and the application for Minstead Lodge also proposes Mr Maxwell as DPS for this premises.

3.4 Minstead Lodge has previously catered for weddings using Temporary Event Notices (TEN) and, in the past, may have allowed "Bring your own alcohol" ("BYO"), for which no payment is made and is therefore not licensable. Other events held at the site may have also involved music which was exempt from licensing requirements, or conferences where there is no licensable activity.

#### 4. THE APPLICATION

- 4.1 The Licensing Authority has received an application for a new premises licence from Minstead Trust ("the applicant"), submitted by Mr Maxwell, the Events and Hospitality Manager for the site. The application is attached in **Appendix 1.**
- 4.2 The application seeks permission for the following licensable activity:-

# Sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Sunday-10:00hrs to 23:00hrs and Thursday, Friday, and Saturday -10:00hrs to 23:30hrs.

Requested opening hours for the site are:

All days-09:00hrs to 24:00hrs.

The site will not be open to the general public, but for events only.

- 4.3 The application seeks only to provide the sale of alcohol at the site. Any regulated entertainment that takes place between 08:00hrs and 23:00hrs is exempt from the requirement to be licensed.
- 4.4 The application states that Minstead Lodge is the administrative headquarters of the Minstead Trust and the application seeks to provide the sale of alcohol to guests attending functions and weddings, to support the income of the charitable trust.
- 4.5 Currently, the premises may hold functions, weddings and events under the TEN process, which allows up to 20 events with licensable activities per year. These are usually applied for and organised by external caterers and are subject to individual fees. Only the Police or Environmental Health may object to the grant of a TEN.
- 4.6 The plans submitted to support the application are provided as **Appendix 2** and to assist Members, photographs taken at the site by the Licensing Manager are provided as **Appendix 3**.
- 4.7 A map indicating the locations of those making representations, Minstead Lodge and the nearby pub is provided as **Appendix 4.** Distances of representation addresses are included as **Appendix 5**.
- 4.8 The applicant has submitted a number of conditions that would be attached to any licence granted for the site. These can be found in the application form (**Appendix 1**). No additional conditions were requested by any of the Responsible Authorities during the consultation process.
- 4.9 Public consultation has been carried out as required under the Act and officers have confirmed that the application has been advertised both at the site and in the local newspaper.

## 5. REQUIREMENTS FOR A HEARING

- 5.1 The Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to determine the application where relevant representations addressing the licensing objectives are made. These objectives being:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder;
  - Public safety;
  - The prevention of public nuisance; and
  - The protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 The Sub-Committee is referred to statutory guidance issued by the Home Office under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 dated April 2018, in particular the sections on the licensing objectives and determining applications.

- 5.3 In determining the application, the Licensing Sub-Committee must give appropriate weight to:
  - The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;
  - The relevant representations presented by all parties;
  - Home Office guidance:
  - The Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy.

#### 6. REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED

- 6.1 During the representation period, the Licensing Authority received 34 relevant representations from members of the public who live locally and 1 from the Parish Council.
- 6.2 Representations received against the application raise concerns about the implications of granting a licence for the premises and are provided as **Appendix 6**.
- 6.3 For the purposes of the Act and promotion of the licensing objectives, those objections that are considered relevant and therefore engage the Sub-Committee's discretion, fall into the following areas:
  - Concerns by residents about the frequency of events at the premises, (the application currently seeks the licensable activity on all days),
  - The operating hours requested on the application,
  - Noise from guests that have drunk alcohol,
  - Noise from guests who are enjoying the outside areas,
  - Noise from music (however this does not form part of the application),
  - Effects on vulnerable adults on the site.
- 6.4 Comments on issues such as transport, road layout, highways, impact on water courses, sewerage, wild camping, impact on wildlife and animals, whether there is the "need" for additional licensed premises or moral objections to alcohol consumption are not considered as relevant under the scope of the Act.
- 6.5 In addition, comments regarding fire safety are not considered as relevant as this is regulated under specific fire safety legislation. Fire risk assessments must be in place to meet existing legal requirements and obligations on behalf of the trust who own the building.

