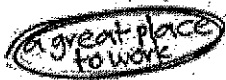

I continually clear the front of cans and broken bottles, know they urinate anywhere whether day or night but night time is much much worse for us in the village. For these reasons I would ask that the hours Lidl open can be on a par with Waitrose so that anti social behaviour will not escalate. I have checked the premises licence for Hythe Waitrose and they are exactly the same as Lidl have applied for, which are pretty standard supermarket hours. However as before just because a

premises has been granted these hours they may choose to close earlier, if trade dictates. In addition, once a licence is granted for a premises there are a number of actions that can be taken should a premises cause any problems, including a review of the licence.

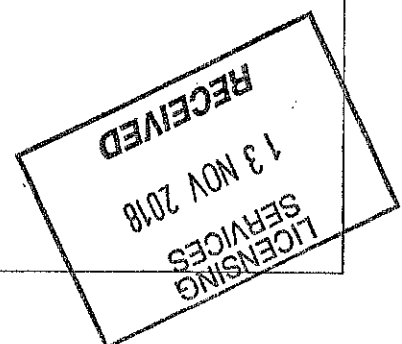



A member of our community was attacked on this site by a gang of young people who were under the influence of alcohol in October 2015. Children go past this site on the way to and from school.

<p><b>Prevention of public nuisance</b></p>	<p>✓</p>	<p>We already know that Lidl's in Hythe trading hours are currently planned to be longer than Waitrose in Hythe – Waitrose close at 8pm and Lidl's are currently planning on opening until 10pm.</p> <p>Lidl's has been built on a conservation area on the basis that it was considered by planning to be in the interest of the community. Selling cheap alcohol for up to 16 hours a day cannot be considered to be in the interest of the community. This is a village that has already had it's character significantly altered by the building of a very large store in its heart, to now sell alcohol for up to 16 hours a day will impact on all of the residents that live in the village and especially on those who live in New Road – together with the new retirement flats that are due to be built on this site.</p> <p>Another matter is the additional risk of littering we currently have to clear up empty drinks cans in particular beer and other alcoholic beverages that are left around the village in peoples private gardens and premises – which the council of course doesn't clear up because it's not public land.</p>

This would be in line with other local stores, and would give Lidl customers ample time to purchase their drinks alongside their other shopping.

The Lidl store is in a conservation area adjacent to the Grade 2 listed Parish Church, and surrounded by primarily residential housing - including 36 retirement flats being built right alongside the Lidl premises which were approved by the NFDC Planning Authority for this village centre development. We believe, all of these properties and residents would be adversely affected by the Lidl proposal.
