THE DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION OF HABITAT MITIGATION PROJECTS USING DEVELOPERS' CONTRIBUTIONS AND COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY FUNDING

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 New Forest District Council, through its planning development control powers, collects contributions (through Section 106 agreements and the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)) to mitigate the recreational impacts of new developments on the European nature designated conservation sites.
- 1.2 This report seeks to approve a programme of projects and expenditure for 2016/17 and 2017/18 to implement the Council's adopted Mitigation Strategy for European Sites SPD and adopted Local Plan policies.

2 POLICY FRAMEWORK

- 2.1 Policy DM3 of the adopted Local Plan Part 2: Sites and Development Management Development Plan Document (DPD) sets out the Council's approach towards habitat mitigation. The four elements of the strategy can be summarised as:
 - Provision of new areas of publicly accessible natural green space.
 - Enhancement of existing green space and footpaths/rights of way.
 - Access management measures include the provision of additional rangers for the New Forest SPA and Solent Coastal European sites.
 - Monitoring the gathering of further information, including about the condition of European sites' habitats and species and visitor patterns, and to gain a better understanding of the effects of visitors and other factors influencing the condition of the protected sites; and the monitoring of progress in implementing the mitigation strategy.
- 2.2 In June 2014 the Council adopted its Mitigation Strategy for European Sites Supplementary Planning Document (SPD). This strategy lists specific projects and indicative timescales for the implementation of the strategy in accordance with policy DM3.

3 PROJECT PROPOSALS

3.1 Appendix 1 of this report details the programme of works that are intended to be implemented within the period 2016 - 2018.

4 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 Habitat Mitigation Developer Contributions are collected for the sole purpose of implementing access management and monitoring schemes in accordance with policy

DM3 and can only be spent on this purpose. In accordance with the Council's Regulation 123 list, money collected via CIL will only be spent on habitat mitigation projects.

4.2 Before any contract is let it will be subject to a procurement exercise to ensure best value is achieved.

5 CONSULTATION INPUT

5.1 The projects in the programme of works are all contained in the adopted Mitigation Strategy SPD. The SPD was subject to statutory consultation and adopted by the Cabinet on 4 June 2014.

6 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 Delivery of this programme of works will enable residential development to proceed in a way that will safeguard the protection of the European nature designated conservation sites. Implementation of this Mitigation Strategy is necessary to comply with the requirements of the Habitat Regulations.

7 CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

7.1 No project-specific implications.

8 EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS

8.1 A good design and feasibility process will help ensure that schemes respond to the needs of the whole community rather than narrow sectors.

9 ANY ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED AND REJECTED

9.1 Suitable mitigation must be in place prior the occupation of development to be in accordance with the Habitat Regulations. If the programme of works is not approved and the projects are not implemented it could result in a breach of responsibilities under the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010. Further, Natural England may raise objection to further residential development in the District until suitable mitigation is delivered.

10 RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 10.1 That the programme of works set out in Appendix 1 is approved to be implemented; and
- 10.2 The Service Manager (Policy and Strategy), in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Planning and Transportation, be authorised to make any amendments necessary to the programme of works during the course of the programme should schemes no longer become achievable or alternative projects are identified that are deemed more suitable.