- 6.6 There are a large number of similarly worded representations, many of which refer to issues outside the scope of this application and may not form part of the determination. This also includes the effect of the sale of alcohol in a rural location leading to the risk of customers driving under the influence of alcohol. This of course is illegal, however there are many licensed premises in the Forest in similar rural settings which are licensed for the sale of alcohol and in most cases with more extensive hours. There is also a well-established and frequented pub in Minstead.
- 6.7 Those attending the venue will be aware of its rural location and the fact that they will have to make arrangements to travel to and from the site. Some will choose to drive, whilst others may be given a lift or travel by taxi.
- 6.8 All the Responsible Authorities have been consulted, (including NFDC and NPA planning departments) and no comments or objections have been received to the application. Environmental Health also confirmed that there are no noise complaints recorded against the premises and made no comment or objection received during the consultation process.
- 6.9 With regard to planning consents or restrictions, any licence granted does not override planning restrictions that may be in place. Licensing and planning are two separate regulatory regimes and must be treated as such. Any change of use or other planning requirement must be addressed separately, and to the correct authority.
- 6.10 The Act's four licensing objectives apply only to the premises and curtilage of a venue and not to the surrounding area.

# 7. THE HEARING

- 7.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005. These Regulations provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.
- 7.2 The applicant and those parties making representations have been invited to this hearing and have been provided with this report and the procedures to be followed at the hearing.
- 7.3 The applicant and those who have made relevant representations are entitled to address the Sub-Committee and to ask questions of the other party, with the consent of the Sub-Committee.

#### 8. RIGHT OF APPEAL

- 8.1 It should be noted that the applicant and those who have made relevant representations may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub-Committee to the Magistrates' Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 8.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub-Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and the decision made by the Magistrates' Court

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

Minstead Lodge is an impressive facility that commands respect from its users. Management at Minstead Trust shall ensure that at all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the licence and for preventing crime and disorder. Minstead Trust shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Management at Minstead Trust will work in partnership with local police authorities to minimise the potential for crime and disorder situations to occur. Staff will be vigilant to unacceptable behaviour from guests & patrons. Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police.

c) Public safety

Management at Minstead Trust will ensure appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers (foam, H2O and CO2), fire blanket, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting. All appliances are inspected annually. All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Minstead Lodge is a safe and family friendly environment. All customers will be asked to leave quietly. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, photographic driving licence or passport, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer. All staff will be trained for underage sales prevention regularly.

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#### NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

#### Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the
  holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see
  note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport
  as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national
  of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
  indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
  indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
  the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
  Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document
  giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency
  or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in
  combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their
  name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the
  holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to
  the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
  Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
  residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
  with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
  subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
  when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
  number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2)
  of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a
  European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has
  derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
  with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
  reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
  decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
  who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
  the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one
    of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
    - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
    - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
    - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
    - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an \$1, \$2 or \$3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

#### Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.




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

#### **Licensing Act 2003**

#### Representation form and guidance-Other persons

Under the Licensing Act 2003 objections can be raised against an application for a new premises licence or a variation of an existing licence.

The term used in the 2003 Act, regulations, and associated guidance is not "objections" but "representations".

All representations must be relevant to at least one of the licensing objectives:-

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance
- the protection of children from harm

Once an application for a premises licence has been accepted by the licensing authority, responsible authorities and other persons have 28 days starting on the day after the application is accepted to make representations.

Responsible authorities are the bodies that must be fully notified of applications and who are entitled to make representations to the licensing authority in relation to the application for the grant, variation or review of a premises licence. Responsible Authorities are:-

- Licensing Authority
- Police
- Environmental Protection
- Trading Standards
- Local Safeguarding Children's Board
- Health & Safety
- Fire & Rescue Service
- Local Planning Authority
- Maritime & Coastguard Agency (if applicable)
- Public Health

As well as responsible authorities, any "other person" can make representations. It is also possible for a person to request that a representative makes a representation on their behalf – for example, a Member of Parliament or a local ward or parish councillor.

