COMMUNITY OVERVIEW AND SCRUTINY PANEL: 17 NOVEMBER 2015

REPORT OF THE TASK AND FINISH GROUP INTO CHILD POVERTY

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Task and Finish Group (T&FG) as set up at the Panel in March 2015, in response to a stakeholder meeting on this subject held in February 2015. The Group has worked since then on a long list of actions and has maintained focus on the terms of reference in a subject that has the potential to grow ever wider and become unwieldy.
- 1.2 The Group reported back on its initial findings concerning definition and extent of children poverty in its report in June. Current work is focussed on the latter two points in the terms of reference:
 - Consider the implications of the data and evidence presented, for the delivery of Services, whether by the Council (directly or indirectly) or by other agencies where the Council may wish to influence delivery.
 - Having undertaken the above activities, to produce a report of findings to include such recommendations as are felt appropriate to effect beneficial change in service delivery.
- 1.3 The current Members are: Cllr Alan O'Sullivan (Chairman); Cllr Diane Andrews; Cllr Kate Crisell; Cllr Michael White and Cllr Steve Clarke.

2. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

2.1 The report updates the Panel on the achievements to date, work in progress and planned future activities, with the intent to seek the Panel's approval to the Group's work and intended timescales.

3. THE WORK OF THE GROUP

3.1 The Group was formed to consider a substantial body of work, which is set out in more detail in Appendix 1. It is believed worthwhile progress has been made. This can be seen in the Appendix but the summary below the work of the Group; what is completed, in progress and planned.

Matters completed to date:

- Improved information Web based documents on sources of information identified, with links provided across websites and welfare changes briefings taken place.
- Improved awareness by front line staff
 Information provided, briefings undertaken
- Improved understanding of the issues at hand Data on child poverty brought to the Panel Community food initiatives clarified.

Work In Progress

- A related update of the safeguarding policy is underway, which is due in January 2016.
- Discussions with Solent Credit Union are taking place.
- The work of the Group did bring out a wider question for the Council on the matter of whether the next version of the Corporate Plan might include reference to work with families, which has been offered for consideration in the drafting process.

Planned Activities

- Awareness of Gypsy; Roma; Traveller community needs Sessions programmed for the T&FG in December and pre-Council in February
- Understanding of mental health impacts Session programmed for T&FG in December
- Understanding of the role of the Early Help Hub Review in T&FG in March
- Progress with action Review in T&FG of overall action schedule in March and report to Panel

4. FUTURE TASK AND FINISH GROUP WORK

- 4.1 The Group wish to undertake a second stakeholder seminar in February and then to review the outcomes of that session, together with the overall programme, so as to produce a final report for the Panel in March.
- 4.2 In addition, arising from the work to date, there would be value in this Panel joining with the Planning and Transportation Panel to hold a specific Task and Finish group on the utilisation of NFDC investment in community transport. Community transport is a subject that has benefits for local communities and there is a clearly a strong connection to those living with poverty. It is suggested that this is most effectively approached by defining closely the scope and including Members from both the current Child Poverty Task and Finish Group and Members from the Planning and Transportation Panel.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 5.1 It is recommended that the Panel:
 - a) Note the achievements of the Task and Finish Group to date.
 - b) Agree the intended future actions for the Child Poverty Task and Finish Group, with a final report to the Panel in March 2016.
 - c) Approach the Planning and Transportation Panel with a view to setting up a Task and Finish Group as set out in the report.

POSSIBLE SCOPE FOR A TASK AND FINISH GROUP ON CHILD POVERTY AND THE ROLE OF COMMUNITY TRANSPORT.

BACKGROUND

This subject arises from the investigations of the Child Poverty Task and Finish Group, which identified a range of influences that impact on the lives of children and young people affected by poverty. One of these is the role of NFDC's investment in community transport and a review of that investment would be timely to understand its impact. The scope is specific so as to maintain focus within a potentially large subject and to concentrate on an aspect where NFDC has a direct investment and influence.

WHAT TO COVER

To review the investment of NFDC in community transport initiatives to determine:

- What is the overall funding model and the part played by NFDC (and other funders)
- What provision is made?
- Where is provision made?
- What impact is the provision having?
- What is guiding the commissioning of that provision?

In future:

- How does reflecting on the work undertaken on Child Poverty affect future provison and commissioning?
- How might provision best meet the Council's corporate priorities?
- How might provision have greater impact?

HOW

• Small Task and Finish Group (4 Members) – two from Planning and Transportation and two from the Child Poverty Task and Finish Group.

WHEN

• An initial discussion at Community Overview and Scrutiny Panel in November, with a view to an approach to the Planning and Transportation Panel following that. The Report back to be in March.