In addition to being relevant, representations must not be vexatious or frivolous and can be rejected on this basis.

If a licensing authority decides that representations are relevant, it must hold a hearing to consider them. The need for a hearing can only be avoided with the agreement of

the licensing authority, the applicant and all of the persons/agencies making relevant representations.

In determining an application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, in the overall interests of the local community, the licensing authority must give appropriate weight to:

- the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;
- the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties;
- Statutory Guidance;
- its own statement of licensing policy.

Representations must be made in writing and emailed or posted to Licensing Services. They may be amplified at the hearing or may stand in their own right. Additional points, which are not referred to in the original representation received during the 28 day period may not be referred to at the hearing. However if there are any additional documents that refer to the original matters that you wish to be included, these must be sent to Licensing Services at least 5 days before the hearing.

#### Planning and other issues

Unfortunately representations that concern traffic or parking cannot be accepted. This is because the licence holder cannot be held responsible for the use of the public highway outside of the premises. The licensing regime is separate from other local government functions including planning. If a premises licence is granted for the building this will not exempt the licence holder from having to obtain the necessary planning permission. We are therefore unable to accept representations that simply refer to the need for planning permission or refer to parking or an increase in traffic movements. These are issues that are considered when planning permission to use a building for an activity is considered.

It is recommended that representations are made on the following form.

NFDC and NFPA policy - in relation noise, light and effluent pollution (NFDC records suggest that that the sewage treatment works was installed in 1988 and by implication appropriate, at that time, to the requirements of a Residential Training College.

In the absence of appropriate hotel accommodation – which would require a change of use and compliance with relevant regulations, guests, many of whom will, by the very nature of the event outline in the application, having consumed alcohol, will be obliged to leave the venue, drive down very narrow lanes to alternative accommodation.

In these circumstances the NFDC is invited to consider the degree to which the granting of a licence may, in addition to increasing the possibility of drink driving -public disorder, also place the licensing authority at risk, for example in case of a fatal fire, of prosecution for failure to discharge a duty to protect the public.

#### **Public safety**

✓

Minstead Lodge is situated on top a hill, possibly the highest point in the area. Ground conditions are silt overlaying clay – rain drains quickly through the silt and quickly washes downhill into two adjacent water courses; one of which run through Brock Farm and the other alongside Football Green Road..

There are two entrances to the lodge; one in Seamans Lane and the second in Football Green Road. As the name suggests, Seamans Lane is a narrow lane. Football Green Road is equally if not narrower than Seamans Lane. Both may be unsuitable for an increase in traffic

and use by heavy goods vehicles. Indeed, where not protected by Dragon's teeth, the use by large goods vehicles delivering goods to Minstead Lodge appears to have contributed to erosion of verges of Foot Ball Green Road.

In these circumstances it may not be unreasonable to ask the licencing authority to consider the degree to which, in addition to the issues outline in the previous section, the lack of appropriate infrastructure may impact public safety and as such provide legitimate grounds for objection. The following may be of particular concern

Road safety (related to both people and animals). It may be legitimate, in the absence of roads which are capable of carrying a significant increase in both cars and heavy goods vehicles and given the added complication of free-range horses and cattle, to point to an increased risk created by the granting of a licence which, in the absence of hotel accommodation, may lead to a significant increase in risks to public safety associated with driving whilst impaired by alcohol.

These risks may be compounded by the narrow nature of local roads along which people who having consumed alcohol, may be forced to drive, from what is a remote location, to alternative accommodation.

#### **Pollution**

In the absence of a private sewage treatment works which meets current standards appropriate to use (as previously stated NFDC records suggest that the current system was installed in 1988)

Or

Connection to public sewer network (I am told the village treatment works in currently at if not beyond capacity)

The licensing authority may consider objections on grounds of, the risks to public safety, particularly to children who play in local water

courses, arising from increased discharge of sewage and other pollutants arising from a want of appropriate sewage infrastructure.

These concerns may be compounded by the limits on the capacity of the local water supply. In some areas the water pressure is so low properties require pumps and storage facilities. In these circumstances any significant increase in demand may reduce the capacity of the whole system to process waste, which in turn may result in an indirect increase to public safety and create a public nuisance.

### Prevention of public nuisance

✓

The authority is invited to consider the degree to which all of the issues outlined in the previous sections provide legitimate grounds, for objections on grounds of public nuisance including those related to health issues.

The authority also is invited to consider the degree to which the following may be regarded as legitimates reasons for objecting to the granting or if already in existence, variation of licence.

The Lodge is situated on top of a hill which is possibly the highest point in the village.

Access is gained through very narrow lanes.

These lanes pass through and or may be adjacent to areas of outstanding natural beauty and Sites of Special Scientific Interest.

The topography creates a situation which will amplify noise and light pollution and by implication the resulting public nuisance.

On occasion we have already experienced noise pollution arising from celebration at the lodge. We believed that these events celebrated the work of the Trust, which we supported, rather than an, apparently unlicenced, commercial undertaking and as a result were willing to tolerate the limited nature of the nuisance.

In our view a significant increase in the number of events together with an increase in the length – in effect 1000hrs to midnight (2330hs followed by 30 minutes drinking up time) would, given the topography and nature of the areas, create a significant public nuisance in terms of:

Direct noise pollution arising from events, which, given previous events, will include live and other forms of music. During the summer months, the public nuisance resulting from events which may take place every weekend and some weekdays, my have a significant impact on the quality of life and health of all who live in the local area.

Indirect noise pollution arising from the slamming of car doors coupled with a significant increase in traffic noise as customers, some of whom will have consumed significant quantities of alcohol seek leave the venue via very narrow roads may amply the above.

Pollution resulting, for example from wild camping as customers, seeking to avoid prosecution for drunk driving, park up and camp for example in areas of Special Scientific Interest (it may be worth noting recent concern resulting from the activities of young people involved in the Duke of Edinburgh scheme)

Whilst light pollution may have less direct impact upon people's lives, as a potential breach of National Park Policy it may also be regarded as a public nuisance, for example in terms of its impact on wildlife and activities which require a reduction in light pollution.

Public nuisance may also extend to an increase in collisions involving Forest Ponies, other livestock and the resulting impact on Commoners.





We live next door to the Lodge , and front one of the public roads giving access to the Lodge (Football Green), and we have seen fire engines called to the Lodge on numerous occasions . We can only think that an alcohol licence would increase the fire risk . The Lodge is an old Victorian ( if not older ) building , and for this reason would be more susceptible to fire .  Whilst most people are responsible , inevitably some will drive away from the premises having consumed alcohol . That can only increase the risk of drink diving offences occurring on narrow roads over which Forest animals roam and have priority .  The drainage and sewerage provision at the premises may be sufficient for its current needs ,

support those activities because we have appreciated and supported Minstead Trust's work, aims and objectives. Minstead Trust is a Charity concerned with caring and training adults with learning disabilities.

Minstead Lodge is a Residential College and Day Training Centre owned by Minstead Trust.

I feel that having alcohol available on the premises is inappropriate given the nature of the Trust's work.

My concerns are for the safety and wellbeing of the students - there will be unknown members of the public drinking alcohol and mixing with vulnerable people in and around the manor house, gardens, workshops and grounds.

#### **Public safety**

Again I am concerned for the students at the Lodge but, also, the residents and Forest animals at risk from extra traffic and late night driving along the village roads.

I have also been made aware of the potential high fire risk of the property itself. I believe that the main reception rooms are wood panelled and the main staircase is wood which is potentially very worrying. Celebration events with alcohol and candles.

#### Prevention of public nuisance

The siting of the Lodge on the top of a hill means that the noise from events - any event - carries a long way.

Many residents and properties are effected by this noise.

My family has lived here for over 20 years and have in the past tolerated the occasional noisy celebration in the interest of neighbourly harmony and appreciation of what Minstead Trust stands for.

This application for a 7 day a week 10 am - 10 or 10.30 pm license is just unacceptable.

Recently, 7th. May, '22, having had a full day of shrieking children, shouting, cheering, clapping and music thumping away, I finally rang the Lodge around 10.30 pm to complain - needless to say no one picked up the phone so we just had to wait it out until the revellers went home. Over 12 hours of stress and upset - noise and music booming out on a beautiful day and evening when we all wanted to relax and enjoy our homes and gardens.

This invasion into and the spoiling of the Lodge's neighbours' lives - making them shut their doors and windows to muffle the row and preventing them from enjoying their own gardens with friends in peace is simply not fair.

Potentially, this could be happening 7 days a week.

I believe I am right in saying that the students at Minstead Lodge are all over 18 years old but, they do have learning disabilities which I understand makes them still vulnerable.

My concerns are as above - potential situations with members of the public who have been drinking.

Also, the disruption to their lives and the all invasive noise.

Hi

We are Carol & Terry Tupper who live at Suters Cottage London Minstead and like our neighbours we have serious concerns about the impact it will have on us and many others here if the application is approved not only the people that live close to the Lodge with the noise but the extra traffic impact it will have on village on the road getting to there and leaving. Even the occasional functions that they have now are quite loud and we are at the bottom of the village so certainly it would affect us if it were on a regular basis and late at night.

From the A337 up to Minstead Lodge the road is already in a serious state of disrepair due to the volume of traffic mostly going to the Lodge with speeding both in the morning and evening a regular occurrence. Last year we witnessed an accident where a car forced a cyclist off the road and into a ditch due to the edge of the tarmac complete eroded away with a drop of six to eight inches in places and I reported this to Hampshire Highways at Winchester who wanted more information and photographs which has now been given to them. It now almost impossible for us and our grandchildren to safely cycle up and down the road and any increase in traffic is certainly going to make things worse.

It is stated that it is going to be used for weddings and celebrations which will inevitably mean very loud music until late and then the noise of all the people leaving and the question I would ask is would the people who are involved in approving this application give go ahead if they were resident here, I doubt it so please have consideration the people that do as many here are badly affected.

We moved to Minstead 22 years ago because it was a lovely peaceful place and still is so surely the priority must be about the residents and would add we are completely supportive and in favour of the Lodge being used for the right reasons as it has been for many years.

In both directions along Seaman's Lane in order to get to Minstead Lodge there are several blind bends, and narrow passing places for cars. Many people cycle and walk in the village – throughout the day and night and having a licenced or indeed a party venue will be of great risk. Increasingly the traffic levels in this area is dangerous.  Wild animals roam the village, again visitors are not aware of how the forest differs from anywhere else.
Prevention of public nuisances		We live in a National Park, which is renowned for peace, quiet and tranquility. We have lived in Minstead for 18 years and feel very passionate about living in such a wonderful peaceful New Forest Village. Minstead is a quiet, peaceful, natural village, and that is how we would like it to stay.  The change of use of Minstead Lodge is of major concern to us as residents of Minstead, on many different levels. I believe the change of use and alcohol license will indeed go against every section of your Licensing Objectives.  Minstead Lodge should not be allowed permission to ruin the village, with change of use to a "Party Venue" offering events throughout the year from 9-00 to 23.00/23.30.

### 1 Noise

When groups of people attend venues, for whatever event type, for example meetings, conferences, celebrations and weddings they create noise. The larger the group the worse the noise level is. Noise travels a large distance, especially in such a quiet village, therefore this noise pollution will majorly impact our quality of life. Minstead is a very quiet village, no ambient noise, no other major pollution factor. I understand the Trust are saying that Weddings for example will be conducted indoors, the inevitable will happen with people spilling outdoors and in good weather the ceremonies also would be moved outdoors. How unfair is that for the local residents, noise, amplified music and speaking totally unacceptable.

#### 2.Traffic

Seaman's Lane is a single car width road, with many blind bends and hidden driveways. With more people using the Lane, visitors not knowing the Lane, this is dangerous. Also, this is a major disruption for the residents living on the Lane and surrounding roads to have lots of traffic all day and night using the Lanes. Noise, car pollution, strangers unfamiliar with the area, will cause accidents and unnecessary strain on the locals. If party goers leave the venue at 24.00, the traffic noise will continue into the early hours, again totally unacceptable.

### 3. Alcohol Licence

I believe this would be a total disaster for our village. Minstead Trust are applying for alcohol licence from between the hours of 10.00-23.00 four days a week, then until 23.30 for the other 3 days. This is totally unacceptable and shows what they are truly trying to achieve. Within a setting of a party venue, with all day alcohol there are many reasons why it is such a bad idea. Noise levels again would rise, people drinking alcohol make more noise, the risk of people drink driving from a remote venue where there is no public transport and indeed is difficult to get a taxi, driving on the tiny lane is a nightmare.

## 4.Amplified Music/Sound

At any event, whether conference, party, wedding etc, they have amplified sound. Amplified sound is a real problem, when we live in such a quiet village. Listening to music, speeches, and general party sounds when you want to relax in your garden is totally unacceptable and indeed a public nuisance.

We live several miles from the Activity Centre, however, when they host weddings, which is most weekends in the Summer, we can hear every single track they play, every speech they make and we have complained to them several times. They also say the events are held indoors, they are not always and indeed windows and doors are opened and the noise travels the village.

It is a real problem.

Children walk, ride bicycles within the village. The children will indeed be returning from school, whilst the premises are still serving alcohol and many more cars will be using the tiny lanes, in which the children are walking home from school, or indeed cycling or walking in the evening. This is dangerous for our children.

Seaman's Lane and Football Green are single-carriageway 'roads' and often blocked by ponies and cows and as such are manifestly unsuitable for the levels of traffic which would be associated with this change of use. As a quiet backwater of the Forest, bringing in parties, who understandably would want to enthusiastically celebrate the wedding they are attending, it seems a totally inappropriate use of what has, to date, been a location for quiet, charitable work.

This change of use has already impacted the neighbourhood with late night noise and disturbance which is wholly unacceptable. The Lodge website is already advertising itself as available for 'drinks receptions', this is prior to actually obtaining an alcohol license. Change of use to an alcohol serving venue will completely change the character and social compliance of the Lodge. Alcohol allowance undoubtedly will attract a wider market and later partying, more traffic and undeniably more noise. All of the roads surrounding the Lodge are completely unlit and party/wedding guests leaving in cars or minibuses in the dark will be a danger to not only the commoning stock but also locals returning home or walking on summer evenings.

The Lodge residents have been very much part of the community and it is a great shame to learn that they are now being relocated in order to trade as a full-time wedding and conference venue.

This claim is open to debate particularly now that they are selling alcohol under 3<sup>rd</sup> party licence which they only appear to have been able to do in the last few years. Dozens of weddings a year at which alcohol is served will obviously have a much bigger impact on their neighbours and the village than dozens of conferences where alcohol is not necessary and are likely to finish much earlier and be much quieter than a wedding.

There does not seem to be any measurable information on how many and what type of events the applicant intends to hold or sanctions if their commitments are not adhered to. On this basis my representation is that the application is refused until the applicant has gone through a proper consultation process with the community and made enforceable commitments limiting the frequency and nature of the events they hold.

There should also be a change of control clause in any future Licence that is granted on the basis that having moved the residents out of Minstead Lodge to alternative accommodation elsewhere and having secured a License and change of use permission, the Lodge would be a much more attractive acquisition prospect to a third party commercial events company or hotel.

There are many publicised incidents of licencees unable to control noise created by their customers and local authorities being drawn into time consuming disputes and enforcement actions. Given the extremely short notice to residents given by the applicant, it must be appropriate not to grant the license at this stage and to seek a solution that is acceptable to all parties.
